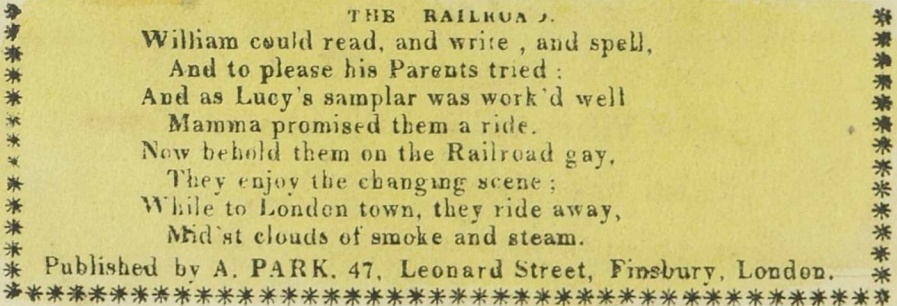

 Mid'st clouds of smoke and steam.

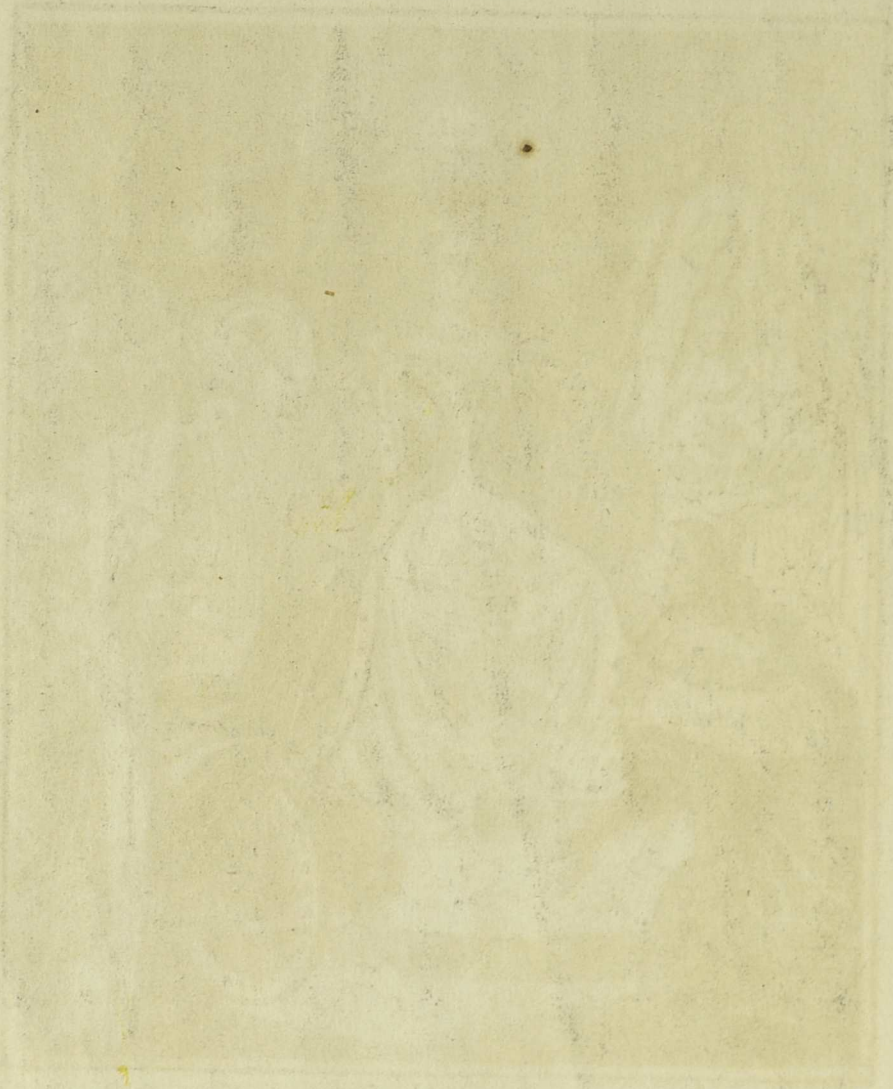

THE LEVEE.

