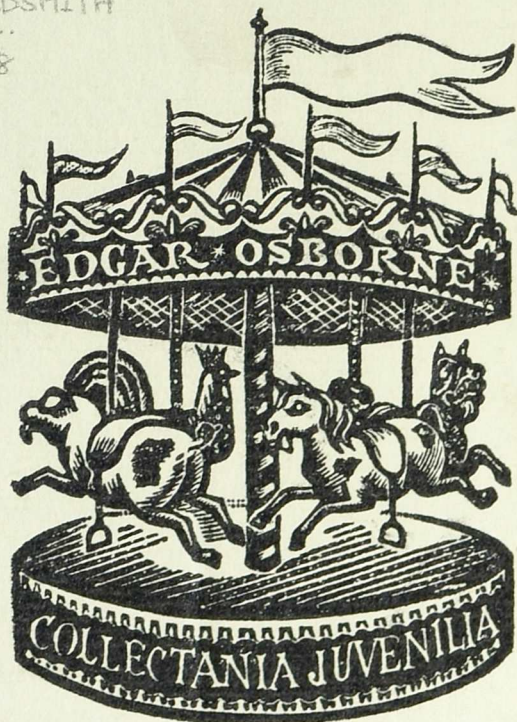

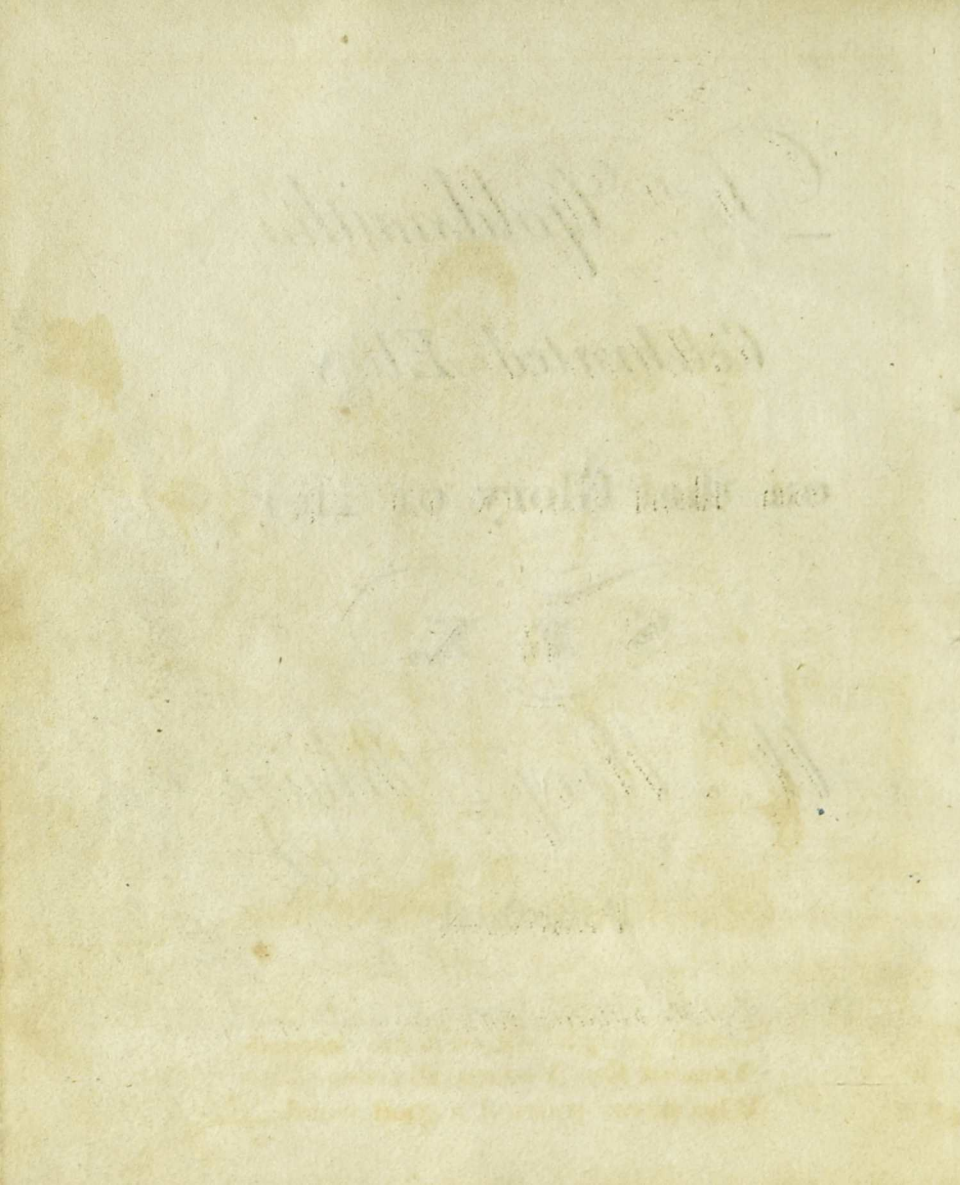

