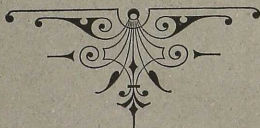

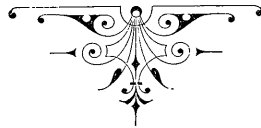

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POLICE HEADQUARTERS,

Toronto, January 18th, 1888.

SIR,—I have the honor to submit, with the usual Statistics of crime, etc., the following report in connection with the Police Department for the past year :

STRENGTH OF FORCE INCREASED.

Acting upon a formal resolution of the City Council, supported by representations from many private citizens, the Commissioners adopted the recommendations I made last February, and increased the Force early in the year by some thirty men, subsequently adding others to carry out the work of enforcing the laws relative to ferries, dogs, cruelty to animals, etc., duties that hitherto had not specially been under police jurisdiction.

REORGANIZATION OF DETECTIVE DEPARTMENT.

The next important step taken was a thorough and complete investigation into the Detective Department, resulting in its entire reorganization, and I confidently expect that the changes which have been brought about will prove of great public benefit.

SYSTEM OF GOOD CONDUCT PAY ESTABLISHED.

To meet the cases of constables who had long service with good conduct, and were perhaps in some instances, ineligible for promotion, a system of rewards in the shape of a graduated scale of good conduct pay was introduced, and I am of opinion that it has been found to give general satisfaction.

POWERS AND RESPONSIBILITY OF INSPECTORS INCREASED.

In order to complete the chain of responsibility that should exist between each grade of rank it was considered advisable to clothe the Inspectors of Divisions with more individual authority, and relieve them from the routine work which they had been in the habit of sharing with the Sergeant. The immediate supervision of the several divisions was placed in their hands and the responsibility for the maintenance of the good order that should prevail in their respective districts was imposed upon them. The result so far has, I consider, justified the step taken.

PAY OF FORCE INCREASED.

An increase of pay at the rate of five cents per diem was granted to all ranks below that of Deputy Chief (Detective Department excepted), part of which, however, was intended to meet the advance in the scale of contributions levied by the Benefit Fund, the balance being drawn by those concerned.

INTRODUCTION OF PATROL SYSTEM.

To further improve the efficiency of the Force, not only as regards the Constable on his beat, but for the rapid concentration of men at any particular point when needed, a By-law was submitted to and passed by the people for the funds necessary to establish what is known as the "Patrol System." This is so generally understood that it would be superfluous to describe the details,

but I feel sure when the public see the system in operation they will have every reason to feel satisfied at its introduction. It is expected that it will be in working order by May 1st, next.

DETECTIVE DEPARTMENT.

The re-organization of this department, already referred to, has been productive of much good, and has tended materially to restore the confidence that should repose in so important a bureau. It is now under the immediate direction of an inspector who is believed to possess in a marked degree the qualifications necessary to supervise the responsible duties that devolve upon this branch of Police service. The detective staff are working well, and I anticipate their record will improve with their experience. The introduction of photography, the proper registration of criminals and information connected therewith, for the purpose of identification, and a careful system of dealing with lost or stolen property are among the features novel to this department. Inspector Stark's report is appended, to which I invite your special attention.

STAFF INSPECTOR'S OFFICE.

The creation of this department, began at the commencement of the year, now requires the services of three officials, including the officer in charge.

It deals with a multitude of cases of nearly every description, embracing prosecution against houses of ill-fame, illicit liquor sellers, gambling dens, and those charged with cruelty to children and animals, as well as many others of a miscellaneous character.

This branch of police work has been efficiently done, and in such a way as to reflect credit upon Staff Inspector Archibald, who in supervising the duties of his department has shown energy, tact, and sound judgment. His report accompanies this.

STATIONS.

Headquarters.—The representations that have been made from time to time concerning the necessity that existed for increased accommodation and improvement in the sanitary condition of this building have at last been recognized, and it is with much satisfaction that I call attention to the important additions and alterations now in progress, which, when completed, will add materially to the health and comfort of those whose business is connected with this department. The entire building will also be heated by steam.

No. 1.—This, the largest station house in the City, has in connection with Police Headquarters, been undergoing a thorough and complete renovation, embracing improved accommodation for prisoners, both male and female, enlargement of the station proper, new dormitory, guard room, lavatories, etc., for the men, as well as an office for the Inspector in charge of the division; in fact utilizing to the fullest extent all available space.

Accommodation will also be provided for a Patrol wagon and ambulance, as well as stabling for the mounted squad. This extension of room has been obtained by the removal of the Fire Department.

