The Chairman, Board of Police Commissioners, Toronto:

SIR,—I have the honor to submit for your consideration this my Annual Report of the Police Department for the year 1912, accompanied by the usual statistics arranged in tabular form. I also present for your information the subsidiary reports from the officers in charge of the Detective and Staff Departments.

The total number of persons arrested or summoned by the Police was 34,380, an increase of 6,724 over the previous year. The most marked increases appear under the headings of "Drunkenness," 1,948; "Breaches of the City By-laws," 3,902; "Lord's Day Act," 224, and "Fraud," 112. A decrease of 217 in the cases of cruelty to animals is to be noted.

In 16,469 cases the charges were either dismissed or not proceeded with.

Property valued at \$291,174.26 was reported as lost and stolen. The Police recovered \$212,990.89, a somewhat reduced percentage.

DETECTIVE DEPARTMENT

Has dealt with 803 more cases of a criminal nature than the previous year, as per appended table:

Two deliberate murders of adults were committed. In one case a man has been convicted and awaits confirmation of his sentence. In the other a man was charged with the crime, but the witnesses called by the Crown failed to identify him.

Infanticide accounts for the other cases under this heading, in Statistical Table "A."

Burglary occurred more frequently, and the amount stolen was larger, as was also the case with house and shopbreaking, doubtless the outcome of the growth of the City. Juveniles have taken to this line of depredation, and as experts are quite the equals of older thieves.

Subjoined is the usual comparative statement.

Towards the close of the year Inspector Duncan vacated his position as head of the Detective Staff, and his place has been filled by the promotion of Inspector Kennedy.

Some minor changes in the personnel have also taken place, through men being returned to uniform duty and others tested as to their value for detective work, which requires men with a taste and aptitude specially necessary for success in this line of Police duty.

The new room provided for the Staff has greatly relieved the pressure, but the space is still much too confined.

STAFF DEPARTMENT.

Has been actively engaged in its multifarious duties of great variety, and the report of the Acting Inspector covers the work done in detail, of which the following is a summary:

The morality of the City, so far as it concerns the Police under By-law or Statute, has been given a full measure of attention.

Houses of ill-fame have been visited, raided and broken up in many instances. The inmates have been fined or imprisoned, but in the absence of a law to banish all such persons from the City, they are liable to resume business when they see a chance to do so.

Dive keepers have been so drastically treated that there has resulted a considerable suspension of illicit liquor selling among those who make it a

business. This is due to the steady and persistent pressure of the divisional plain clothes men.

Betting has received a decided check by the imposition of heavy fines, and in one case, imprisonment. It is on the decline, and conducted with great secrecy. The law has been strictly observed at the Woodbine and other race tracks.

Cruelty to animals has not only the special attention of one man detailed for the purpose, but the whole Force is enjoined to report cases of this kind. I am of opinion that a second man is necessary for this work, which is more than one can look after.

In the treatment of domestic difficulties, this Department renders conspicuously good service by adjusting or relieving cases often of a nature requiring delicate handling without bringing them into the garish light of the Police Court.

No less than \$8,000 has been recovered from husbands who had given up supporting their wives, who were in a destitute condition.

There is reason to believe that organ grinding in the streets is used as a cloak by women to commit immorality for gain, which they hand over to the men who employ them. This business should be under the License Law, and women eliminated from it.

The Department was under the direction of Staff Inspector Kennedy till he was promoted to be Inspector of Detectives. His place has not yet been filled, but Sergeant McKinney has been in charge pending a permanent appointment.

Mrs. Whiddon, who has been acting as a Police Matron since January 1st, 1899, died on December 8th, to the regret of all who knew her as a faithful worker in her sphere among women. She has been succeeded by Miss Carmichael.

The staff of this Department is under strength. I recommend that it be increased.

AMBULANCE SERVICE.

Consists of four horse-drawn vehicles in serviceable order and with equipment to date, stationed in Nos. 1 (Centre) and 6 (Western) districts, and have rendered as prompt and efficient service as could be expected from them.

