






ON THE STOCKS.

THE LAUNCH.


HE launch of the "George" I went to see;

OFF SHE GOES!




WENT to the mate; I said, "Sir, can You take me on?" said he, "My man, We want a hand like you."

He from the deep our lives can save;


To Him then let us cry."
