




IT is May Cecil's birthday, and good kind Mamma

- To show Nurse her flowers, and with Dolly to play.


- Now the guests are arriving; May mimics Mamma,

- And all shyness forgotten in laughter and fun.








- BY-AND-BYE from the ball-room they hear a glad sound,

- And merrier children there scarcely can be.









- LILY GREY gallops well; little Katie, in blue,







- Now the supper is ready, the tables are spread
