SIR,—I have the honour to forward my Annual Report for the year 1884.

POLICE HEADQUARTERS.

I beg to call the attention of the Board to my previous reports and remarks upon this subject, with an expression of regret that they have not so far been productive of any practical results.

We are still suffering from a want of proper accommodation in this building.

The cells in the basement have long been condemned as unfit for use, and all prisoners apprehended in this division have to be conveyed to No. 2 station and brought back on the following morning for trial; and this, of course, entails considerable additional expense and labour.

The atmosphere in the building is unwholesome, and in damp weather particularly foul and injurious to the health of all concerned, while the accommodation both upstairs and down is very inadequate to our requirements.

NEW POLICE STATION IN THE WEST END.

The plans for this station have been prepared and a suitable site purchased, and it is desirable that no time be lost in getting the building ready for occupation, particularly in view of the early addition of Parkdale to the City, and also of the fact that the present station is but a temporary makeshift.

APPOINTMENTS IN 1884.

When Yorkville was added to Toronto I was asked to report upon the necessary force that would be required for the new district.

My report, which was adopted, called for ten men and one sergeant, the whole to be under the charge of the Inspector of No. 2 division.

The Town Hall furnishes us with station accommodation, and the new detachment was duly installed and entered upon their duties.

---

This continued until May last, when an Inspector was appointed, and another sergeant in his place.

Last year, when Brockton was added to the City, a similar detachment of one sergeant and ten men was reported by the Deputy Chief (in my absence) as the complement required for duty there. An Inspector has been appointed as well as a sergeant for duty at this sub-station, which, it was intended, should have formed part of No. 3 division, under the command of the Inspector of No. 3 station at St. Andrew's Hall. I regret that my original plan was not adhered to in both these instances, as it would have afforded greater efficiency at a smaller outlay.

DETECTIVE DEPARTMENT.

The duties of this department have been practically carried on by four men under the Inspector, because of the sickness of one and the inefficiency of another, and during the past year two thousand eight hundred and thirty-one occurrences have received their attention.

The average daily duty performed by each man has exceeded fourteen hours. The amount of lost property recovered, \$22,929.50; and of stolen property, \$24,591.75.

The services of Detectives Sheahan and Reid were lost in December, the former from ill-health and the latter by his resignation, and in place of these two vacancies Constable John A. Cuddy has been added to this department on probation, and I have every expectation that with experience he will become a useful and efficient officer.

Much good work has been performed by some individual members of this department during the year, and several important and clever arrests made, while the amount of property recovered and returned to the owners makes a very creditable showing; and it must be admitted that we have had far more than our share of housebreaking and burglary within the last six months, while the efforts of the department to secure the perpetrators of all these offences have not met with the success of former years.

WAIFS AND TRAMPS.

The statistical tables which are annexed shew that we have had double the number of these visitors in 1884 at our different stations from that returned in the previous year.

It proves what a large number of idle and shiftless people there are in the City; and as they cannot obtain work to earn their bread honestly, they, in many instances, turn their hands to theft and pilfering.

The insecure condition of a large proportion of our warehouses, stores, shops, and private residences enables these starving tramps to effect an easy entrance, and the police are usually blamed in all cases.

I have caused a large number of our merchants and others to be notified of this fact, but in most cases very little has been done to improve the condition of their premises.

---

House owners, especially in the summer, go away out of town and ask to have an eye kept on their houses by the police, while house agents constantly have a long list of empty houses on their hands with no one to look after them by day or night, and the police are blamed directly one of these unprotected places is entered and plundered of lead pipe and plumbers' fittings.

#### THE CLOTHING CONTRACT.

I am of opinion that this contract should extend over a period of three years, and should not be awarded to the lowest tenderer.

#### LEAVE OF ABSENCE.

During the past year the period of leave allowed to the constables of the force was extended so as to permit them to receive "from one to fourteen days."

No leave can be granted during the winter detail of duty, so that all must take their holidays between March and December, and to do this I have to allow two, and often three men to be away from one division simultaneously.

We have now (135) one hundred and thirty-five men in our ranks as under.

No leave is granted to men of the 3rd class whose term of service is only one year.

The average pay of 2nd and 1st class men is \$1.78.

Each man, therefore, while on his fourteen (14) days' leave draws \$24.92.

This, multiplied by 125 (the number of men entitled to leave), gives \$3,115, as the annual amount paid to constables on leave.

The total number of days leave granted amounts to 1,750, and the increase consequent upon the extension of four days amounts to \$890.

#### DISCIPLINE OF THE FORCE.

There were twenty-four cases of infraction of the rules and regulations by members of the force, and of these sixteen were of a sufficiently serious nature to necessitate the bringing of the offenders before the Board.

There were four cases in which the offenders were twice charged.

Some of the offences were of a very serious nature, and it is a matter of regret that the punishments inflicted by the Board were not as severe as the maintenance of strict discipline demanded, nor in accordance with my suggestions offered at the time.

I am satisfied that a strict and impartial discipline always ensures greater zeal and activity in all branches of the force, and adds materially to the general efficiency and usefulness of the whole department.

The escape of even one man from dismissal encourages every member of his division who may be so inclined to shirk his duty and neglect his work on the chance of escaping detection himself.

#### SANITARY POLICE.

Ten duties were detailed during the summer months to assist the Medical Health Officer of the City in making a sanitary inspection, and from Dr. Canniff's Reports it would appear that this duty has been satisfactorily performed.

The loss of these ten men, and a similar number (on an average) always on leave, created a serious gap in our numbers, while the cry for "more police" comes in from all quarters.

If it is intended that this sanitary duty is to be continued, I would recommend an increase in our numbers for that purpose specially.

#### BENEFIT FUND.

This fund continues to increase steadily, and at the close of the year there was standing in the Imperial Bank of Canada the sum of \$23,885.72 to the credit of the fund.

Three constables died during the year, namely: P. C. Thompson, McGuiness and Kearns; and their widows were entitled out of this fund to the following sums respectively:

1. Thompson.....	\$375 13
2. McGuiness.....	375 13
3. Kearns.....	393 89

The two first have been paid, and the latter cheque will be handed over as soon as the letters of administration are issued.

Detective Reid resigned his position in December, and was entitled to the sum of \$433.50, which has been paid; and Philip Sheahan, also a detective, who was obliged to withdraw from the force through ill-health, is now the first to draw a pension from the fund, amounting to very nearly one dollar per diem for the remainder of his life (\$29.64 per month).

#### THE ESTIMATES OF 1884

Amounted to \$134,462.40, and included a special sum of \$8,000 for a western station.

This item cannot, in justice, be considered an annual charge.

Leaving it out, and the appropriation stands at \$126,462.40, or \$11,353.45 in excess of the Estimate for 1883.
