CABS AND CARTERS.

An Act passed the Common Council on the 5th June, 1843, regulating the fares to be charged and the stands to be occupied by Cabs, Carriages, Coaches, Carts, and other vehicles in the city of Toronto; from which all the information likely to prove serviceable is here extracted:—

Clause 2nd.—Enacts that no person after the 13th day of June, 1842, shall drive any coach, omnibus, cab, carriage, or other vehicle for the carriage of passengers for hire; nor drive any sled, cart, truck, dray, or other carriage for the transportation of any goods, wares, merchandize, fire wood, or any other thing whatever, within the boundaries of the city of Toronto and liberties, without being licensed so to do by the Mayor or two Aldermen: act not to extend to any keeper of a Livery Stable within the said city and liberties who shall not with his vehicles occupy any of the stands hereinafter named.

3rd.—Enacts that the Mayor or any two Aldermen may license as a driver of any such vehicle, any one who is of the age of 18 years and upwards on his giving proper security, and paying for each and every license as follows:

For every coach, omnibus, or carriage drawn by two horses, the sum of *Three Pounds*.

For every cab or other such vehicle, drawn by one horse, the sum of *Two Pounds*.

For every cart, truck, dray, or other such carriage for the transportation of goods, the sum of *One Pound Ten Shillings*.

One such license shall not authorise any person to drive more than one vehicle for any of the above purposes.

4th.—Every person obtaining a license shall execute a bond for thirty pounds, with two sureties of fifteen pounds each, conditioned for the payment and discharge of all penalties for which he shall be liable under this act, and also for the payment of any damages for which he may be liable in law to any person or persons in the exercise of his calling.

5th.—Enacts that no person can assign his license, or permit any other person to drive his vehicle, without permission from the Mayor, which shall be endorsed on the back of the license.

6th.—Enacts that all licences shall be for one year only.

7th.—Appoints the following places only lawful stands for hire coaches, cabs, or such like vehicles in summer, or corresponding vehicles in winter, viz: *Number One*, West Market Place, adjoining the Market buildings, vehicles to be in single line with the horse's heads towards King street. *Number Two*, East side of Church street, between Newgate and King streets, vehicles to be in single line with horse's heads towards King street, and north of the South Church gate on Church street. *Number Three*, the South side of King street, extending west from the west side of Stone's Hotel, vehicles to be in single line with horse's head towards Bay street.

8th.—Enacts that where the above described stands are intersected by cross streets, or ways, or foot-paths into dwelling-houses, shops, offices, or other public or private buildings or yards, corresponding spaces shall be left for the same, that not more than ten vehicles shall occupy the stand on Church street at any one time, all vehicles on arriving at a stand to go at the rear of the line in the order they arrive.

9th.—Makes the following divisions of the city for the purpose of establishing uniform rates for the conveyance of passengers and the transport of goods. *First Division* :—that portion of the city between Graves street on the west, Lot street on the north, and Parliament street on the east.—*Second Division* : That portion between Graves street and Brock street on the west, the northern limits of the city on the north, and the river Don on the east. *Third Division* : That portion of the city and liberties beyond the last described division, and within the limits thereof.

10th.—Premises on both sides of streets forming the above divisions shall be considered in such divisions.

11th.—Enacts the following table of rates and charges :

12th.—Any person not detaining a vehicle more than five minutes is entitled to return in it to the place of departure, but if detaining it more than five minutes and under a quarter of an hour, to pay half fare as return fare; if detained for a quarter of an hour, to pay two thirds as return fare; if detained more than half an hour, optional with driver to charge and be paid at the rate for time:—passengers to be allowed a reasonable weight of luggage free of charge,—a vehicle going from second division into the third, or *vice versa*, or any division to the adjoining one, no higher rate to be charged than the allowance from the first division and *vice versa*.

13th.—Rates in tariff not to supersede any specific agreement parties may make with the drivers.

