ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

CHIEF CONSTABLE

FOR THE YEAR 1913

CHIEF CONSTABLE'S OFFICE,
Toronto, February 2nd, 1914.

The Chairman, Board of Police Commissioners, Toronto:

SIR,—I have now the honor to submit for your information my Annual Report upon the Police Department for the City of Toronto, covering the year 1913, and with it the usual statistical returns, accompanied also by the sub-reports of the officers in charge of the Detective and Staff Departments for the same period.

The total number of persons arrested or summoned by the Police is given as 39,654, being an increase of 5,274 over the previous year—all of the male sex, as the females show a decrease of 11.

Of the charges laid, 18,221 were withdrawn or dismissed.

Among the more conspicuous breaches of the law, showing an increase, are:

The number of juveniles arrested for indictable offences was 564.

Property to the reported value of \$380,411, including automobiles, \$53,375, was lost and stolen. The Police recovered \$260,315.

There is always a considerable amount of money, etc., stolen that is unrecoverable, having been spent or otherwise disposed of.

DETECTIVE DEPARTMENT.

According to the appended summary, felonious offences show a net increase of 1,124, but it is a matter for congratulation that the crime of murder was not committed in Toronto.

There were three cases of infants found dead.

A few changes occurred in the personnel of the Detective Staff, due to promotion and other causes.

The Inspector reports that his men rendered loyal service, working harmoniously together. He requires more men detailed for detective duty, and I recommend that they be given to him.

STAFF DEPARTMENT

Has dealt with the usual variety of cases that come within the sphere of duty of the officials attached to this branch of the Police Service, and in a general way they are summarized as follows:

The time of the Staff has been largely taken up with cases of a domestic nature, the bulk of which are adjusted without bringing them into Court.

Houses of ill-fame have been closely watched, visited, raided and prosecuted when the circumstances justified such action.

Illicit liquor selling is carried on to a limited extent, chiefly by foreigners.

Betting through hand-books in hotels, barbers' shops and on street corners has been followed up with considerable success, and the convictions secured resulted in heavy fines, and in some cases imprisonment without the option of a fine. It is expected that this will have a salutary effect.

The sale of opium has received close attention, resulting in seizures that involved the imposition of fines amounting to over \$3,400. The traffic is chiefly among the Chinese.

Cruelty to animals is one of the duties devolving on this Department that takes up a great deal of time and attention, particularly of the man

detailed for that purpose. The results are well worth all that is done for the welfare of the animals, whose treatment at times is scandalous.

The Police women who were appointed during the year have been attached to this Department, and their services have been found useful in many ways.

Some restrictions have been placed upon the hours for licensed newsboys to sell papers on the streets, and their attendance at school is reported as reasonably regular.

The office accommodation is so limited that the work is carried on at great inconvenience to the officials and the public.

One addition has been made to the Staff, which is still short-handed.

AMBULANCE SERVICE.

A motor ambulance was provided in October, and has proved to be a valuable acquisition in moving patients with expedition and comfort. It is operated from No. 2 Station, a central point. Two of the horse ambulances are now shut down and might be sold, as their day here is about over.

The number of persons moved by the ambulances was 3,686, and they contributed \$216. There is \$2,361.13 in the bank.

Five ambulance lectures in "First Aid" were given to the recruits and others. Eighty-five certificates of competency were issued to those entitled to them, which increases the number now held to 560.

I recommend that a second ambulance be purchased, convertible for use as a patrol wagon, which would provide a substitute for both in case of a break down.

MOUNTED SERVICE.

Has been maintained with the usual regularity, affording a horse patrol where a P. C. on foot would be unable to cover the ground.

Traffic, to a limited extent, is regulated by mounted P.C.'s with advantage.

The opening of No. 11 Station provides stable accommodation in a district where it was much wanted.

As escorts for processions, etc., mounted men are increasingly useful.

Two horses were sold as unfit for further service and replaced by the purchase of others. It is growing more and more difficult to get the right stamp of horse even at much higher prices.

PATROL WAGON, SIGNAL SERVICE, ETC.

The introduction of a motor-driven wagon has increased the efficiency of the service and made it possible to operate the system with fewer wagons and at less expense. With another wagon it would be possible to dispense with the prisoners' vans and effect a further saving.

The mechanical part of the system has been well looked after by Sergeant Tripp, and is in good working order.

The Signal Service has been extended by fifteen new boxes placed so as to cover portions of the districts recently added to the City. They will be in full operation by midsummer.

For the details of the work accomplished see Table "O."

GENERAL REMARKS.

The strength of the Force on January 1st last was 626 all ranks, an increase during the year of 38. To meet the ever increasing requirements of this fast growing City, allowing for "days off," leave, sickness and casualties of all sorts, it is imperative to my mind that the Force should be brought up to a total of 700. There are now 11 complete Police Divisions, each with a full complement of officers and men, subdivided into beats. To maintain one beat requires three men, so to add one beat in each Division 33 would be absorbed in this way, and many sections of the City seldom see a Policeman. Regulation of traffic, additions to the Detective Staff and other departments call for men all along the line.

The recruiting of eligible men is now less difficult than for some years, and applications by letter are being received in greater numbers.

The boundaries of the Divisions have been re-arranged to make the territory tributary to the Stations more convenient.

Traffic regulation is improving as the Police become more proficient and the public have a better understanding of what they should do. A detail of Police was sent to London, England, also New York, where facilities were given them to acquire a wider knowledge of how the handling of traffic can be effectively done. I think the lessons learnt will prove of local advantage.

At the instance of some ladies belonging to the Local Council of Women a Police Court for the trial of females only has been established, and has proved to be a step forward in the right direction. Two Police women have also been added, and they are assigned to duties that their sex enables them to discharge with peculiar advantage.

The Theatrical Censor and his assistants, who were appointed early in the year, have effected the elimination of a good deal that was objectionable in the acting and dialogue at certain theatres, and there is now little cause

for complaint in the plays themselves or their presentation on the stage. The Police are only too glad to be relieved of this duty.

A new Station, known as No. 11, corner of Markham and London Streets, was opened in December, and another at Hanlan's Point is under construction.

Unoccupied or vacant houses to the number of 2,515 were placed under Police surveillance. Of these, four were entered by thieves.

I append the usual statement showing how the Police appropriation has been expended, the balance being on the right side.

Strange to say that we have this year for the first time been free from typhoid fever.

I have no doubt that the new well-ventilated Stations will improve the comfort and health of the men.