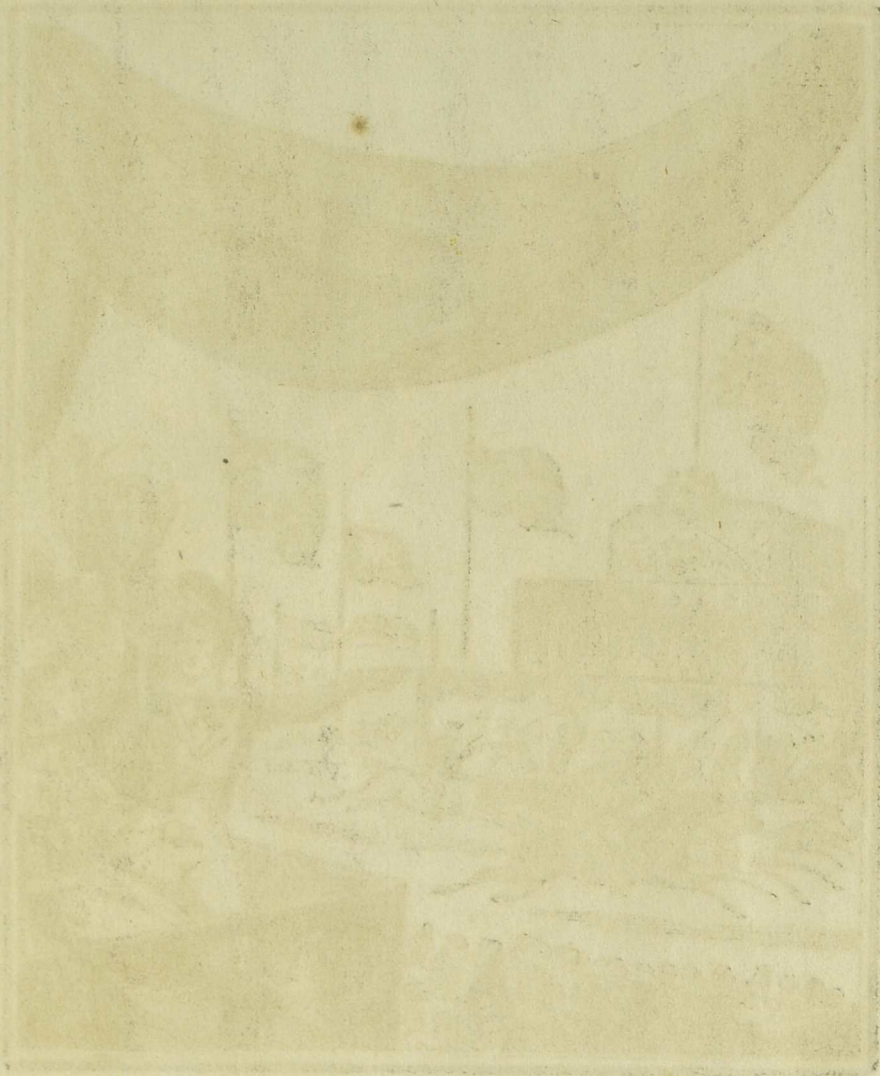

