him.



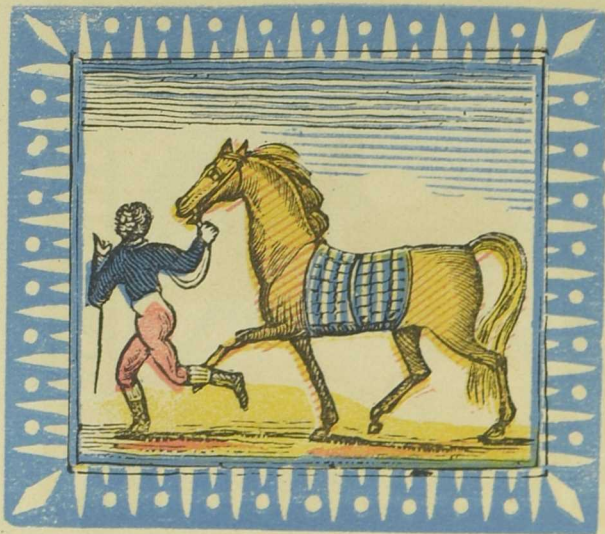
This species of the useful

And trotting him along. (5)

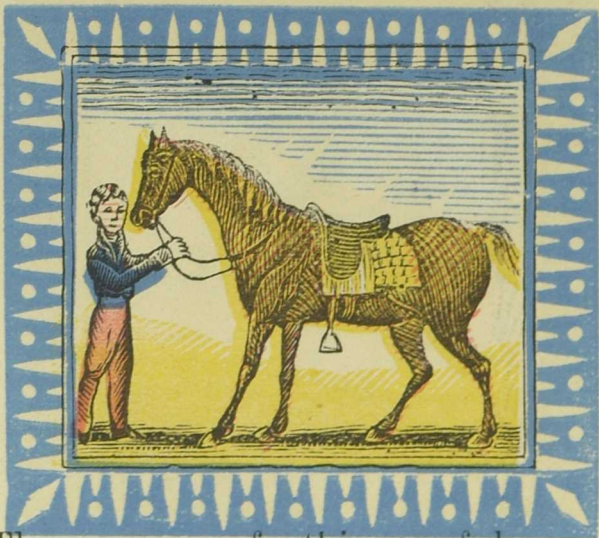


The horse above is training

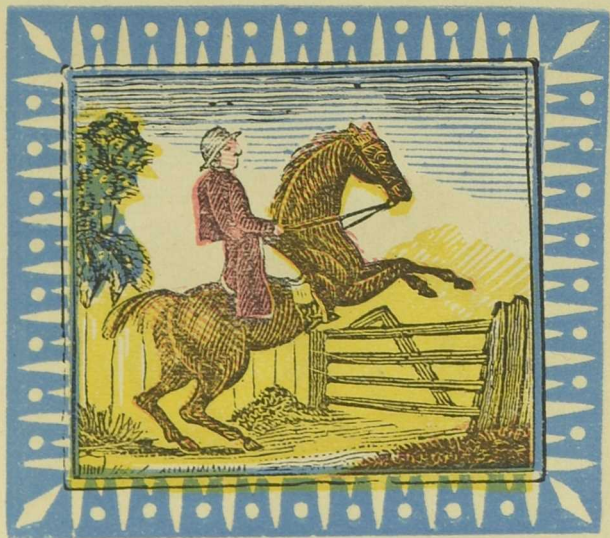


The owner of this useful

And everything beside. (7)



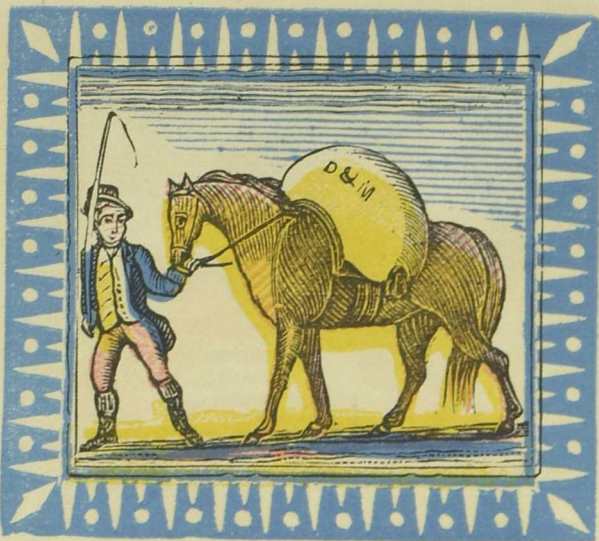
Hurrah ! the hunter clears the

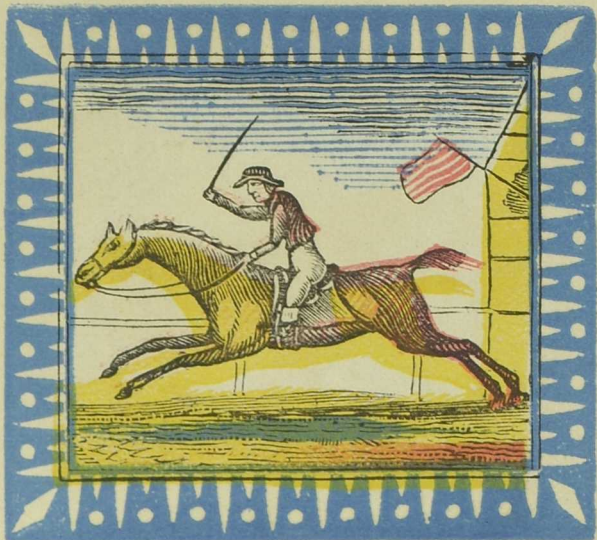


