 pea :

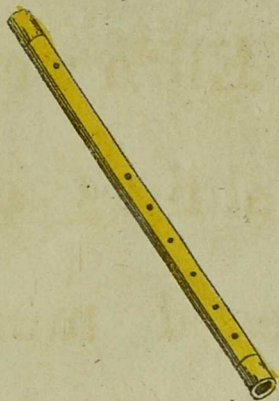
“ Sweet is the blossom on the

 to see,

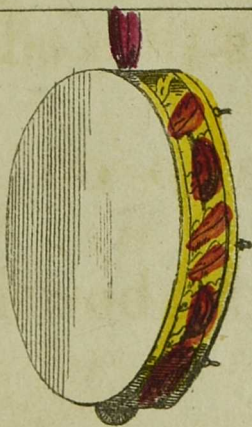
But sweeter is my pretty pea.

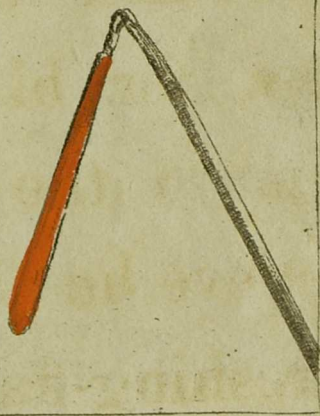
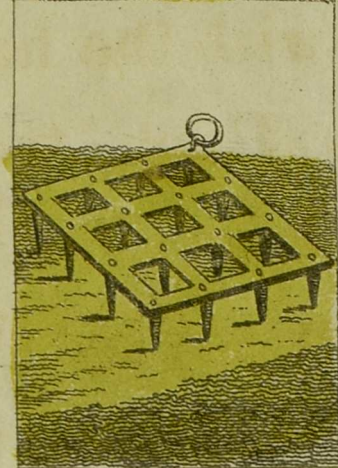
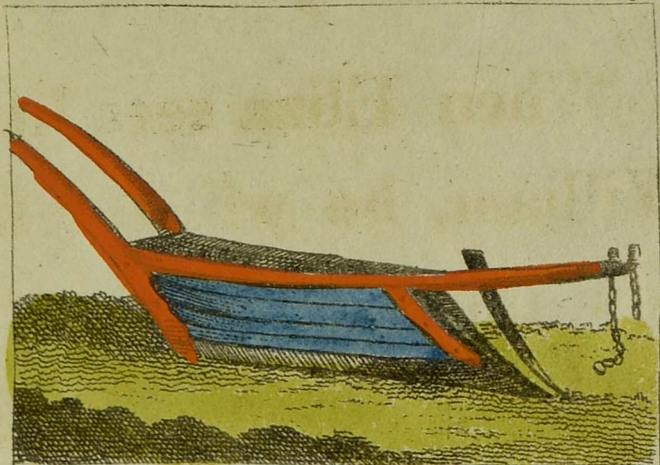
Cottage by Moonlight .