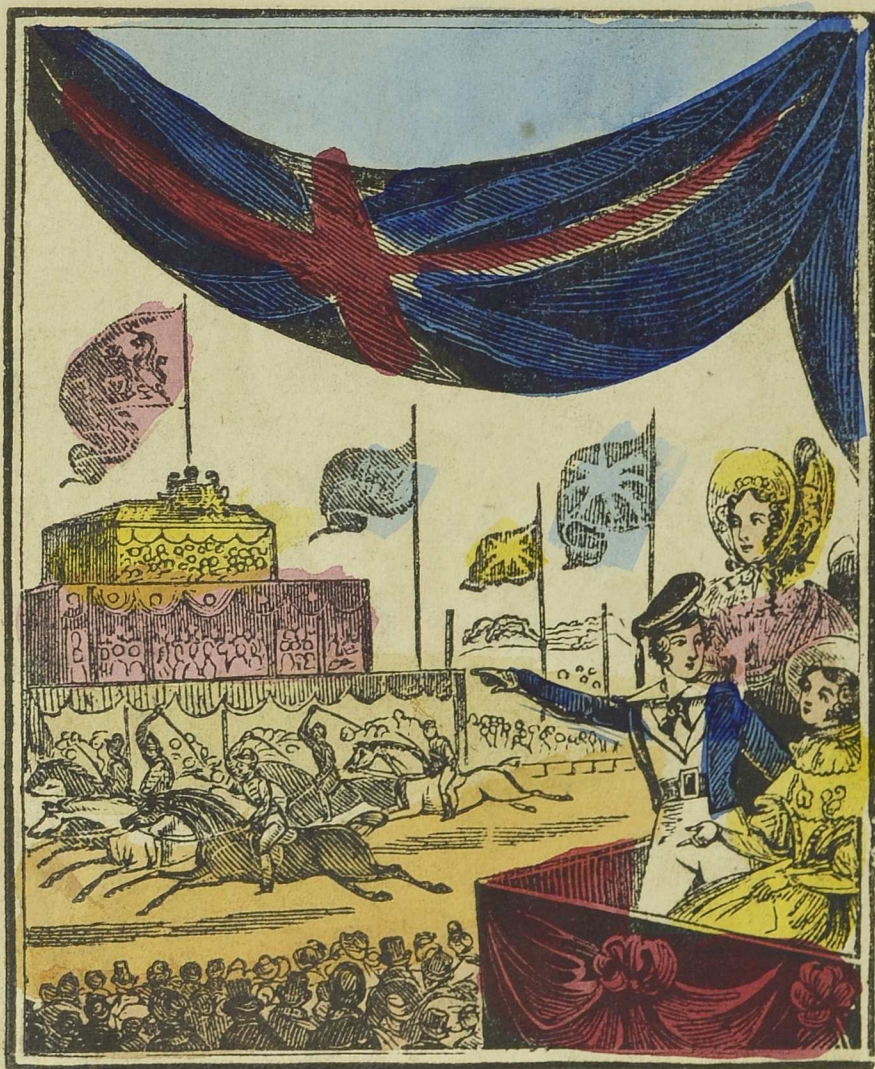

As it would to you, or me.



