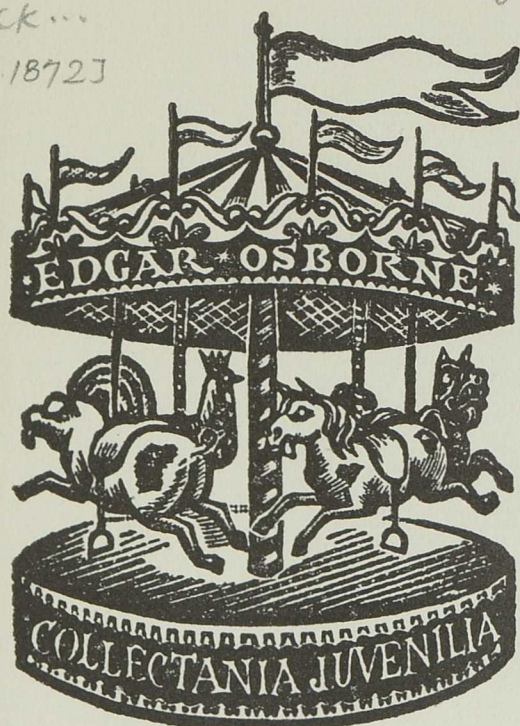
“Jack in the Box!” cried pretty little Edith,

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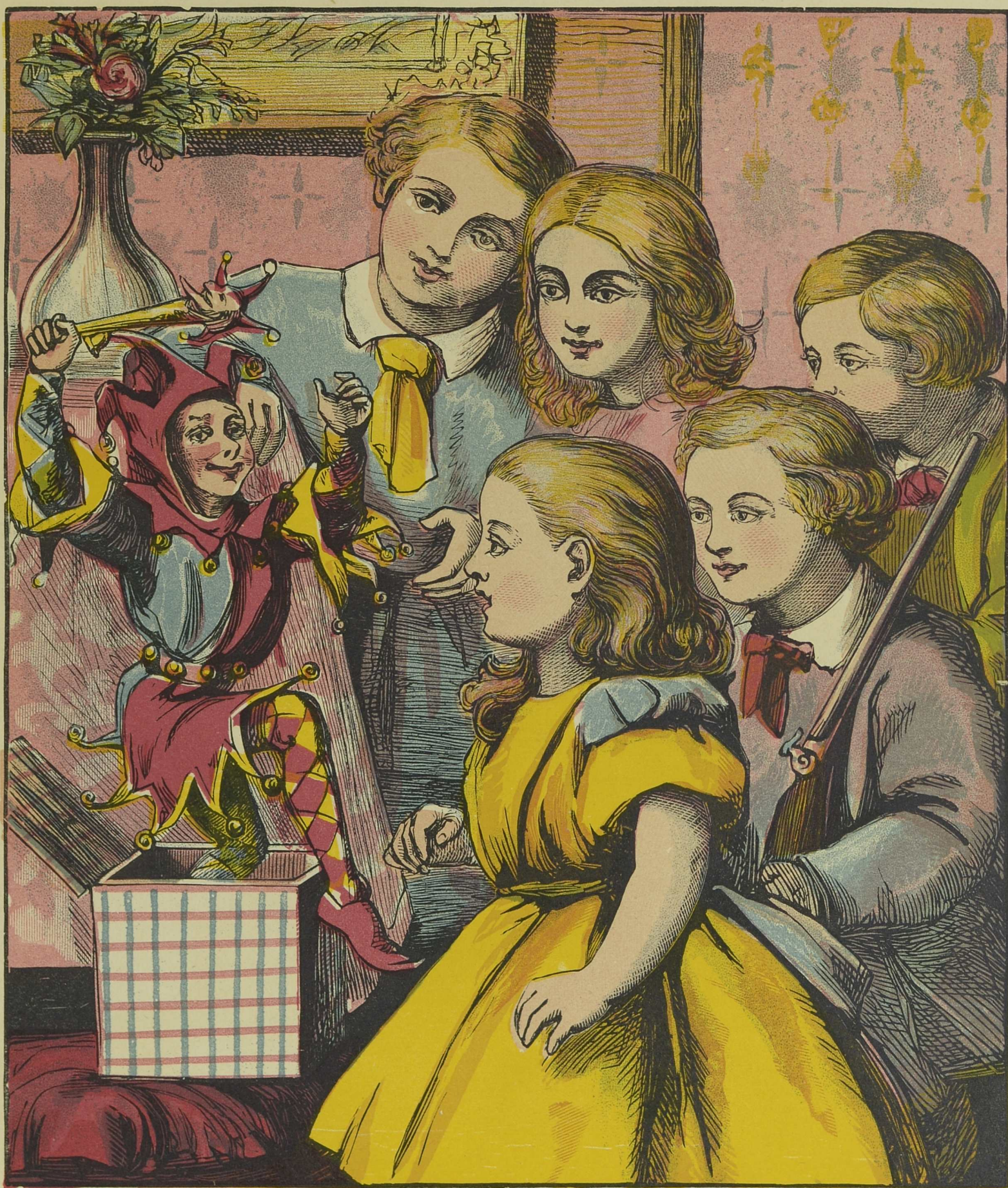
“Let’s look at Jack,” next day said little Arthur;