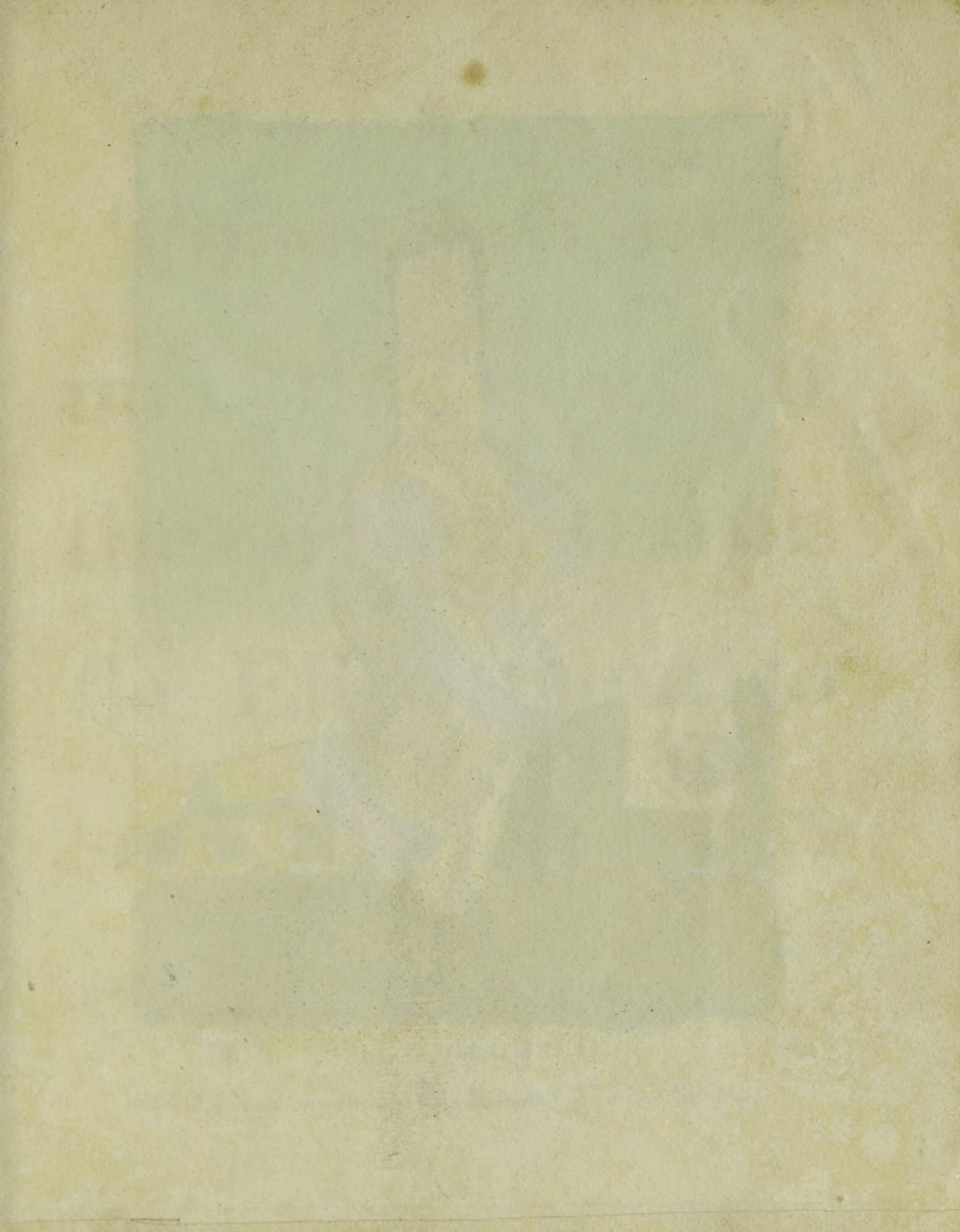

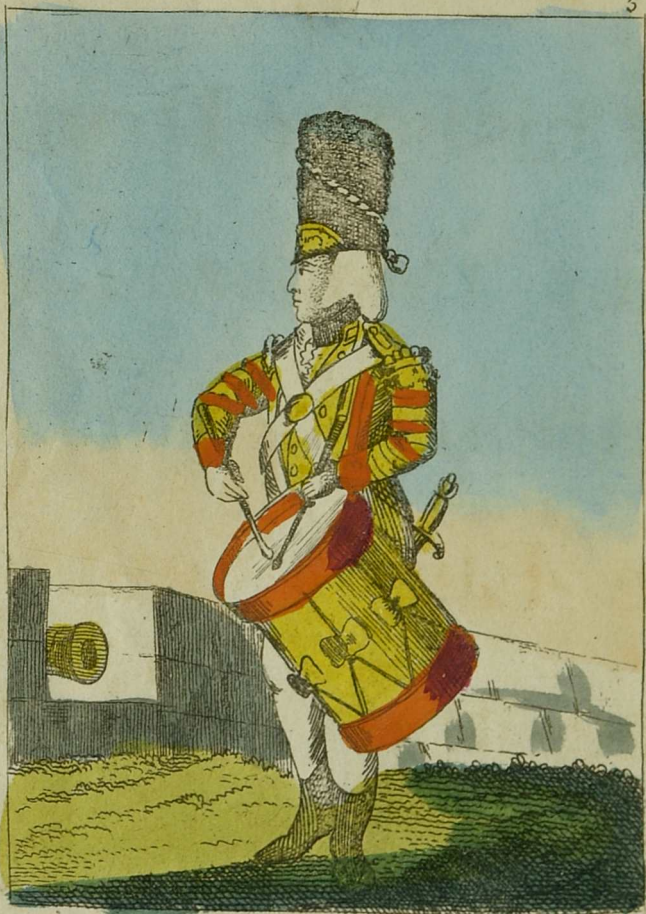


Harrow

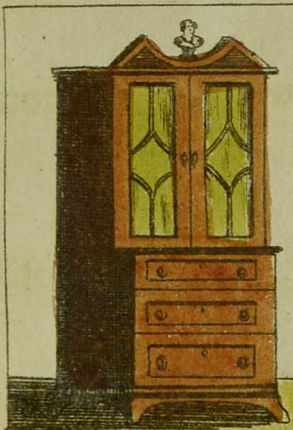

 You may your chesnuts roast with ease.

