CHIEF CONSTABLE'S OFFICE,
Toronto, February 12th, 1917.

The Chairman, Board of Police Commissioners, Toronto:

SIR,—I have the honor to present for your consideration my Report upon the operations of the Police Department for 1916, also the usual detailed information in statistical form.

The number of persons apprehended or summoned was 27,722 males and 2,271 females, as against 33,918 males and 2,571 females in the previous year, the difference being 6,496 less of both sexes.

are among the cases appearing less frequently on the Calendar.

The reputed value of property lost or stolen was \$331,788.00.

Through Police instrumentality, \$267,959.00 was recovered, the percentage being 80.76, which is above the average.

DETECTIVE DEPARTMENT.

The reports show a further decline in the number of cases handled by the Staff, and the reason assigned is the continuance of the Great War.

No murder was committed in Toronto during the year, but one man arraigned on that charge, was convicted of manslaughter.

House and shopbreaking show an increase, due to the activities of Juveniles, who confined their thefts to articles of small value.

Two hundred and seventy-seven automobiles, said to be worth \$110,800.00, were stolen or driven away. Two hundred and seventy-three were recovered, some in a damaged condition.

The detectives are at a great disadvantage in not having a motor car to deal with this and other matters requiring instant and rapid attention. I recommend that one be provided.

Bicycle thefts have fallen off considerably.

Pocket picking occurred less frequently, and the amount stolen was much smaller.

The applications for the parole of convicts fell off nearly one hundred.

The registration and supervision of enemy aliens has been carried out methodically and effectively. They have conducted themselves in a law abiding manner, and are permitted to work without molestation, provided they comply with the regulations.

STAFF DEPARTMENT.

It will be observed, upon reference to the list of offences and cases reported to and dealt with by the Inspector and his assistants, that the aggregate was not so large as the previous year.

Gambling and betting, also illegal card playing, have increased to some extent, though closely watched, but has ceased in factories where it had flourished. Vigilance alone will restrict this form of amusement from becoming more prevalent.

The sale of prohibited drugs, with the exception of opium, has been more marked in the early part of the year, and as it is peddled on the streets and in billiard rooms, etc., in the most clandestine manner, it is not easily stamped out.

Sunday observance shows improvement, and animals have been less cruelly treated, though some of those in transit by rail have suffered severely through overcrowding, exposure to the weather, and lack of proper nourishment.

Truancy occupies the attention of three P. C.'s, who have succeeded in keeping the cases well in hand. The early morning Court now attends to these matters, instead of the Juvenile, which is a saving of time to those concerned.

The licenses issued to newsboys have fallen from 1,335 to 676 in the last year. Their attendance at school is reported as satisfactory.

The adjustment of domestic difficulties continues to absorb much time and trouble, but the results justify the efforts made. Wife desertion, non-support and wayward girls are among the predominating cases. Upwards of \$10,000 was collected from husbands outside of Toronto, who had left their wives and families destitute.

Sexual immorality such as prevails in what are now termed as bawdy houses, has received the careful attention of the Police in all Divisions, with about the usual results.

Massagists now require a license, which has caused the closing of the parlors where a disreputable business was carried on.

The Policewomen attached to this Department having had the benefit of over three and a half years' experience, they are increasingly competent to deal with the cases in which females are immediately concerned.

MOUNTED SERVICE.

The Inspector who had charge for several years retired on a pension, and his place is temporarily filled by a qualified officer.

The horses and equipment is in a satisfactory condition. The patrol work has been performed with regularity, and without interruption. The horses average well, but some are near the end of their career. Five were sold as unfit, and were not replaced.

AMBULANCE, PATROL WAGON AND SIGNAL SERVICES.

Have all been operated without misadventure, and call for no comment. Horse-drawn vehicles are scarcely used at all, and may be dispensed with at any time. The obsolete vans and wagons should be sold.

The usual lectures on "First Aid" were given, and the certificates of competency now held number 572.

GENERAL REMARKS.

Through resignations, dismissals and death, the strength of the Force has declined ninety-one during the year, leaving the number available for duty January 1st, 1917, at 598, all ranks.

The majority of those who resigned did so to volunteer for active military service, and it is likely that many of them who return will rejoin the Force when the war is over. Meantime, I do not consider it essential that their places be filled at present.

According to advices received, five P. C.'s were killed in action or died of wounds in 1916. Their next of kin receive the insurance carried on their lives by the Benefit Fund, as well as such accumulation of pay as the Commissioners see fit to grant, in the case of single men. Married men's pay goes to their wives monthly.

The Ontario Temperance Act became operative September 16th. Since that date the number of arrests for drunkenness has greatly decreased, as per comparative figures given below:

September 16th to December 31st, 1915.....	3,347

One hundred and forty-nine prosecutions for violation of the Act were made up to the close of the year and the Police have been vigilant and active in the enforcement of the law. Despite severe penalties the sale of liquor illicitly continues, as there is a wide margin of profit. Amendments to the law will probably become necessary to entirely meet the situation.

As twenty-two persons met their death through being run over by motor vehicles, the largest number on record in Toronto, it is evident that the

drivers must be compelled to exercise more care. All amateur and professional drivers should have a license, forfeitable upon conviction of causing an accident due to their own fault. Pedestrians, too, should be most cautious when crossing the roadway.

The leaving of automobiles on the streets in front of offices in the business districts has become a habit requiring drastic treatment in the general interests of traffic, which is incommoded seriously. The places set aside for parking are misused by cars being left there nearly all day.

It has been decided that no collections or entertainments are permissible in theatres, halls or places of public resort for war, patriotic or kindred purposes without a permit from the Mayor, recommended by the Chief Constable.

Permits for boxing matches on Good Friday are no longer issued.

The official censorship over theatres, picture shows, etc., including the Exhibition Grounds, has been well maintained, with results creditable to the staff employed.

To make up in some degree for the vacancies caused by men leaving, I would suggest for your consideration the advisability of placing a light motor car at the disposal of some of the Divisions where they could be used to the best advantage. The cost and operation of each would not exceed that of one Constable.

Out of the 3,041 houses under special supervision, none were entered.

The receipts from licenses totalled \$98,523.00, which is \$6,344.00 less than the previous year.

Dr. Spragge submits his report upon the health of the Force, and it is herewith transmitted. While the sick list was larger, with a reduced number of men, it is gratifying to observe that no death occurred.

The Chairman, Board of Police Commissioners, Toronto:

SIR,—I have the honor to submit for your consideration my report for 1916.

Notwithstanding the fact that the Force is about one hundred under strength, I had a very large sick list, in fact the largest in the past ten years. This was mainly due to the large number who suffered from La Grippe.

I am glad to say, however, that we have had no deaths through sickness, but of the forty-one members who went overseas with the sanction of the Board, eight were killed in action, and eight have returned, all of whom have resumed duty.

About ninety men resigned stating that they were going to enlist. How many did so I have no record of, nor of the number of casualties that occurred.
