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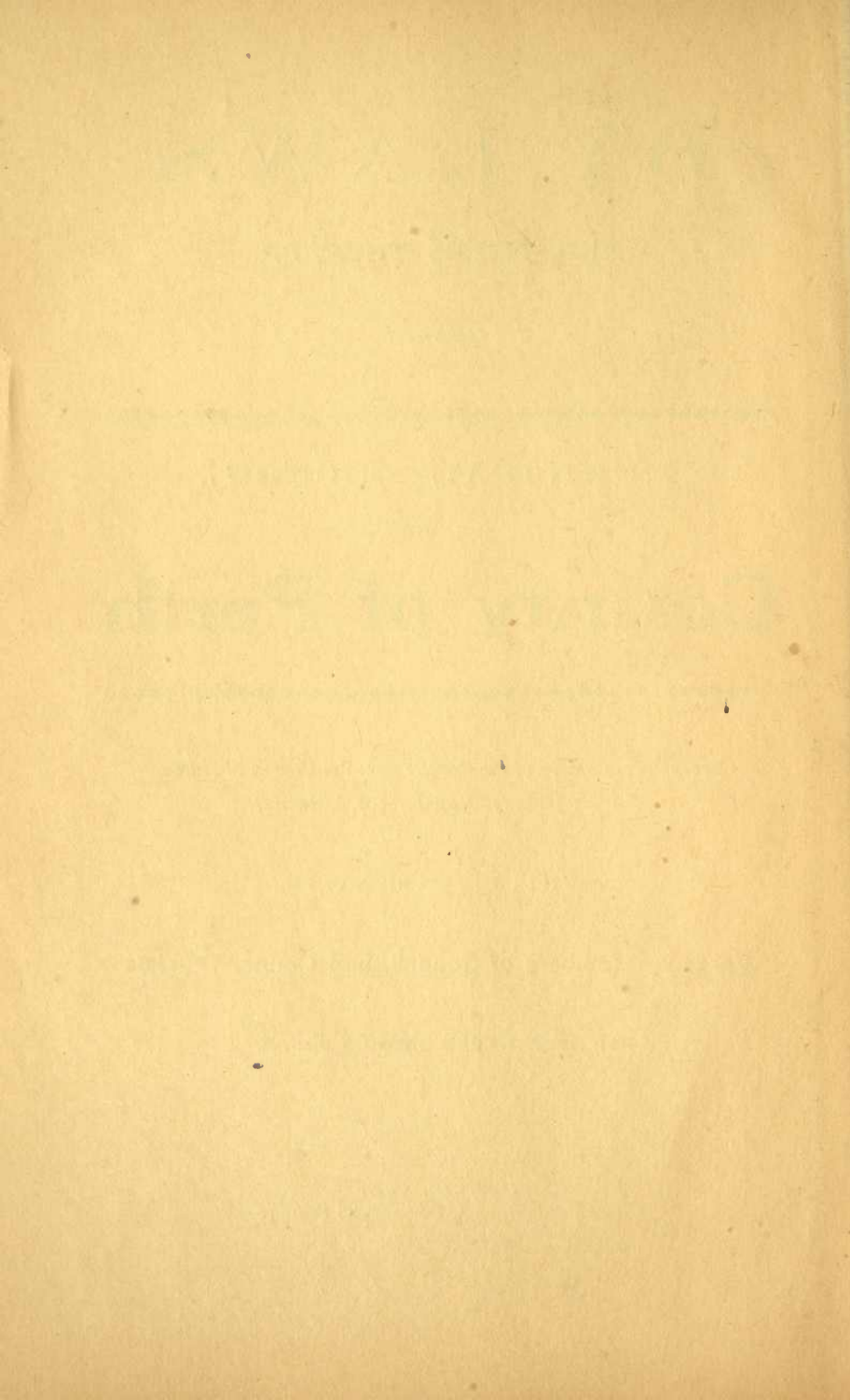

BY-LAW NO. 371.

Standing Rules and Regulations

1. That in all proceedings had or taken in the Municipal Council of the County of Perth, the following Rules and Regulations shall be observed, and shall be rules and regulations for the order and despatch of business in the said Council ; and that all former rules existing at the time of the passing of this By-Law, be, and are hereby repealed.

2. That on the first day of the first session of the year the Council shall assemble in the Court House at the hour of 2 o'clock, p.m., and on all other days at 10 a.m., and if at such hour respectively mentioned there be not a quorum assembled, which shall consist of a majority of the Council, the Warden or Chairman chosen for the occasion may take the chair and adjourn with the consent of the majority then present.

3. That immediately after the Warden or Chairman shall have taken the chair, the minutes of the preceding day shall be read by the Clerk, and be corrected or confirmed by the council.

4. That the Warden or Chairman shall preserve order and decorum, and shall decide all questions of order, subject to an appeal to the Council.

5. That in case the Warden shall not be in attendance,

the Clerk shall call the meeting to order, until a Chairman be chosen, who shall preside until the arrival of the Warden or Chairman, and when the Council adjourns the members shall keep their seats until the Warden or Chairman shall leave the chair.

6. That when the Warden or Chairman is called upon to explain a point of order or practice, he is to state the rule applicable to the case without argument or comment. If the Warden or Chairman desires to leave the chair for the purpose of taking part in the discussion or otherwise, on leave from the Council, he shall appoint one of the members of the Council to fill the place until he resumes the chair.

7. That every member, previous to his speaking, shall rise from his seat and address himself to the chair.

8. That when two or more members shall rise at once, the Warden shall name the member who is first to speak.

9. That every member who shall be present when a question is put in Council, shall vote thereon, unless the Council shall excuse him, and when the Warden or Chairman is putting a question or otherwise addressing the Council, no member shall walk out or across the Council room, nor when a member is speaking shall any other member hold discourse or interrupt him, except to rise and call to order.