No. 2.—Beyond painting and cleaning this station nothing else has required to be done. I would recommend that an office for the Inspector of this division be provided by utilizing the lower part of the tower, and that some minor alterations in the public office be made by substituting a counter for the desk, and altering its position. A locker for each man should also be included.

No. 3.—This station is far from satisfactory. The accommodation is deficient, and its proximity to a meat market makes its sanitary condition more than doubtful. I would suggest the propriety of considering the construction of a new station house in the near future in the vicinity of the present site.

No. 4.—The only expenditure in connection with this station has been for a little cleaning and painting. I would make the same suggestion for this as for No. 2.

No. 5.—This station has been cleaned and painted and supplied with lockers for the men, and for the time being answers all purposes.

No. 6.—It was expected that some steps would have been taken to proceed with the erection of a new station for this division on the site chosen and with the funds provided, but nothing has been done in view of the possible annexation of Parkdale to the City. It might perhaps be as well to pause before taking final action in the matter, but a revision of the proposed plans to include accommodation for a Patrol wagon would be advisable.

Notwithstanding the recent additions that have been made to the Force, it is still in my opinion too limited in numbers to keep pace relatively with the increasing demands of this growing City. The area included in the limits during 1887, such as the districts of Dovercourt, Seaton Village, part of Rose-dale, etc., represent about 1,200 acres of new territory, while the increase in population will, I understand, not fall short of 10,000. Certain localities that hitherto have been without police protection, having become much built up, now consider themselves entitled to the same consideration as other more favored parts, and while the impossibility of covering the entire City or even the greater part of it must be admitted, I entertain the opinion that some of the residential districts are too scantily policed, and that the time has arrived to establish beats in the parts I allude to.

On the principal thoroughfares, notably Queen and Yonge Streets, during the hours when they are thronged with people, it is desirable that a few more men should be placed there who could be withdrawn to the other beats when the cessation of traffic permits.

The introduction of the Patrol system will involve the employment of several men as operators, drivers, etc., as will also the ambulance service, so with the allowance that must always be made for men on the sick list, leave, special duty, etc., I would recommend the addition of 30 men to bring the total strength of the force to 235 of all ranks for the current year. This may seem a formidable increase, but with the population growing in a phenomenal manner, and a City expanding with abnormal rapidity, I have rather understated the wants than over-estimated the requirements.

Among the events of the past year that specially concerned the Police may may be mentioned the visit of Mr. William O'Brien, the strikes in the building trades, and the reduction of the liquor licenses. Notwithstanding the intense excitement that was created by Mr. O'Brien's visit, there was no disturbance of a serious nature, a fact which was due to the good sense of the people as well as to the preparations that had been made to suppress a popular outbreak. The strikes were, with one exception, of short duration, but the carpenters remained idle for nearly two months, and during that time the peace of the City was in no way disturbed, showing a remarkable record of good behaviour on the part of all concerned. The law reducing the number of liquor licenses has been as a rule observed by those who were affected, some having closed their houses and turned their attention to other matters. A watchful supervision has, however, been kept upon all places where liquor is supposed to be sold illegally, with the effect, I believe, of curtailing to a very large extent the sale of intoxicants.

To stamp it out entirely would be beyond the power of any police force so long as liquor is purchasable.

In closing this report upon my first year of office, I desire to express the satisfaction I feel at the manner in which all ranks have discharged the various duties assigned to them. The Officers, from the Deputy Chief downwards, have given me a loyal and intelligent support, while the men have at all times showed a cheerful obedience to orders, facts which may be accepted as evidence that the high state of discipline established by my predecessors has been maintained.

The report of the Surgeon of the Force, Dr. Spragge, is appended, from which it will be observed that the general health has been good, and the deaths one as against three in the previous year.

All of which is respectfully submitted.

The Chairman of the Police Commissioners, Toronto :

SIR,—I have the honor to submit for your consideration my Report for the year 1887.

The Force lost but one of its members through death, viz., Inspector Munro, as against three in 1886.

The health of the Force has been generally good, though we have had a larger number of men on the sick list, viz., 165, but the nature of the illness has not been of a serious character. As in former years, derangement of the digestive organs have been the most frequent cause of disability, though we have had an unusually large proportion of diseases of the respiratory organs.

Twenty-five men were injured while in the discharge of duty, a large proportion of which occurred to the mounted men.

Only two men have resigned on account of failing health, a much smaller number than heretofore.

I must beg to call your attention to the most unsanitary state of No. 3 Station, due in a great measure to its proximity to the meat market. The place is overrun with rats, which are often poisoned and dying under the flooring, causing a most disagreeable as well as unhealthy atmosphere. I do not think that anything short of removal will cure this evil. In No. 6 Station the sleeping apartment is wholly inadequate for the number of men occupying the station.
