## AUDITORS' REPORT.

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*To the Reeve and Council of the Township of York :—*

GENTLEMEN,—In accordance with your authority we have audited the accounts of the Township of York for the year ending 31st December, 1894, and herewith present you with the following financial statements :

Receipts and Disbursements.

Detailed Statements of same.

Schedules of School Sections &c.

Revenue Account and

Balance Sheet.

The Audit has been very thorough but very laborious owing to numerous circumstances which it is the duty of the Council to guard against in the future. Specific references and suggestions in this connection do not properly pertain to this Report ; but if you desire to profit by the lessons of the present audit, this can be better attained by a special Report in this behalf.

Among the accounts of previous years it does not appear that a Revenue Account has ever had a place, which is all the more remarkable since it is essential, above all others, to determine how the financial position of the Township has been affected by the operations of the year. To the ratepayers, especially, the results as shewn by the Revenue Account are of advantage in demonstrating, at a glance, the nature of the administration ; so that extravagance and incompetence may be promptly checked on the one hand, and prudence and ability duly recognized on the other.

The Township started 1894 with a deficit of \$22,210.31, and for many reasons it was difficult to improve the financial position of the Township during the year. Among these were the heavy interest charged for Bank overdraft, which imposed an outlay of \$3,353.23, also the necessary provision for the award to Toronto in connection with the Dovercourt School Section of \$1,386.87, and the exceptional claims, expenditures and costs originating in previous years which, owing to no appropriation being made in respect of the same, became a charge upon the revenues of the year.

Notwithstanding these drawbacks and the further disadvantage of exceptionally large outlay arising from excessive spring rains, it is gratifying to observe from Revenue Account that the Council of 1894 succeeded in making a decided reduction in the deficit, amounting to the very handsome sum of \$5,910 25. In this respect, the Council of 1894 marks a " turn in the tide."