14th.—Rates to be increased one third after seven in the evening from the 1st Oct. to the 30th April, and after nine in the evening from the 1st May to the 1st Oct.

15th.—Calling a vehicle from any stand and not employing it, driver to be entitled to half of the lowest fare.

16th.—Driver, when required, compelled to exhibit a copy of the tariff rates of conveyance herein mentioned.

17th.—Drivers not to leave their vehicles, needlessly or wantonly flourish their whips, or use any abusive, obscene, or impertinent language.

18th.—Every vehicle, except on moonlight nights, to have two lamps, with their number painted on the glass.

19th.—Every vehicle to have affixed inside conspicuously a card having on it the name of the owner, number of the vehicle, and tariff of rates.

20th.—Makes Front street between West Market Place and Church street, the only lawful stand for carts, trucks, or such like vehicles, which are to be ranged in single line with horses heads towards Church street.

21st.—Every cart or other vehicle to have number of license painted conspicuously on the square of the after part of both shafts.

22nd.—No cartman to neglect or refuse employment when required, unless then actually employed, or the distance he is required to go be beyond the bounds of the city.

23rd.—Any accident happening to any person, vehicle, or any other thing from coming into contact with horse or cart, or any thing on it while moving, driver to stop, and if necessary render assistance, and give his name, place of abode, and number of cart, if required.

24th.—Not to drive on a wharf faster than a walk.

28th.—Tariff of cartage.

29th.—Carters to carry a sufficient load.

30th.—Carters not to loiter about unemployed in any other place than on stand aforesaid.

31st.—Carters to be able-bodied men.

32nd.—No carter or cab-driver to unreasonably or cruelly beat any horse or other animal under his care.

33rd.—Not to cart water or other articles on a Sunday, except in case of fire or other emergency.

40th.—Mayor or any two Aldermen, can suspend or displace any driver of any public vehicle for any misconduct, who cannot be afterwards employed as such without permission from the Mayor for the time being, or the said Alderman by whom he was displaced.

41st.—Persons offending against any provisions of this Act liable to a fine not exceeding five pounds, nor less than two shillings and six-pence, to be levied on goods and chattels in default of payment of fine and costs.

AUGUSTUS STREET :

The west side of Spadina Avenue, 4 streets north of Lot street.

BAY STREET :

2nd street west of Yonge street, on King street, commences at the Bay shore and runs north to Lot street.

BEVERLY STREET :

6th street west of the College Avenue, commences on Lot street and runs north.

BERKELY STREET :

9th street east of Yonge street, on Front street, commences at the Bay and runs north to Lot street.

BROCK STREET :

6th street west of Yonge street, on Front street, commences at the Bay and runs north to Lot street.

BROCK STREET EAST :

Runs from Front street to South Park street, at the east end of the city.

BOND STREET :

2nd street east of Yonge street, on Richmond street, runs north to Shuter street.

BEECH STREET :

East side of Parliament street, third street north of Kingston road.

BATHURST STREET :

8th street west of Yonge street, on Front street, commences at the Bay and runs north to Lot street.

BROAD LANE.

1st street north of King street, east side of York street.

COLBORNE STREET :

The last street on Front street, east of Yonge street, running north to South Park street.

CYPRESS STREET :

2nd street west of Don bridge, runs south to South Park street from Kingston road

CEDAR STREET.

East side of Parliament street, fifth street north of Kingston road

CAROLINE STREET:

6th street east of Yonge street on Front street, commences at the Bay and runs north to Lot street.

CHURCH STREET:

1st street east of Yonge street, south side of King street, commences at the Bay and runs N. to 1st conces. line.

CHURCH LANE:

1st street north of King street, west side of New street, runs west to the English church-yard.

CARLTON STREET:

5th street north of Lot street, east side of Yonge street, facing the College Avenue.

CROOKSHANK'S STREET:

2nd street north of Lot street, east side of Yonge street

CROOKSHANK'S LANE:

On Lot street, running from the barracks north.

