The Chairman, Board of Police Commissioners, Toronto:

SIR,—I have the honor to submit for your consideration, my Report on the Police Department for 1917, with the usual statistics for same period.

The number of persons, both sexes, apprehended or summoned reached a total of 25,714 as compared with 29,993 in 1916, a decrease of 3,995 males and 284 females, or 4,279 in all.

In 7,385 cases the charge was withdrawn or not proceeded with.

Property valued at \$818,012.00 was reported lost or stolen, of which \$720,639.00 was recovered by the Police, equivalent to about 88 per cent.; more than half represent the value of automobiles restored to their owners.

DETECTIVE DEPARTMENT.

The criminal records show an increase of 377 cases over 1916, eliminating the theft of bicycles and automobiles, as will be seen by the following comparative statement.

One murder was committed in Toronto during the year; a foreigner shooting another, and so far has escaped apprehension.

There were 10 cases of manslaughter, 3 of them arising through brawls or quarrels. The others resulted from persons being killed by the drivers of motor cars.

Burglary appears so seldom as to be almost negligible.

A substantial increase appears under the heading of House and Shopbreaking due to the activities chiefly of young men who repeated their depredations until they were caught; as many as 20 instances being chargeable against one man.

The advent of a number of expert professional "Pick Pockets" from the United States was the cause of more than double the number of cases of Pocket Picking reported in 1916, the loss sustained being nearly \$4,000.00 more than that year.

Bicycle stealing has been more frequent, 92 more wheels having been stolen valued at over \$7,000.00.

It is astonishing how indifferent the owners of bicycles are. Though the Police recover a large number in the course of the year, many of them never find owners.

The stealing or running off of automobiles developed enormously, and the value of the cars stolen represent no less a sum than \$677,000.00, an increase of nearly \$439,000.00 over the previous year. All but 12 of the stolen cars were recovered.

It is high time that something was done to bring home to youths who are not yet classed as criminals, the serious responsibility they incur when stealing a car for joyriding.

This is regarded by them more in the light of a joke than a misdemeanour, and it is also to a certain extent condoned by the public as a boyish escapade.

This is not the view the owners or the Police take of it, and unless adequate measures are taken to suppress this form of stealing, the practice will develop still further.

A contributing cause is due to the careless indifference of many owners, who leave their cars so long on the streets that they fall an easy prey to anyone who wants to steal them.

The supervision of aliens has not been relaxed. Many of them are so migratory in their habits that it is not easy to keep a close track of their movements.

The work done by Detective Maurer in this connection has been valuable to the Department and creditable to himself, as he speaks several languages.

Upon my recommendation of last year, a motor car has been provided for the Detective Staff, increasing their mobility and efficiency.

I invite your attention to the report of Inspector of Detectives Kennedy, which accompanies this.

STAFF DEPARTMENT.

The Inspector in charge of the work that centralizes in his Department reports that his staff has been running at high pressure to keep up with the volume of work that has devolved upon him and his assistants.

The enforcement of the Ontario Temperance Act has been given a good deal of attention, no less than 1,188 cases having been prosecuted in the Police Court, resulting in large additions to the revenue of the City in the shape of fines.

Some 3,981 complaints of a domestic nature have been dealt with, requiring a good deal of time and care for their adjustment. The success attendant thereon has been satisfactory. The Police Women have assisted materially in these cases.

Over \$15,000.00 has been collected by this Bureau from husbands for the support of their wives and families, and distributed throughout the country, United States and elsewhere.

Prosecutions for houses of ill-fame have fallen from 165 in 1916 to 91 in 1917, which does not necessarily indicate that the morality of the City has improved, but merely that sexual intercourse is indulged in in other ways and places beyond the reach of the Police.

Book-making has been less in evidence, as horse racing has been discontinued to a great extent.

Chinese and foreigners have ignored the law prohibiting card playing on Sunday so as to increase the prosecutions by 82.

