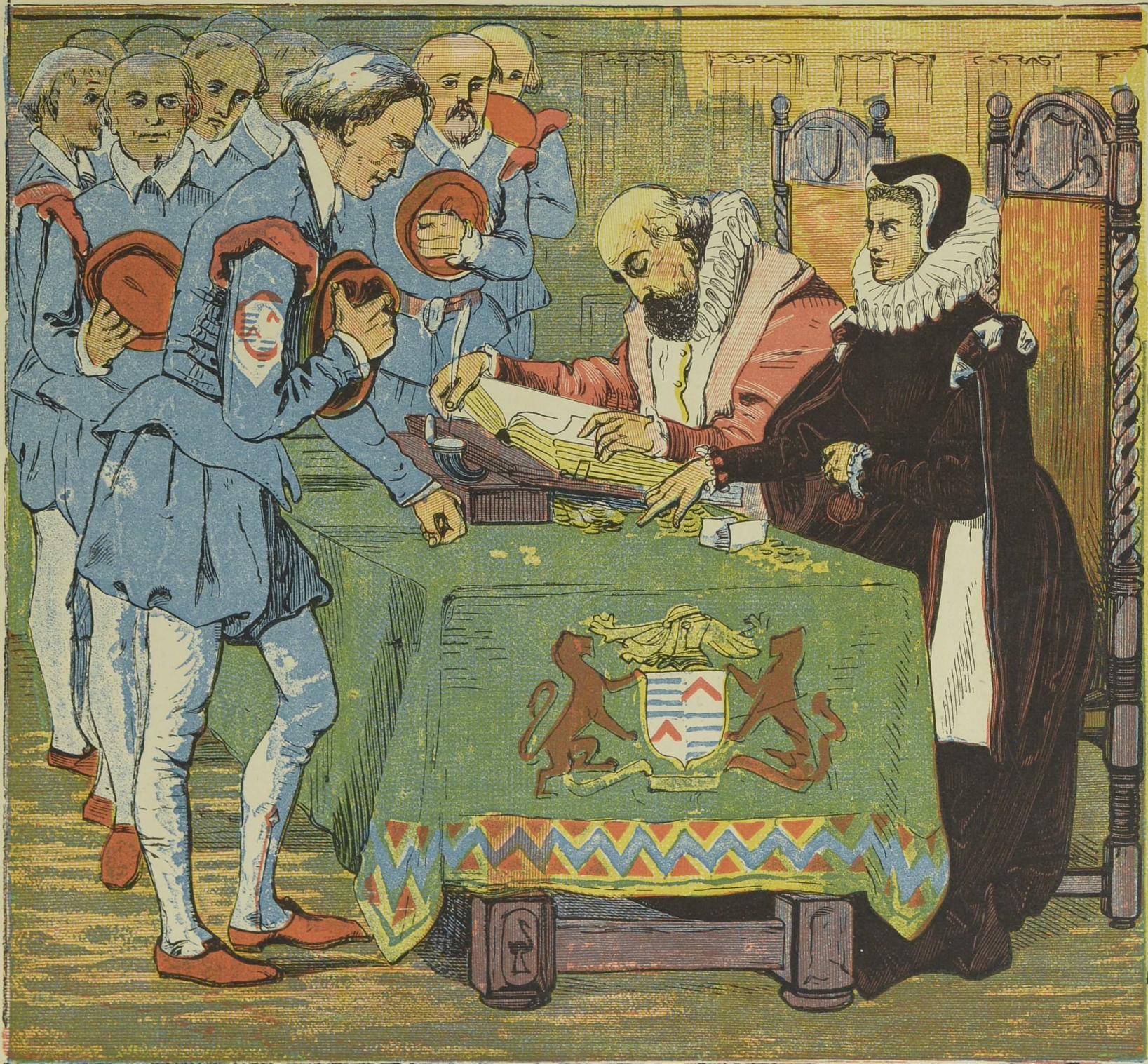

And the Queen's Old Courtier.