CARFRAE PLACE:

1st street south of King street, west side of Yonge street, runs west to Bay street.

COLLEGE AVENUE:

5th street west of Yonge street, on the north side of Lot st. runs N. to the University, and then E. to Yonge st.

COLLEGE STREET:

West of Spadina Avenue, fifth street north of Lot street.

DUMMER STREET:

2nd street west of College Avenue, north side of Lot st.

DUNDAS ROAD:

Runs north from the Toll-gate on Lot street, for about a quarter of a mile and then runs west

DUKE STREET:

1st street north of King street, on the east side of New street, runs east to Parliament street.

DUTCHESS STREET:

2nd street, north of King street, on the east side of New street runs east to Parliament street.

DOURO STREET:

2nd street north of Front street, on the west side of Bathurst street, runs west on the common.

ELIZABETH STREET:

3rd street west of Yonge street, on Lot st. running north.

ELM STREET:

East of Parliament street, 7 strs. north of Kingston rd.

FRONT STREET:

Runs in front of the Bay from the south-west corner of the Market square, west to the garrison, and from the front of the Gaol east to the Don river.

FREDERICK STREET:

5th street east of Yonge street, on Front street, commences at the Bay and runs north to Duke street.

GEORGE STREET:

4th street east of Yonge street, on Front street, commences at the Bay and runs north to the Hon'ble W. Allan's property.

GEORGE STREET, UPPER:

1st street east of Yonge street, north side of Newgate street, runs north to Lot street east.

GOULD STREET:

3rd street north of Lot street, east of Yonge street, runs east to Church street.

GREAVES STREET:

4th street west of Yonge street, on King street, commences at the Bay, and runs North to Lot street.

HOSPITAL STREET:

3rd street north of King street, west side of Yonge street runs west to Peter street.

JAMES STREET EAST:

3rd street north of Kingston road, west side of Sumach street, runs west to Pine street east.

JAMES STREET WEST:

1st street west of Yonge street, north side of Lot street runs north to Macaulay lane.

JOHN STREET:

5th street west of Yonge street, commences at the Bay and runs north to the property of D'Arcy Boulton, Esquire.

JORDAN STREET:

1st street west of Yonge street, south side of King street runs south to Market street.

KING STREET :

Is the main street through the city, commences at Berkely street at the east end of the city, and runs west on to the garrison common.

KINGSTON ROAD :

Commences at Berkely street, at the east end of the city, and runs east to the Don bridge, and from the Don bridge east

LOT STREET :

4th street north of King street, runs west to the Toll-gate, and east to the Don bridge.

LIME STREET :

1st street south of King street, east side Berkeley street, runs east to Parliament street.

MILL STREET, or Windmill street :

10th street east of Yonge street, on Front street, runs south from Kingston road to the Windmill on the Bay shore.

MARKET STREET :

1st street south of King street, west side Church street, runs west to Peter street.

MARKET LANE, OR COLBORNE STREET :

1st street south of King street, east side Church street, runs east to the Market.

MARCH STREET :

3rd street north of King street, west side New street, runs west to Upper George street.

MAGILL STREET :

4th street north of Lot street, east of Yonge street, runs east to Church street.

MACAULAY LANE :

1st street north of Lot street, west side Yonge street, runs west to Sayre street.

MAULE STREET :

1st street north of Lot street, east side Spadina Avenue, runs east to Maria street.

MARIA STREET :

7th street west of College Avenue, north side Lot street.

NEW STREET :

4th street east of Yonge street, north side King street, runs north at the east side of the Market to the property of S. P. Jarvis, Esq.

NEWGATE STREET :

1st street north of King street, on Yonge street, runs west to the garrison common and east to New street.

NIAGARA STREET :

1st street north of Front street, west side of Bathurst street.

OAK STREET :

4th street north Kingston road, east side Parliament street.

ONTARIO STREET :

9th street east Yonge street, north side King street, runs north to Lot street east.

PINE STREET WEST :

4th street north Lot street, west side Yonge street, runs west to Sayre street.

