SECOND MEETING.

TOWNSHIP SOLICITOR'S OFFICE, January 29th, 1895.

The Council met at the call of the Reeve at 1.30 p.m. Members present, the Reeve and Messrs. Goulding, Sylvester and Heslop.

The following resolution was passed :

Moved by Mr. Sylvester, seconded by Mr. Heslop,

No. 1220. Whereas, under the provisions of section 210 of "The Consolidated Assessment Act, 1892" a County Council may by By-law direct that the moneys received by the County Treasurer on account of taxes on non-resident lands shall constitute a distinct and separate school fund to be called the "Nonresident Land Fund" of the County.

And whereas, under the provisions of the said Act a County Council may from time to time by By-law authorize the Warden to issue under the corporate seal of such county, upon the credit of the non-resident land fund, debentures payable not later than eight years after the date thereof, so that the whole of the debentures at any time issued and unpaid do not exceed two-thirds of all arrears then due and accruing upon the lands in the county, together with such other sums as may be in the Treasurer's hands or otherwise invested to the credit of the said fund;

And whereas there is a large sum in arrear now due and returned to the County Treasurer of the County of York on account of taxes on non-resident lands in the Township of York;

And whereas it is expedient to request the County Council of the County of York to issue debentures under the provisions of sections of the said Act hereinbefore set forth.

Be it therefore resolved that the Finance Committee be and they are hereby instructed to request the Council of the County of York to pass the necessary By-law under section 210 of the "Consolidated Assessment Act, 1892" to consti. a non-resident land fund;

And be it further resolved that the said Committee do request the said Council of the County of York to pass the necessary By-law under section 215 of the said Act to authorize the Warden to issue upon the credit of such non-resident land fund debentures payable not later than eight years after the date thereof, so that the whole of the debentures to be issued do not exceed two-thirds of all arrears then due and according upon the lands in the County, together with such other sums as may be in the Treasurer's hands or otherwise invested to the credit of the said fund. Carried.

AUDITORS' REPORT.

To the Reeve and Council of the Township of York:

GENTLEMEN, — Under the authority of By-law No. 1625, passed by your Council, we have audited the accounts of the Township of York for the year ending December 31st, 1895, and herewith present the following financial statements :—

Receipts and Disbursements. Detailed Statement of Disbursements. Schedule of School Section Accounts. Revenue Account. General Revenue Account and Balance Sheet.

We have taken considerable time and made a thorough audit in order that the books should be in good shape for the present Treasurer. The Ledger has been ruled off; accounts connected with the Revenue Account have been transformed to same, and balances brought down, thus starting the year with a clean sheet. This has not been done heretofore.

A number of amounts are standing to the debit of former collectors, and as these amounts have been open for some time an attempt should be made to close same. In cases where receipts have been produced showing that arrears have been paid to the collectors, the amounts have been allowed to the ratepayers, consequently an account should be opened in the Ledger, and in all cases where receipts have been produced, the amounts should be charged to and demanded from the collectors.

There are several accounts such as the Upper Canada College Sewer; Toronto and Richmond Hill St. Ry., Metropolitan St. Ry. and Toronto & Scarboro Railway, etc., that should be collected without delay, as they have been standing for some time past.

We would recommend that if possible the Treasurer and Clerk should occupy the same office, as their so doing would greatly facilitate the better management of Township affairs.

We would suggest that the Township endeavor to obtain legislation whereby the books could be audited monthly. In that event any errors could at once be discovered and rectified.

As to the security given by the Treasurer, we report that same consists of bonds guaranteeing the sum of \$40,000, of which \$20,000 is from Guarantee Companies and the balance from a private individual.
