THE KISS.

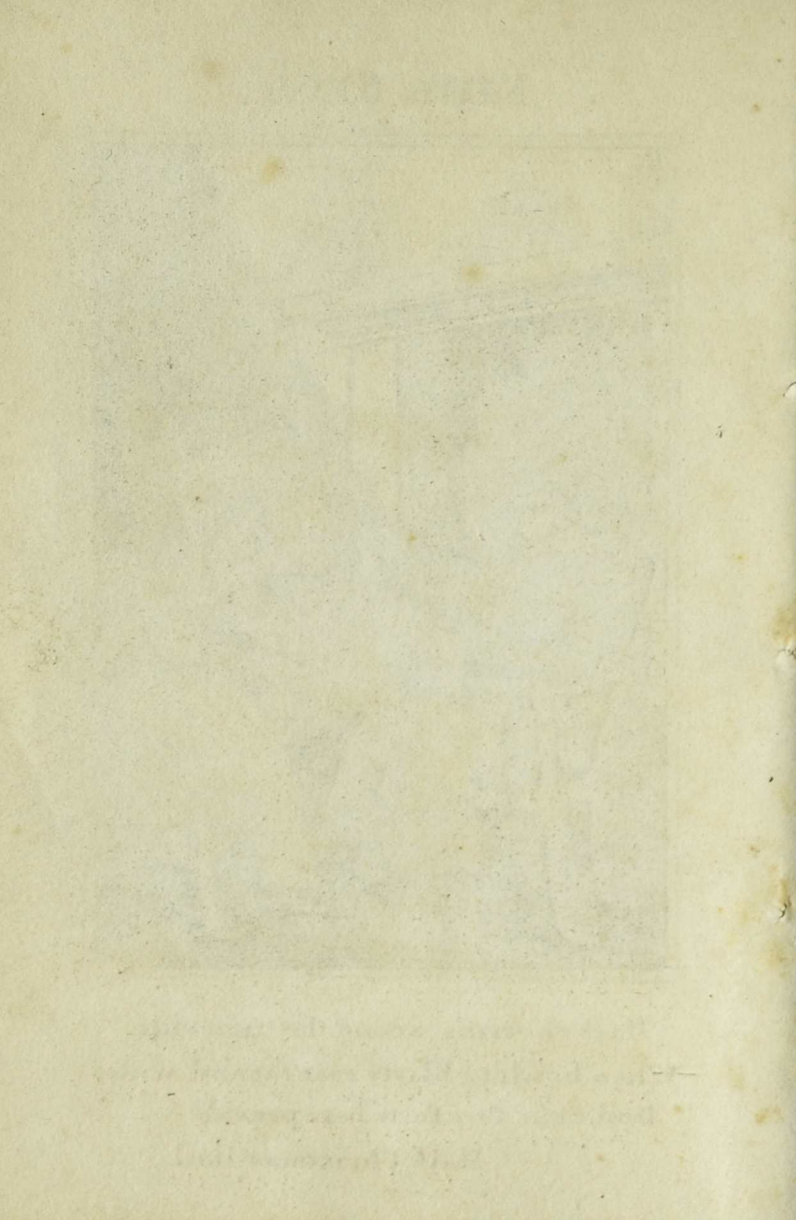


Hail pleasing rite to high and low,

Hail Christmas! Hail

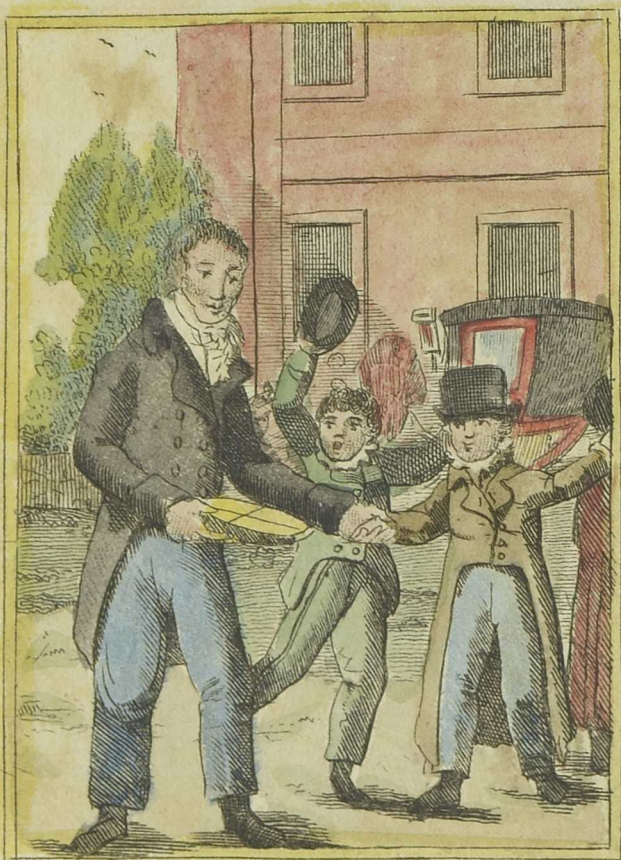
BREAKING UP.