PINE STREET EAST :

1st street west Parliament street, north side Lot street east, runs north.

PARLIAMENT STREET :

10th street east of Yonge street, on Kingston road, commences at the Bay and runs north ; this street from the Bay to the Kingston road is not yet open, it may therefore be counted the 11th street east of Yonge street, and north side of Kingston road.

PARK STREET SOUTH :

1st street south side Kingston road, east side Mill street, runs east to the Don river.

PARK STREET NORTH :

2nd street north of Kingston road, east side of Parliament street, runs east to Sumach street.

PALACE STREET :

Commences at the south east corner of the Market square, and runs east to the Don river, fronting the Bay as far as the new gaol.

PRINCESS STREET :

7th street east of Yonge street, on Front street, commences at the Bay and runs north to Duke street.

PORTLAND STREET :

7th street west of Yonge street, on Front street, commences at the Bay and runs north to Lot street.

PETER STREET :

5th street west of Yonge street, on Front street, commences at the Bay and runs north to Lot street.

RIVER STREET :

1st street west of Don Bridge, running north from Kingston road.

RICHMOND STREET :

2nd street north King street, east side Yonge street, runs east to New street.

ROBERT STREET :

Runs north from College street on Spadina Avenue.

SUMACH STREET :

2nd street west from Don Bridge, running north from Kingston road and south to South Park street.

SPRUCE STREET :

6th street north from Kingston road and east side Parliament street.

STEWART'S LANE.

3rd street east Yonge street, north side King street, runs north to Newgate street.

SCOTT STREET :

1st street east of Yonge street, on Front street, running north.

SHUTER STREET :

1st street north of Lot street, east side Yonge street, runs east to Church street.

ST. ANN STREET :

5th street north Lot street, east side Yonge street, runs east to Church street.

ST. AGNES STREET :

3rd street north Lot street, west side Yonge street, runs west to Sayre street.

ST. PATRICK'S STREET :

1st street north Lot street, east side Spadina Avenue.

ST. ANDREW'S STREET :

2nd street north Lot street, east side Spadina Avenue.

SIMCOE STREET :

1st street south Lot street, west side Brock street.

SAYRE STREET :

4th street west Yonge street, running north from Lot street.

SPADINA AVENUE :

8th street west of Yonge street, running north from Lot street.

TORONTO STREET :

1st street east of Yonge street, north side King street, runs north to Newgate street.

TEMPERANCE STREET :

2nd street north King street, west side Yonge street, runs west to Bay street.

TERAULAY STREET :

2nd street west Yonge street, running north from Lot street.

VICTORIA STREET :

1st street east Yonge street, running north from Lot street east to Shuter street.

WELLINGTON PLACE :

1st street north Front street, running west to Portland street, from Brock street.

WILLIAM STREET :

1st street west College Avenue, running north from Lot street.

WILLIAM STREET—BOULTON'S BLOCK :

3rd street west College Avenue, running north from Lot street.

YONGE STREET :

Commences at Urquhart's Wharf and runs north through the city.

YORK STREET :

3rd street west Yonge street, on King street, commences at the Bay and runs north to Lot street.

MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION.

“TORONTO signifies, in Indian language, a place of meeting. “And it is not improbable that the spot once called *Little York*, now the City of Toronto, was a chosen spot for the “Courts and Councils, or rather the Council Fires, of the “Aborigines.”

The city of Toronto, formerly called the town of Little York, was incorporated under the Act 4th Wm. IV. chap. 23, passed by the Legislature of Upper Canada, 6th March, 1834, intituled “An Act to extend the limits of the town of York, “to erect the said town into a city, and to incorporate it “under the name of The City of Toronto.”

* The reasons for incorporating the town of York, and altering its name, are recited in the preamble.

The 1st clause repeals all such acts, and portions of acts likely to interfere with the operations of this act, so far as they relate to the city of Toronto.