A gallant-looking British Grenadier.



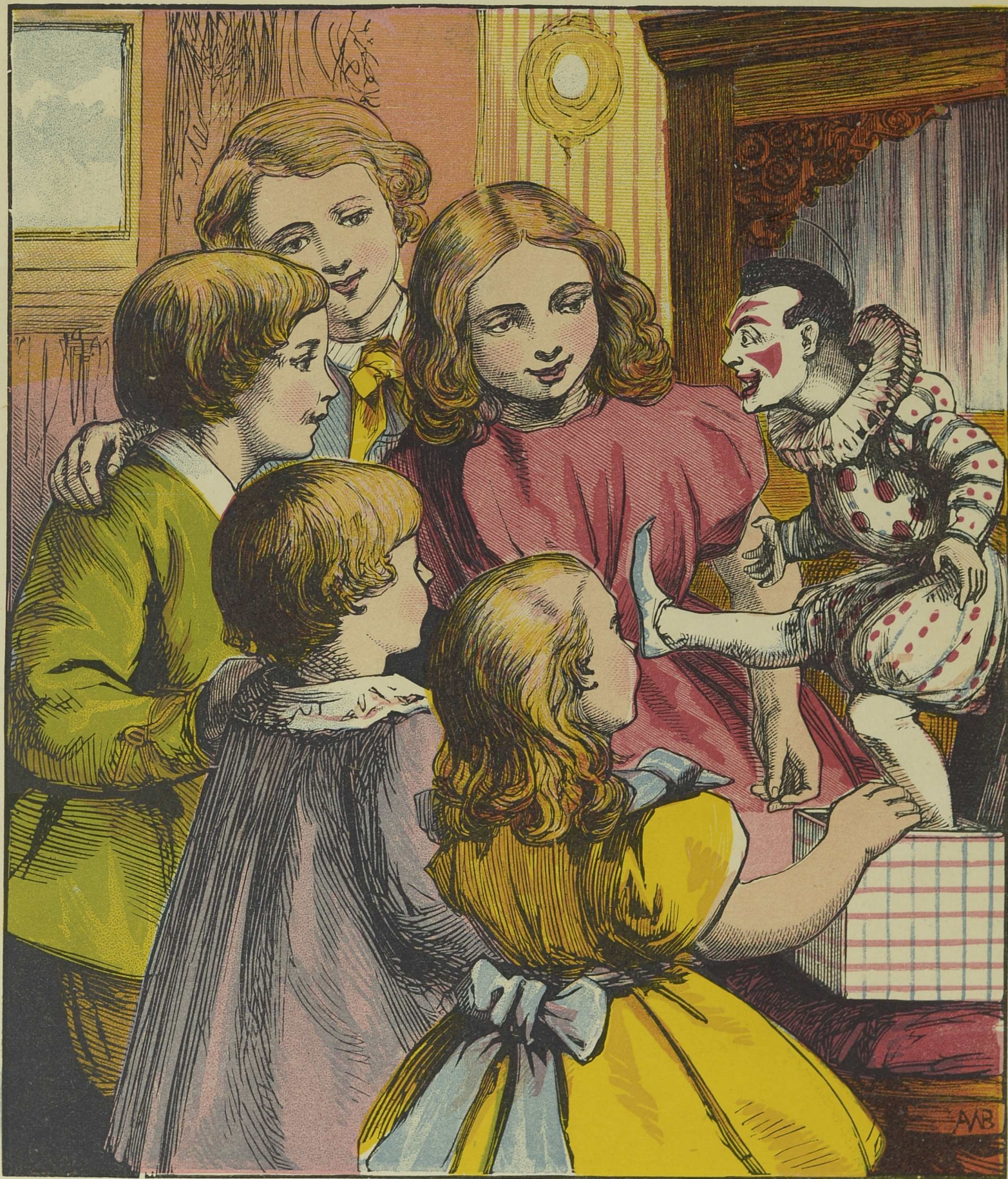
“Oh, Edith!” cried next day the little Amy,

He’s used to steer, you know, on board his ship!”



