




ERBERT had a violin, He also had a bow; And everywhere young Herbert went, His friends were sure to go. They followed him where'er he went, They walked with him for miles,



EATRICE was quite Mamma's right hand, And helped her with the cooking; But she often took a little taste When Mother was not looking.








ITTLE MISS KATE was very fat,

In summer-time it kept her cool Each morning when she went to school.





Gus thought he looked so very grand : Both Solemn Sam and Smiling Jim Were very much amused at him. "If that is learning," said poor Sam,