10. That a member when called to order, shall sit down until the question of order is decided by the Warden or Chairman.

11. That no member shall speak but to the question in debate.

12. That no member (other than the one proposing a motion, who shall be permitted to reply), shall speak more than once on the same question, except in explanation, or by leave of the Council.

13. That each member may, of right, require the question or motion under discussion to be read for his information at any time of the debate, but not so as to interrupt a member.

14. That upon a division of the Council, the names of those who vote for and of those who vote against the question, shall be entered upon the minutes, if any member require it.

15. That a motion for adjournment shall always be in order.

16. That no motion, except for adjournment, or the reception of Reports or Petitions, shall be debated upon, or put, unless the same be written in ink and seconded.

17. That no member shall speak to any motion, until it is put by the Warden, except the introducer.

18. That after a motion has been read by the Warden or Chairman, it shall be deemed to be in possession of the Council, but may be withdrawn at any time before decision or amendment, with permission of the council.

19. That no motion prefaced by any preamble shall be submitted to the council.

20. That it shall be the duty of the warden or chairman in council, whenever he shall conceive that a motion which he has received and read may be contrary to the rules of council, to apprise the council thereof immediately before the question on such motion is put, and cite the rule which is applicable to the case.

21. That every by-law shall be introduced by a motion of leave, specifying the title of it, or a motion to appoint a committee to bring it in, or by an order of the council on a report of a committee ; but that the substance of any report of a committee submitted to a committee of the whole, and afterwards adopted in open council, shall be incorporated in a by-law.

22. That every by-law shall receive three separate readings before it is finally passed, the motion for referring the same to a committee of the whole, to be considered the second reading, and the adoption of the report in open council the third reading.

23. That on all by-laws the council shall go into committee of the whole between the second and third readings. That in committee of the whole all by-laws shall be read by the clerk and debated on, clause by clause, and put by the chairman as read by the clerk, leaving the title and preamble to be last considered. That the clerk shall notify the readings and time on the back of the by-law, and when a by-law passes the council he shall certify the same with the date thereof at the foot of the by-law.

24. That whenever it shall be resolved that the council go into committee of the whole upon any question, the warden or

chairman shall leave the chair and appoint a chairman of the committee, who shall report their proceedings to the warden or chairman on his resuming the chair. The rules of council shall be observed in committees of the whole, excepting the rules relating to the votes being recorded, and limiting the number of times speaking.

25. On motion in committee to rise and report, the question shall be decided without debate.

26. That every member who shall introduce a by-law, petition or motion upon any subject which may be referred to a special committee, shall be one of the committee without being named by the council, and that the warden shall for the purpose of consultation, but not to vote, be ex-officio member of every standing committee.

27. That immediately after the election of warden a special committee shall be elected to nominate for the year standing committees of five or more members ; said members at their first meeting to elect a chairman from among themselves, each for the following purposes, viz. : On finance, roads and bridges, county property and education, to whom all matters relating to these subjects shall be severely referred.

28. That no report of a special committee, except the one for appointing standing committees for the year, shall be adopted as soon as read, but the same shall be laid on the table a reasonable time for the inspection of members.

29. That the mode of appointing a special committee shall be, first, to determine the number it shall consist of, then each

member naming one, which shall be written down by the clerk ; then those who have most voices shall be taken successively until the number is completed, and if any difficulty should arise from two or more having an equal number of voices, the Warden shall decide who has the preference.

30. That no money appropriation shall be finally acted upon by the council until it shall have been referred to the standing committee on finance, and no money shall be paid by the treasurer until ordered by the council, and such order signed by the warden or chairman—except in matters relating to the administration of criminal justice unless otherwise provided.

31. That all petitions and motions for money grants shall be submitted to the council on one or other of the first two days of any session of council, and not later.

32. That no matter, or motion, or subject once finally settled in council shall be again brought before the council by any member during that session.

33. That at the election of any officer by this council, no person shall be declared elected unless he has a majority of the whole number of councillors present.

34. That any one or more of these rules may at any time be temporarily suspended with the consent of three-fourths of the members present.

35. That whenever the warden shall deem it necessary to call a special meeting of the council, he shall do so by giving at least ten days previous notice by mail or otherwise.

36. That no person present at any meeting of the council shall be allowed to speak or make a noise, or in any way to dis-

turb or interrupt the proceedings of the council, or to behave in a riotous, disorderly or unseemly manner ; and that any person who shall do so shall be liable to be fined not less than one dollar nor more than five dollars and costs for the first offence ; and not less than five dollars nor more than ten dollars and costs for the second offence ; and in addition thereto, shall be deprived of the privilege of being present at any subsequent meeting of the council.

37. That at the election of warden the clerk shall receive nominations in writing with the name of proposer and seconder to each, and after a lapse of a reasonable time, which shall not exceed one hour, the clerk shall declare the nominations closed, and if more than one nomination has been made he shall proceed to take the vote on those nominated until an election is made, subject to Sec. 263, Chap. 223, Revised Statutes of Ontario.

38. It shall be the duty of the clerk to prepare and of the chairman of committees to introduce into the council all such by-laws as may be necessary to give effect to the recommendations of the committee when adopted by the council.

39. It shall be the duty of the chairman of each committee to adhere strictly in all transactions to the rules of the council and the practice of committee.

40. Members of the council may attend the meetings of any of the committees, but shall not be allowed to vote nor take part in the discussions or debates.