2nd. Limits of the city and liberties, commencing at the distance of one chain, on a course south 16 degrees east, from the south-westerly corner of lot No. 2, in the 1st concession from the bay, in the township of York; thence southerly, in the direction of the side-line between lots 2 and 3 in that concession, to the distance of 500 feet from the point at which the said line intersects the margin of the water on the shore of lake Ontario; thence westerly through the waters of lake Ontario, following the curvatures of the shore and keeping always 500 feet from the margin of the water, till the point is attained, that is 500 feet from the north-western-most point of the peninsula forming the harbor; then across the water to a point where a line drawn southerly from the north-easterly corner of Park lot No. 29, in the direction of the easterly boundary line of the said Park lot, intersects the margin of the water on the shore of lake Ontario; thence northerly along the said line so drawn, to the allowance for road between the Park lots and the 2nd concession from the bay; thence easterly along the said north side of the allowance for road to the easterly shore or waters edge of the river Don; thence southerly along the easterly edge of the river Don to the point where the waters edge intersects the southerly side of the allowance for road in front of the first concession; thence easterly along the south side of the said allowance for road in front of the said first concession to the place of beginning, except the lands that have been conveyed to the University of King's College.

* The entire act would occupy too much space in a work of this nature, it is therefore here presented in a condensed form.

3rd. Limits of the City, commencing at the distance of 1 chain on a course north 74 degrees east from the south east angle of Park lot No. 3, in the township of York ; thence south 16 degrees east upon a continuation of the allowance for road between Park lots Nos. 2 and 3 to the waters edge of the bay in front of the town of York ; thence westerly along the waters edge of the said bay to the point at which the westerly limit of the allowance for road between Park lots Nos. 18 and 19 in the said township of York being produced southerly intersects the said waters edge ; thence northerly in the direction of the said westerly limit of the said allowance for road to the distance of 400 yards north of the northerly boundary line of Lot Street ; thence easterly parallel to Lot Street to the easterly boundary line of the allowance for road between Park lots Nos. 2 and 3, thence south 16 degrees east along the easterly boundary line of the said allowance for road 400 yards more or less to the place of beginning ; and that the said city be divided into five wards, to be called respectively St. George's, St. Patrick's, St. Andrew's, St. David's, and St. Lawrence.

4th. St. David's Ward, all that part of the city north of the north side of King Street, and east of the West side of Yonge Street.

5th. St. Andrew's Ward, all that part of the city between the north side of Lot Street and the north side of King Street, and west of the west side of Yonge Street.

6th. St. Patrick's Ward, all that part of the city north of the north side of Lot Street and west of the west side of Yonge Street.

7th. St. Lawrence Ward, all that part of the city south of the north side of King Street, and east of the west side of Yonge Street.

8th. St. George's Ward, all that part of the city south of the north side of King Street, and west of the west side of Yonge Street.

9th. Attaches the liberties immediately adjacent to each ward, to such adjacent ward.

10th. City by act of Common Council may erect any part of the liberties into outer wards, such outer wards, not to exceed five in number.

11th. The liberties of any ward, when it has as many inhabitants, and contains as much assessed property as the smallest ward at the first assessment after the passing of this act, must be erected into an outer ward, by proclamation of the Mayor.

12th. From the date of the proclamation such part of the liberties to be a separate ward, and have all the privileges of a ward, but not to return members to the Common Council until the time of the next city election.

13th. All that portion of the liberties (commonly called the bay) to constitute the Port of Toronto.

14th. The inhabitants of the said city to form a body corporate and politic by the name of the *City of Toronto*, to have a Common Seal with power to change the same, to be capable of suing and being sued, and of purchasing and holding estate, real and personal, and of giving and receiving bonds, judgments, &c. &c.

15th. Two Aldermen and two Common Councilmen to be chosen for each ward, who shall choose the Mayor from among the Aldermen, in case of equality of votes that Alderman who is highest assessed to give the casting vote.