The war upon sellers and users of Opium, Cocaine and other noxious drugs has been actively carried on, with the object of suppressing this vicious and destructive habit, and while 68 cases have been brought into Court there is reason to believe that the evil has been but partially curtailed.

Cruelty to animals has been under the usual supervision, and there is a marked falling off in the number of summonses issued, with a corresponding decrease in fines imposed.

The substitution of motor driven vehicles for horses may be one of the reasons, and the spreading of the Humane Society's literature is probably another.

The cattle markets and slaughter houses have been under Police observation, which has tended to restrict cruelty that might be practised there.

The Truant Officers report truancy about normal, the difference being rather in favor of 1917.

Sunday observance has been well maintained, and there have been 102 fewer cases in Court.

AMBULANCE, PATROL WAGON AND SIGNAL SERVICE.

Motor driven vehicles in connection with these services have entirely displaced those operated by horses, giving much more prompt and effective service without an undue increase in expense.

Experience would seem to indicate that the vehicles should be of a lighter and cheaper kind.

No additions have been made during the year.

A disused horse ambulance was sold to a Country Town at a nominal price.

The public made voluntary contributions to the extent of \$189.00.

The total to the credit of this fund is \$1,324.07.

The Signal Service conducted its operations continuously without mishap.

The Contract expires this year, but I anticipate no difficulty in its renewal on much the same terms.

MOUNTED SERVICE.

The Mounted Service has furnished the usual Patrols, escorts, etc., and without interruption by weather or other causes, and afforded the outskirts a measure of protection that would not otherwise be available.

The horses have fared well on the whole, sickness and lameness being at a minimum.

One horse was sold when unfit for further Police work and replaced.

The squad is now in charge of a Sergeant instead of an Inspector.

GENERAL REMARKS.

The strength of the Force decreased 24 during the year.

Most of these men resigned and enlisted for Military Service Overseas.

The balance remaining January 1st, 1918, being 574.

The vacancies were not filled.

A strike by the employees of the Toronto Railway Company occurred in June. It lasted three days, during which time no attempt was made to run the cars, so there was an absence of disorder usual on such occasions.

The Police arrangements made for emergency involved some expense for meals and sleeping facilities.

An Amendment to the Highway Travel Act came into effect, requiring vehicles to give the right of way to those on the right hand side, which is an improvement over the previous local regulation, which gave priority to those going North and South over those bound East and West.

Extra pay was granted to the Police during the year to meet the higher cost of living.

The Force is now paid twice a month instead of once as before.

GENERAL REMARKS.

As a matter of Food Production the Police cultivated about 22 acres of land, kindly lent to them for that purpose by the Oriole Park Company, Limited.

Though the work was not taken in hand until the spring was well advanced, and the ground had not been cultivated for some years, the crop results were 798 bags of potatoes, which may be regarded as very satisfactory, due largely to the efforts of Sergeant Brown under whose supervision and direction the work was carried out.

The product was distributed among the Hospitals and Charities of the City.

The Police gave up some of their days off to supply the labor, and are entitled to credit for doing so.

The Massey-Harris Company very generously ploughed the land twice, free of charge, with a tractor.

Ford motor cars were purchased for the work in 4 Divisions and they have been found useful, even beyond expectations, increasing the mobility of the Officers and Men and partly making up for the deficiency in Beat Patrols.

I recommend that others be purchased for those Divisions requiring them.

2,782 houses were under the special supervision of the Police and 2 were entered.

I attach a statement of the figures for Police Expenditure for the year, including the preliminary estimate.

The amount saved was \$28,010.55, largely due to the decrease in the strength of the Force.

The License Clerk reports that he received \$98,626.04 for the year, which is \$102.21 more than 1916.

I greatly regret to report that the health of Dr. Spragge who has been the Medical Officer in charge of the Force for 46 years has been so impaired as to render his services unavailable for some months.

In view of his exceptional long association with the Force and the valuable work he has done in connection therewith, I would bespeak your most generous consideration.