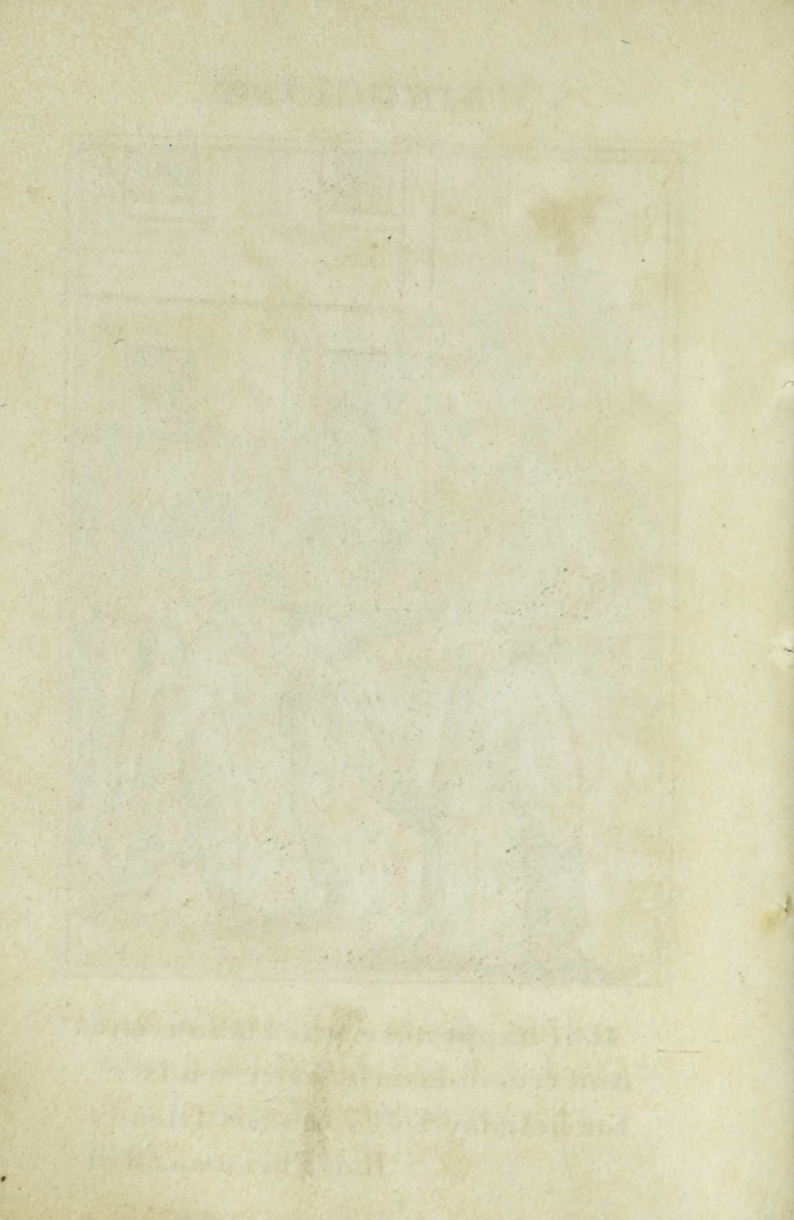
Hail merry days of gifts and toys,

BLINDMAN'S BUFF.