16th. Qualification for an Alderman; to have been a resident householder for one year next before the election, to be so resident at the time of election, and to be possessed of real property within the city or liberties, rated at two hundred pounds.

17th. Qualification for a Common Councilman the same as that for an Alderman, except the property, which is one hundred and fifty pounds including additional fire-places.

18th. That the Aldermen and Common Councilmen of the said city shall be elected respectively by the majority of votes of such persons being male inhabitant householders within the ward for which the election shall be holden, or the liberties attached thereto, as shall be possessed at the time of the election, either in freehold or as tenant for a term of years or from year to year of a town lot or dwelling house, within the said ward or liberties; *provided always* that a portion of a house in which any inhabitant shall reside as a householder, and not as a boarder or lodger, and having a distinct communication with the street by an outer door, shall be considered a dwelling house within the meaning of this clause: *and provided also*, that no person shall vote at any such election who has not been a resident inhabitant within the said city or liberties thereof for the period of twelve calendar months, and who has not resided within the ward for which the election shall be holden, or the liberties attached thereto, for the period of three calendar months next before the election.

19th. The Mayor, Aldermen, and Common Councilmen, and voters at any election for city affairs, to be natural born or naturalised subjects of Her Majesty, of the full age of twenty-one.

20th. The legislative power of the city, is vested in the Mayor, Aldermen, and Common Councilmen in council.

21st. That all legislative acts of the said city are to be expressed as enacted by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commonality of the City of Toronto, in Common Council assembled.

22nd. The city shall have power to make and alter any laws for regulating streets, roads, walks, and highways, to prevent cattle, &c. running at large, to tax and regulate dogs, to prevent encumbering and injuring the streets, &c., to prevent selling by retail in the public highways, any meat,

vegetables, fruits, &c., to prevent the sale of intoxicating drinks to children, to prevent immoderate riding, driving, or riding or driving horses or cattle on side walks, to regulate wharves, and to prevent obstructions in the harbor, to regulate and prevent fishing, fishing lights, bathing, tipling houses, &c., to enforce observance of the Sabbath, to regulate or prevent public shows, to prevent cruelty to animals, billiard tables, theatres, to regulate auctioneers, butchers, cartmen, and cartage, hawkers and pedlars, puppet shows, &c., firing guns, fire-works, slaughter-houses, tanneries, nuisances, taverns, places of public entertainment, the sale of hay, fish, country produce, coal, cordwood, juts, lime, bread, vegetables, fruits, &c., to regulate markets, party walls, chimneys, fire companies, dangerous manufactures, alms-houses, gaols, &c., to appoint and remove city officers, police watchmen, to inflict penalties for refusing to serve in municipal offices, to regulate voters, to tax the property in the city provided that such tax shall never exceed in one year four pence in the pound on the assessed value of property lying and being within the limits of the city, or two pence in the pound upon the property lying or being within the liberties, to make all laws for the city not repugnant with the Statutes of the Province, provided that the penalty for the breach of any city law shall not exceed ten pounds or thirty days imprisonment, and that the fine for refusing to fill any municipal office shall not exceed ten pounds.

23rd. The city shall have the power to contract or widen the streets.

24th. The city shall have power to borrow money, not exceeding the revenue to accrue within the next five years.

25th. Two Aldermen and two Common Councilmen to be elected for each ward.

26th. The Mayor is to hold his office from the first Monday in February to the same day in the following year.

27th. Place of election for any ward to be in said ward ; return to be made to the clerk of the city on the same day.

28th. The Aldermen and Common Councilmen to be chosen annually, on the second Tuesday in January, five days notice to be given of any election.

29th. The Aldermen and Common Councilmen to hold office from the first Monday in February till the day before the first Monday in February following.

30th. The Mayor to be chosen on the Thursday following the choosing of Aldermen and Councilmen—and to enter upon his office the first Monday of February following.

31st. Persons disqualified to be elected or to vote at elections ; officer holding election may give a casting vote.