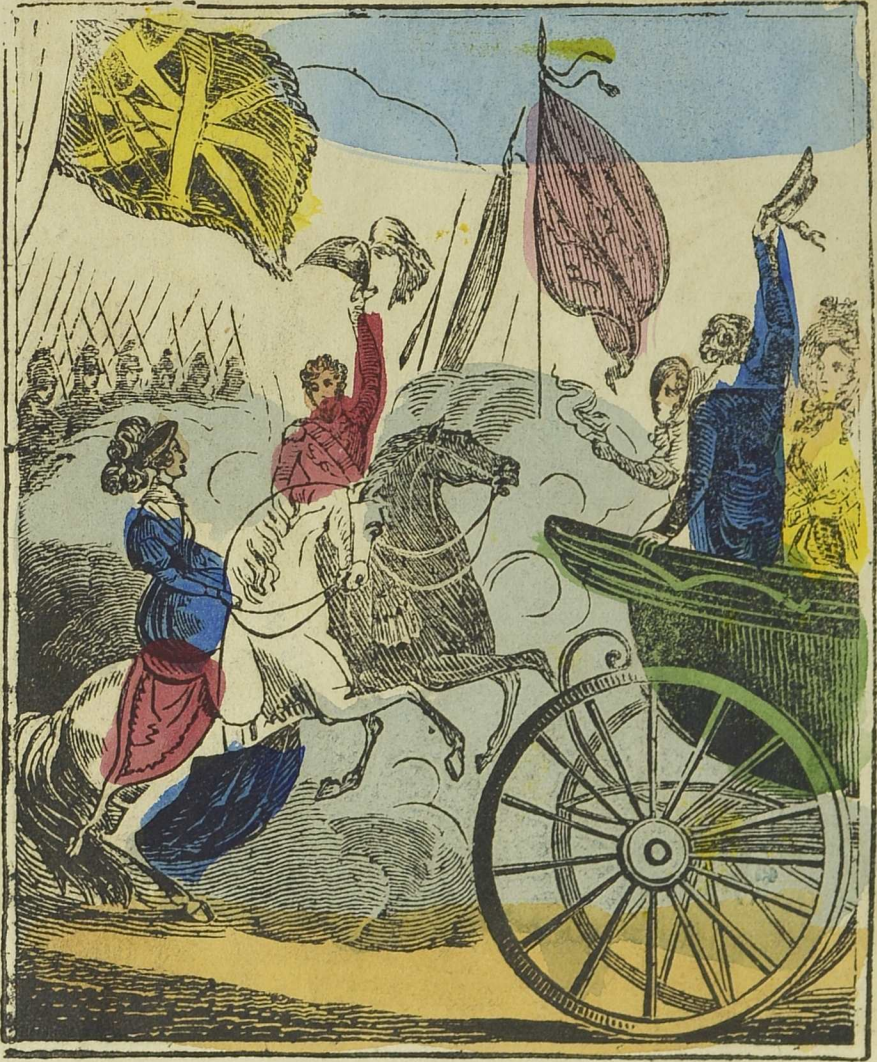

And Generals of renown.



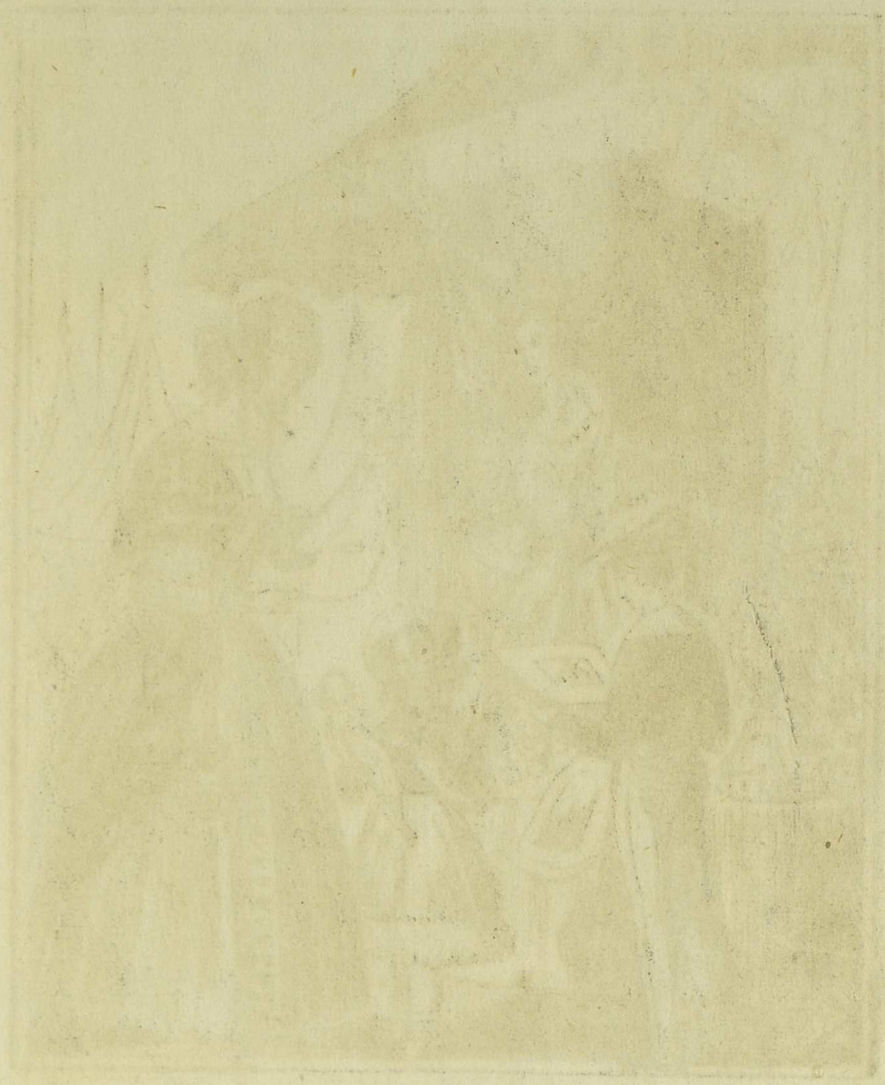