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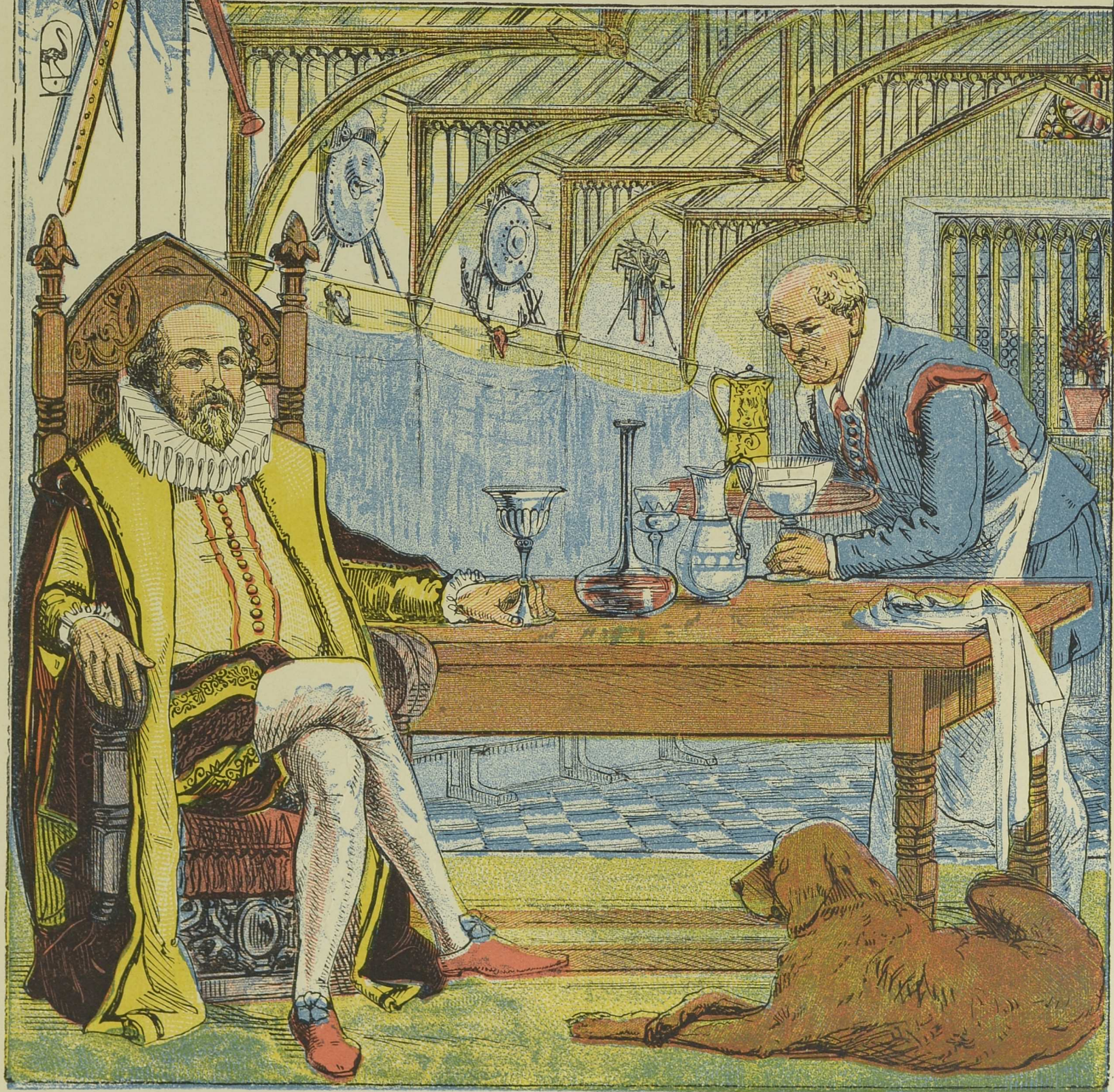
With an old study fill'd full of learned old books,

And the Queen's Old Courtier.

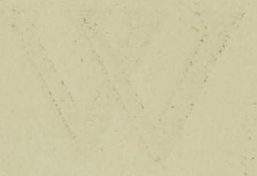


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ith a good old fashion,