32nd. Persons not compelled to serve any municipal office : Ministers of any religious persuasion, the Judge of Court of Queen's Bench, Her Majesty's Attorney and Solicitor General, all practising Physicians, and Surgeons.

33rd. Until registry be made, voters may be required to take the oath of qualification.

34th. After registry, voters to produce certificate of qualification, and if required, to take the oath.

35th. Persons swearing falsely, guilty of perjury.

36th. Ward elections.

37th. Vacancies occurring in wards, by death, resignation, &c., persons to be elected for remainder of term.

38th. The Mayor to swear in Aldermen and Councilmen.

39th. Majority of Aldermen and majority of Councilmen to form a quorum.

40th. Mayor, or an Alderman in his absence, to preside in council and give casting vote.

41st. Common Council to make rules and judge of the qualification of its members.

42nd. A journal to be kept of the proceedings. All discussions relating to imposing fines, &c., to be public.

43rd. Resolutions as to improvements, appropriations of public money, &c., to be printed and published eight days before adoption.

44th. Yeas and nays to be taken on all such resolutions.

45th. Council to have power to punish its members.

46th. No measure for raising or appropriating money, &c. to pass, until printed and published eight days.

47th. Rules imposing penalties to be published in U. C. Gazette and other papers.

48th. Laws of the city to be signed by the Mayor, and to be entered in a book for public inspection, at all reasonable hours, on payment to the clerk of sixpence.

49th. Four sessions of the Common Council to commence on the third Monday in February, May, August, and November in each year.

50th. The Mayor may call special meetings, and in case of his death, another to be elected.

51st. Salary of the Mayor not less than one hundred, and not more than five hundred pounds.

52nd. Court of Common Council to be a court of Record.

53rd. Chamberlain, and High Bailiff to be appointed on the third Monday of February in each year.

54th. Clerk of the Common Council to be appointed; and to be keeper of the city records.

55th. Clerk of the market, assessors, collectors, and other officers to be appointed.

56th. Rates, and assessments unpaid ten days after demand, may be levied by distress, by warrant of the Mayor or any Alderman, on oath of demand, and neglect.

57th. Constables, assessors and collectors, to be appointed from time to time by the council, and remunerated as to them shall seem meet.

58th. Per centage to chamberlain.

59th. Statements of accounts to be published annually.

60th. Salary to the high bailiff as the court shall direct.

61st. Clerk of the Common Council to be clerk of the Peace within the city.

62nd. Assessors to make returns of assessment rolls to the clerk of the Common Council.

63rd. Collectors to give security to the satisfaction of the Council.

64th. High Bailiff, and Constables not bound to attend other than the city Courts, and the Courts of Assize for the Home District.

65th. High Bailiff and Constables bound to obey the Mayor and Aldermen.

66th. The Mayor and Aldermen to be Justices of the Peace in the said city.

67th. Justices of the Home District to have no jurisdiction within the city except holding the Quarter Sessions.— Warrants of the Justices of the Home District, and of the Mayor and Aldermen, to have effect all over the district.

68th. To License Stable keepers, and keepers of Hackney Coaches, &c.

69th. Inhabitants of the city competent witnesses in trials affecting the Corporation.

70th. Recovery and application of penalties.

71st. Board of Health to be appointed with all the powers conferred by 3rd. Wm. IV, chap. 48.

72nd. Duties of the Clerk of the Market.

73rd. City to have power to establish licences and regulate ferries to the peninsula.

74th. Rogues and vagabonds to be committed to the gaol or house of correction.

75th. Salaries of the city officers, except the Mayor and Chamberlain's, to be at the discretion of the Council.

76th. Mayor and Aldermen to license Innkeepers.

77th. Mayor to hold a Court, assisted by the Aldermen or any of them, to be called the Mayor's Court of the City of Toronto.

78th. The Mayor's Court to have the same criminal jurisprudence as the Courts of Quarter Sessions of the province.

79th. The meeting of the Court to be the second Monday after the opening of the four regular sittings of the Court of Common Council in each year.