The time, in my opinion, is overdue for at least one motor ambulance, and again I recommend that it be provided this year to meet the necessities of a widely extended community. The number of patients carried and the mileage travelled were both considerably in excess of 1911. That the public regard the ambulances as at their disposal without fee is apparent from the fact that 3,769 patients only contributed \$220.50 for the service rendered.

109 members of the Force attended lectures, and were instructed how to render "First Aid."

74 obtained certificates, bringing the total held to 521.

MOUNTED SERVICE.

Is operated with 24 officers and men and 24 horses, scattered over the City as near their work as stable accommodation will permit.

The patrols were maintained with regularity, and extended where their presence was most desirable. Traffic on some of the main thoroughfares has been under their regulation and direction.

There were no casualties among the horses. One was cast. The equipment is in serviceable condition.

PATROL WAGON SERVICE.

Has handled a larger volume of business without mishap. Five wagons are in constant use and have covered a mileage of over 22,300, chiefly in the conveyance of prisoners to or from stations.

I regard horse-drawn vehicles in this connection as approaching the obsolete, and I recommend the introduction of motor wagons at the earliest possible moment for the sake of efficiency and economy.

The Signal Service which directs the movements of the wagons is giving every satisfaction, and the mechanical apparatus works without a hitch at a minimum of cost for upkeep.

GENERAL REMARKS.

The strength of the Force was augmented during the year from 539 to 588, and now stands at its highest level.

To afford some protection to the recently annexed districts, to keep a sufficient number of men on traffic duty and to man the new Stations will require additions to be made to the Force, which I recommend should be brought up to a total of 650.

The increased rates of pay and "days off" have not prevented men of short service from leaving the Force in larger numbers, to take advantage of outside offers of employment. There have, however, been sufficient men offering to take their places.

A census of the City was taken by the Police in January, when the population was ascertained to be 425,407.

The Traffic Squad has been on continuous duty for over six months, and has effected a decided improvement in the regulation of vehicles, particularly at the busy corners. Drivers, however, have yet to learn that com-

pliance with the rule-of-the-road is necessary on the less frequented streets. Permission to send some Police Constables to London, England, for training has been obtained.

Despite the raising of the speed limit for automobiles to 15 miles per hour, numbers of drivers run their cars over 20, and over 2,900 were brought into Court for this and other breaches of the law respecting motors.

The Policing of the Harbour with a Patrol Boat has been discontinued, as that duty has been assumed by the Harbour Commissioners.

No. 10 Police Station was opened for business in April. I expect the new No. 3 will be ready in three months time, and No. 11 later in the year. I hope a Station on the Island will be built during the summer, money for the purpose having been provided.

Their Royal Highnesses the Duke and Duchess of Connaught visited Toronto officially in May.

The Annual Convention of the International Association of Chiefs of Police was held in Toronto in July, the attendance being gratifyingly large, and the proceedings interesting and instructive.

In December the Town of North Toronto became part of the City, adding a large area that will expect Police protection.

At the request of the Board of Control a Censor of theatrical performances, held under license, has been temporarily appointed as an experiment, relieving the Police of this duty.

The number of unoccupied houses under temporary Police supervision was 2,315; 15 were entered and robbed, the thieves in many cases being subsequently arrested and punished.

The usual comparative statement of Estimates and Expenditure are given below, the difference in favour of the latter being \$3,975.83.

DEAR SIR,—I beg to submit for your consideration my report for the year 1912.

I regret to have to report the death of two members of the Force during the past year.

The number of men on the sick list exceeded that of any previous year, due no doubt to the fact of there being a large number of recruits, many of whom were non-residents of Canada, and therefore not acclimatized. That together with irregular hours of sleep and irregular meals, a condition inseparable from a Policeman's duties, are the chief causes of sickness.

Though there were a number of accidents, there were comparatively few the result of assaults on the Police as compared with those of some years ago.
