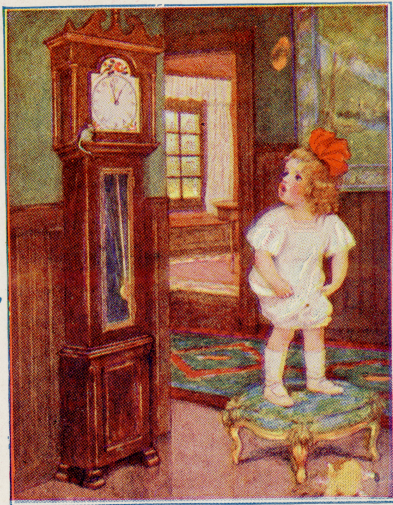
“Well, you see, sir,

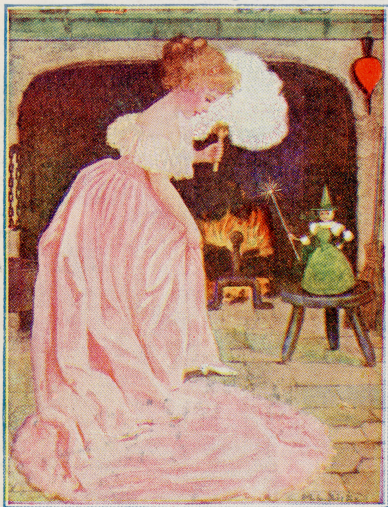

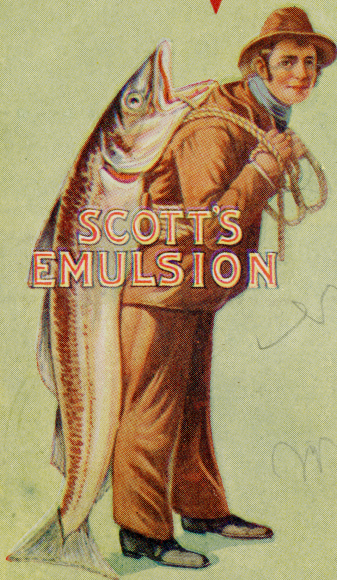

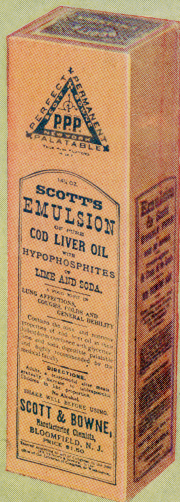