80th. Grand Jury to consist of twenty-four.

81st. Petit Jury to consist of not less than thirty-six nor more than sixty.

82nd. Qualification of Grand and Petit Jurors to be the same as in any court of this province.

83rd. Clerk of the Common Council to be Clerk of the Mayor's Court.

84th. Authority of the Grand Jury of the Mayor's Court the same power and authority over offences committed in the city and liberties, as that of the Grand Jury of the Quarter Sessions.

85th. Form of proceedings in the Mayor's Court to be the same as in the Court of Quarter Sessions.

86th. Court may order costs to be paid out of city funds.

87th. Market Square vested in the city for public uses.

88th. City liable for payment of the debt due, contracted under the authority of the Magistrates of the Home District for the erection of the Market buildings.

89th. The inhabitants of the city and liberties, exempt from serving on Juries at any other than the City Court, and the Courts of Oyer and Terminer and General Gaol Delivery and Nisi Prius for the Home District.

90th. City Officers and members of the Fire Companies exempt from Militia duty.

91st. Officers refusing to take the oath of office liable to be proceeded against for refusing to serve.

92nd. Sixty years of age an exemption from serving in office.

93rd. Gaol and Court House of the Home District to be Gaol and Court House for the City.

94th. Period for the first election of the Aldermen and Common Councilmen under this act.

95th. Non-election of the Mayor, at the time fixed, not to forfeit city charter; election may take place within a month.

96th. City to return one Member to Provincial Parliament.*

97th. City of Toronto to be understood wherever the name of York occurs in any Act of Parliament, Deed, &c.



When Bouchette, the Surveyor General, under the orders of Governor Simcoe, then residing at Niagara, surveyed, in 1793, York harbor; the scite of Toronto was a covey for wild fowl. Two Mississauga families were the only inhabitants; and when the Governor paid a visit in the following summer to determine on the future Capital of Upper Canada, his residence was a canvas-covered dwelling. The census of the city in the year of its incorporation (1834) was 9,254, and last year it had increased to 15,436, while this year it is estimated that it will be between 17, and 18,000, so that it has nearly doubled its population in the short space of nine years. It now contains several Banking, Insurance, and other Companies, churches, and chapels &c., a college and university, most excellent markets supplied with the best of meat and vegetables at very cheap rates. The streets are spacious and well laid out, intersecting each other at right angles, are well lighted with gas, and before the expiration of this year every house can be supplied with the purest water from the water-works now nearly completed.

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

A Letter with one enclosure is double ; and with two or more, if it does not weigh an ounce, is treble. Letters weighing an ounce are chargeable with four single rates ; and for each quarter of an ounce above that weight, a single rate is charged.

Letters mailed for the United States must be paid to the lines, and those intended for Europe *via* New York or Boston, must be paid to those places respectively.

The postage on letters intended for England to go by the Halifax Steamers, can be paid or not, at the option of the sender ; due notice is always given at the Post Office, and in the public Papers, of the time of closing the mail by these steamers. The mail for them that goes by way of Boston, (and on which the postage to Boston must be paid,) is in general made up about a week after that which goes by Halifax.

Newspapers, Magazines, and other Printed Papers not subject to letter postage, must be paid at the time of mailing at the rate of one penny per sheet, or for every 16 pages ; otherwise they will be charged full letter postage.

Newspapers published in the Colony can be sent to Great Britain either by way of Halifax, Boston, or New York ; by Halifax they are free of postage if sent within seven days from the date of publication,—by New York, or Boston, the sender must pay two pence on each paper. It is recommended that the name and address of the party for whom they are intended should be written on the margin of the Paper as well as on the wrapper or cover in which they are enclosed ; this ensures their delivery in case of the cover becoming destroyed ; but it is to be particularly observed that newspapers intended to go free *via* Halifax, must have no *mark*, *initials*, or date on the directions, but the address *merely*, or they will be chargeable with full letter postage.