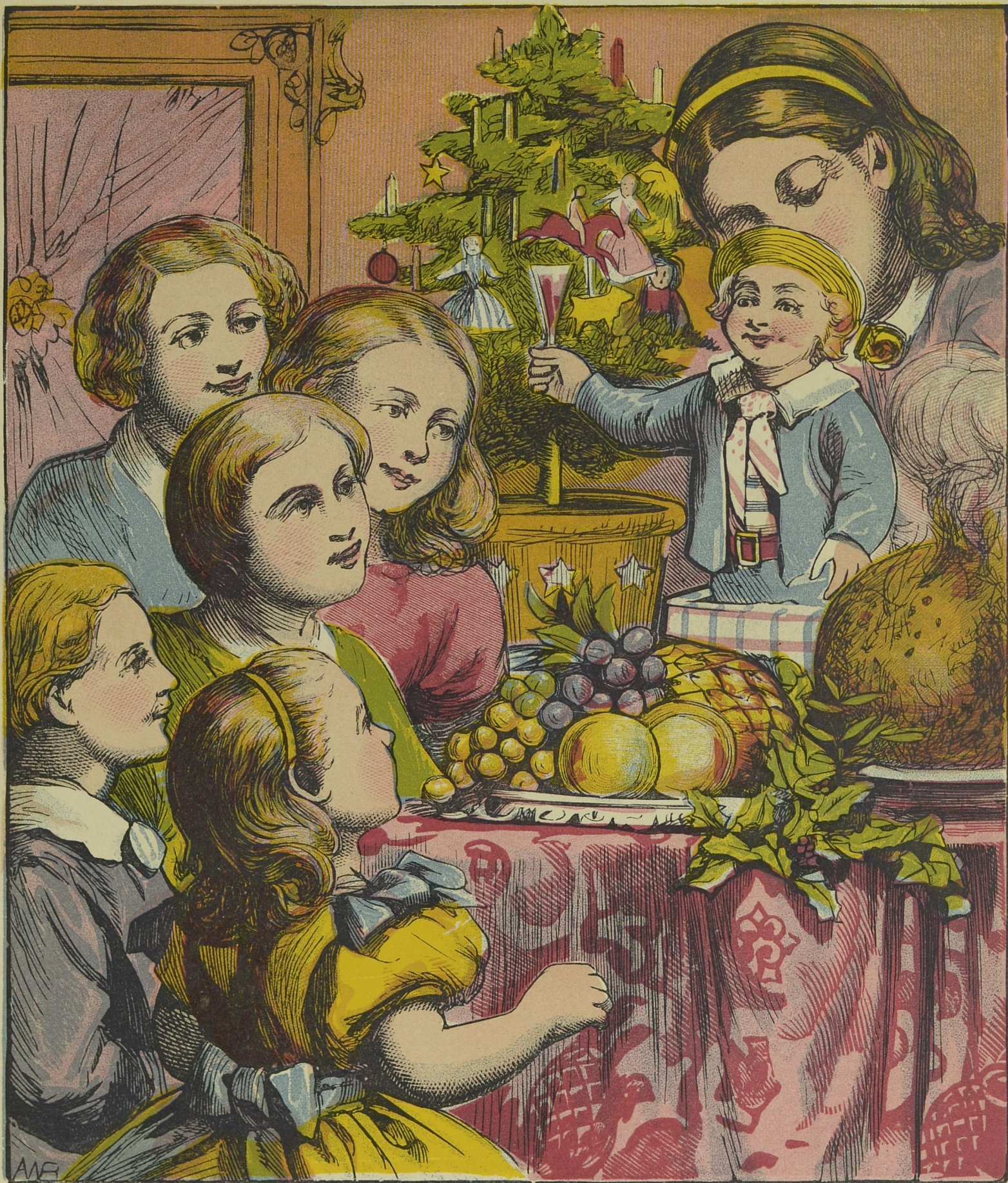
“I wonder if to-day Jack is a soldier?”
