TOWNSHIP OF YORK.

FIRST MEETING.

Council Chamber, January 14th., 1907.

The members elected to fill the offices of Reeve, Deputy-Reeves and Councillor for the year 1907, namely: George S. Henry, Reeve; John T. Watson, 1st Deputy-Reeve; Robert Barker, 2nd Deputy-Reeve; Jeremiah Nelson, Jr., 3rd Deputy-Reeve; James W. Jackson, Councillor; met at 11 o'clock a.m. The statutory declaration of office and qualification of each of the members being duly filed with the Clerk, the Reeve took the chair and declared the Council for 1907 duly organized and open for business.

The Reeve to be ex-officio member of all committees. Carried.

No. 3074. Barker—Jackson.—Resolved that in the matter of the municipal elections, held January 7th, 1907, the Treasurer be and he is hereby instructed to pay the Deputy Returning Officers the sum of six dollars each; the Poll Clerks the sum of two dollars each, and the owner or tenant of each polling place the sum of four dollars; also, the Town of North Toronto ten dollars for use of Town Hall for nomination meeting and receiving returns on the night of election, and the corporate seal be hereto affixed. Carried.

No. 3075. Watson—Jackson.—Resolved that the Treasurer be and is hereby instructed to give tax receipts for part of lot 14, plan 743, upon an assessment of four dollars instead of forty dollars per foot frontage; also on assessment of No. 2871½, Div. 3, on an assessment of 600—instead of \$1,000—on account of errors in assessment, and the seal of the corporation be hereto affixed. Watson—Nelson.—Whereas it appears from representation made to this Council that the Toronto Suburban Railway Company has not, according to its agreement with the Township of York, kept its rolling stock in a proper state of repair, and has not equipped its road with cars of modern design nor maintained the roadbed between the rails and for eighteen inches on either side as required by the agreement, and whereas the said company has paid no attention to these complaints, though frequently laid before the company, and whereas at a meeting of ratepayers of the Township of York, held at Mount Dennis on the 28th of February last, a resolution was unanimously passed calling upon this Council to bring this matter before the Railway and Municipal Board for Ontario; now therefore be it resolved that the Solicitor for the Tp. of York be and he is hereby instructed to make application before the Railway and Municipal Board for the Province of Ontario for an order directing the Toronto Suburban Railway Company to equip and maintain its line in accordance with its agreement with this Township, and with the statutes covering electric railways. Carried.

No. 25 in the Township of York for the issue of debentures for the sum of \$5,000 for the purpose of extending the school grounds in the said section be granted and that the Solicitors be and are hereby instructed to prepare a by-law for the issue of debentures for the sum of \$20,000 to cover the above mentioned application and the former application of the said trustees for the issue of \$15,000 for the purposes of extending the school accommodation in the said section, and that the seal of the corporation be hereto attached. Carried.