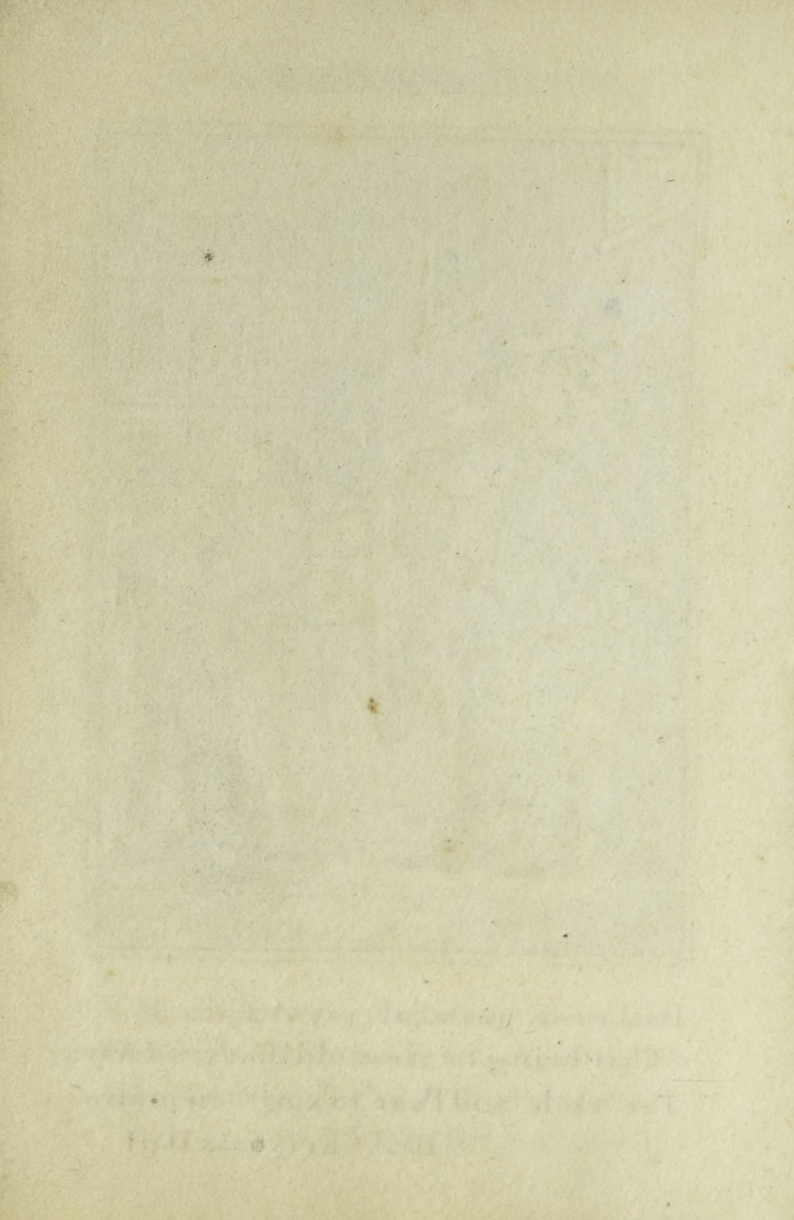


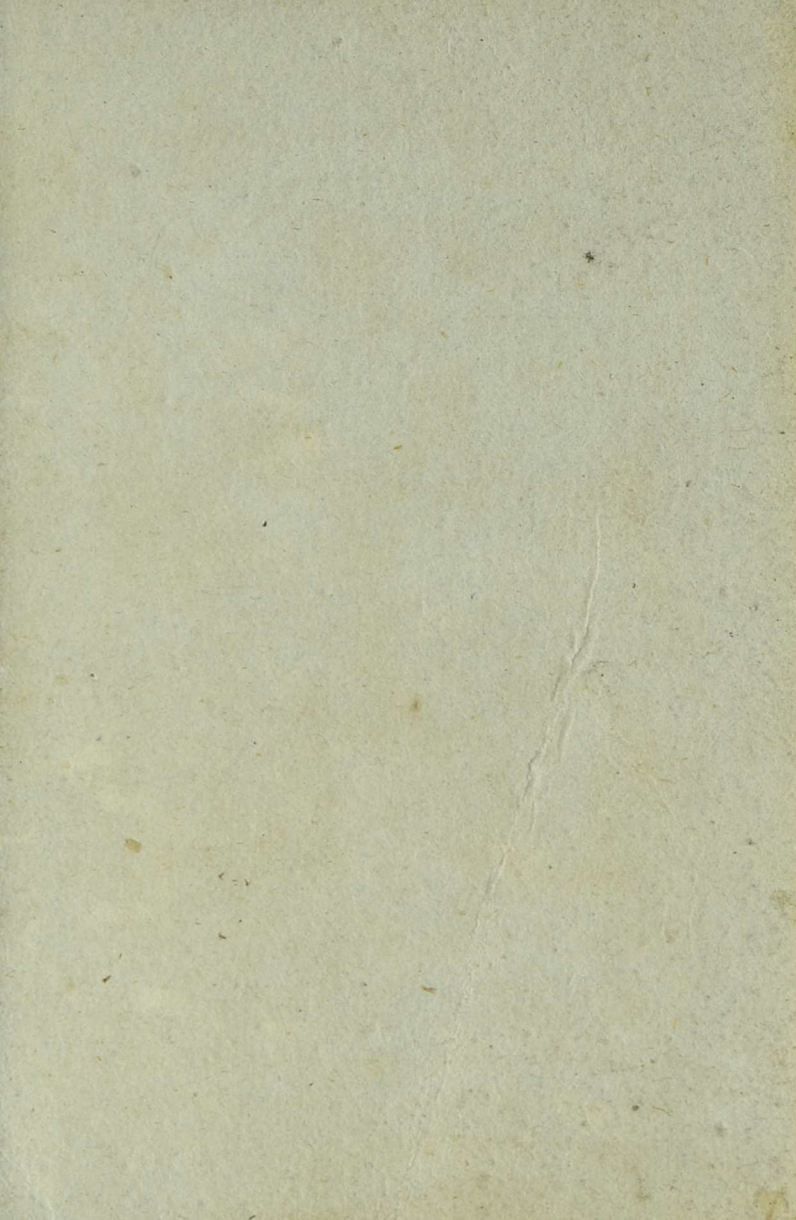