She never slumber'd in her Pew, —

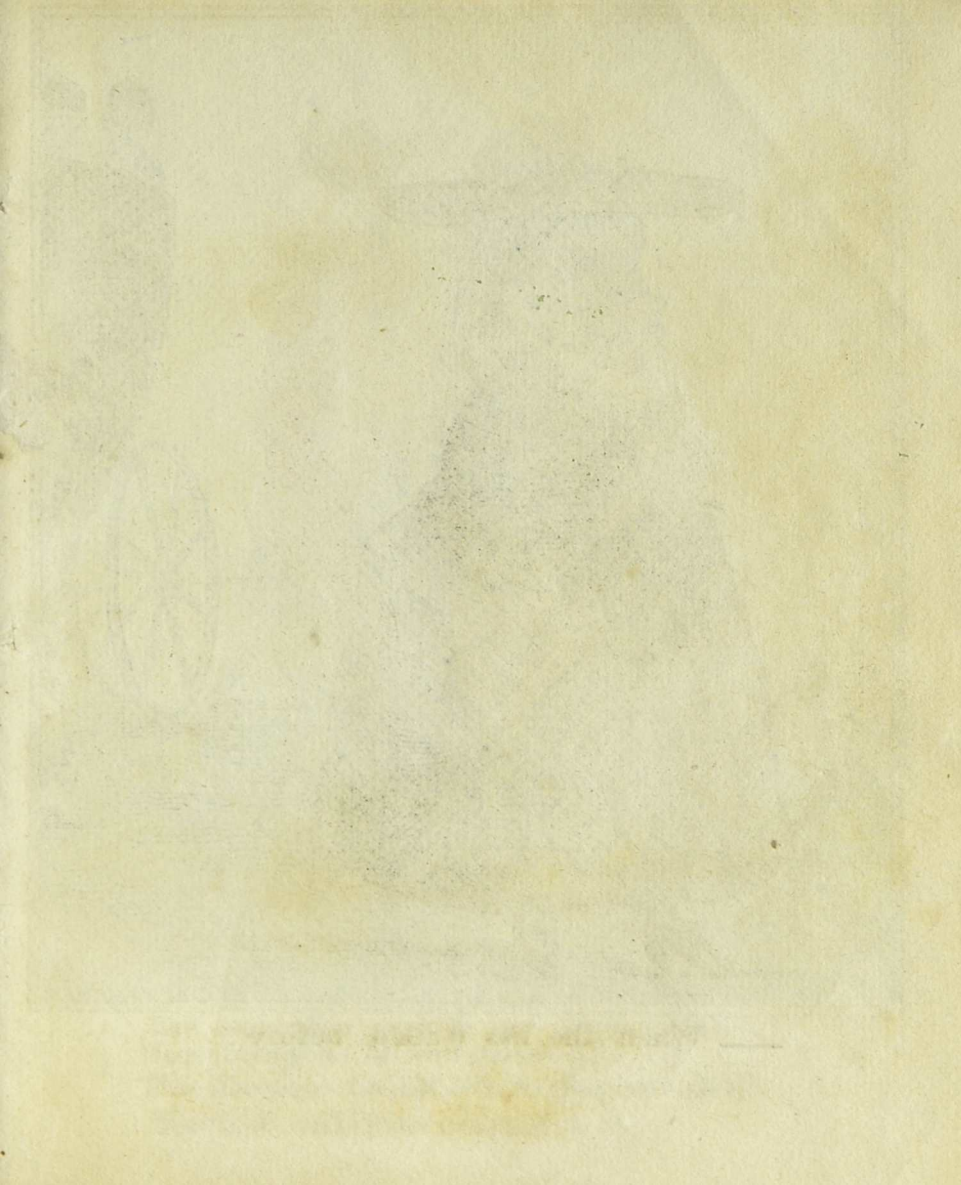




— But when she shut her eyes.