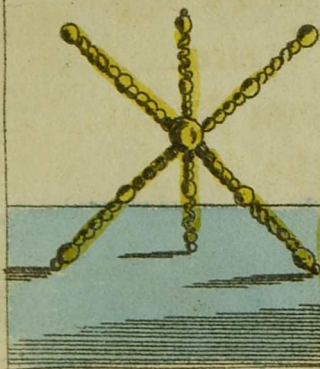
At tea, sometimes Eliza dear,

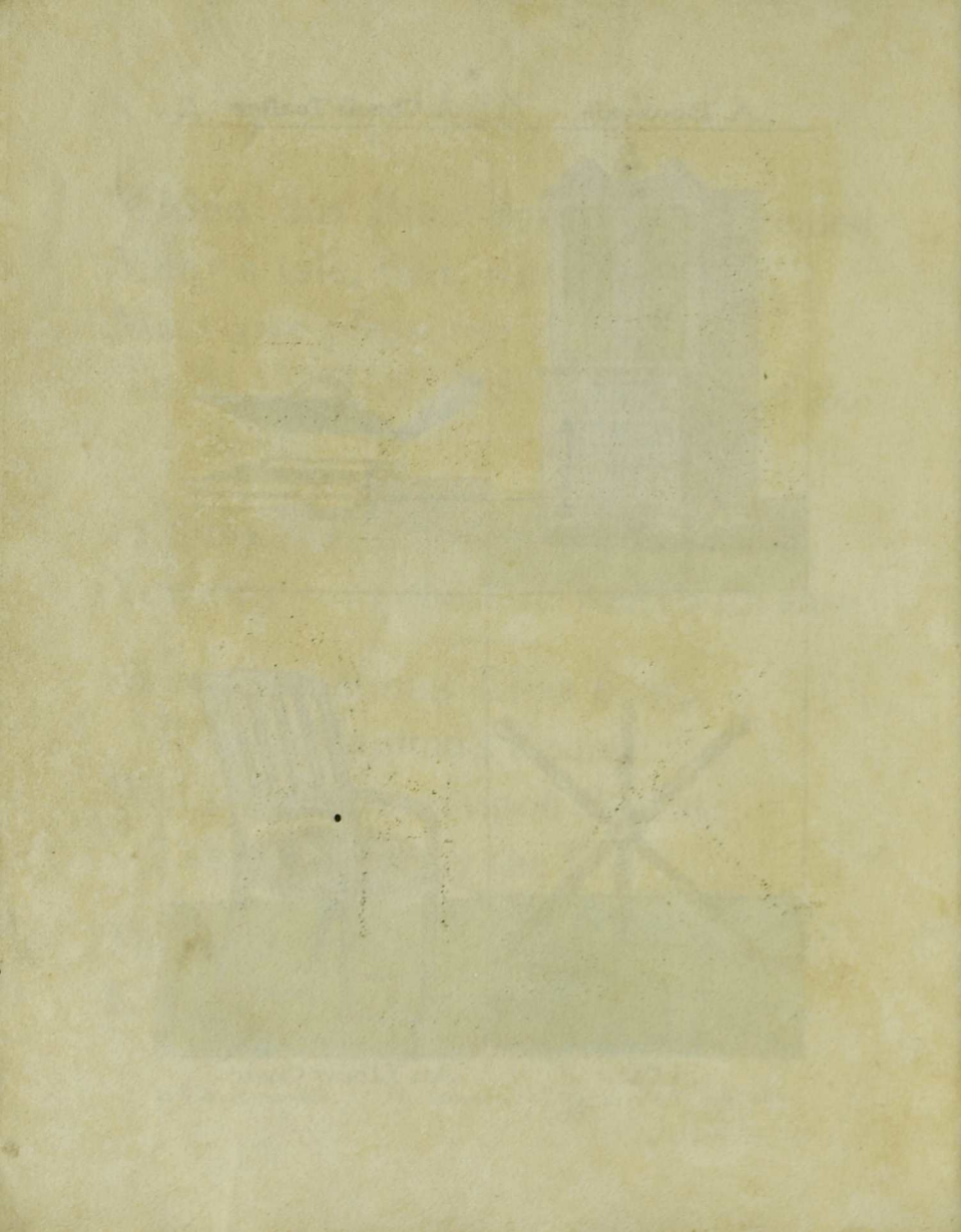
