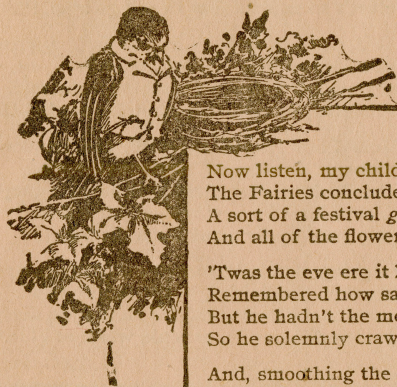

Be it golden and purple, or pink, white or blue."

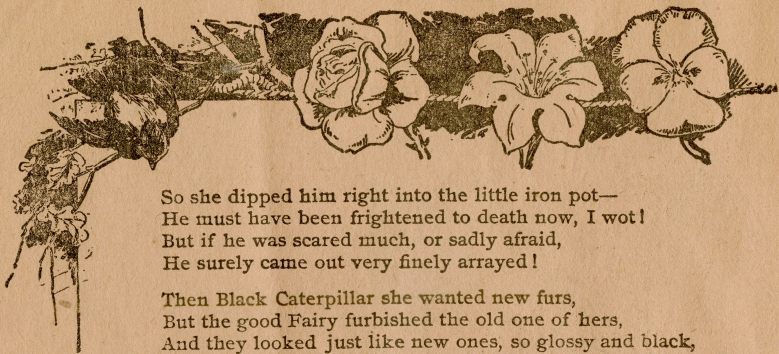
'Twas darkness without when they reached her great cave,

He surely came out very finely arrayed!

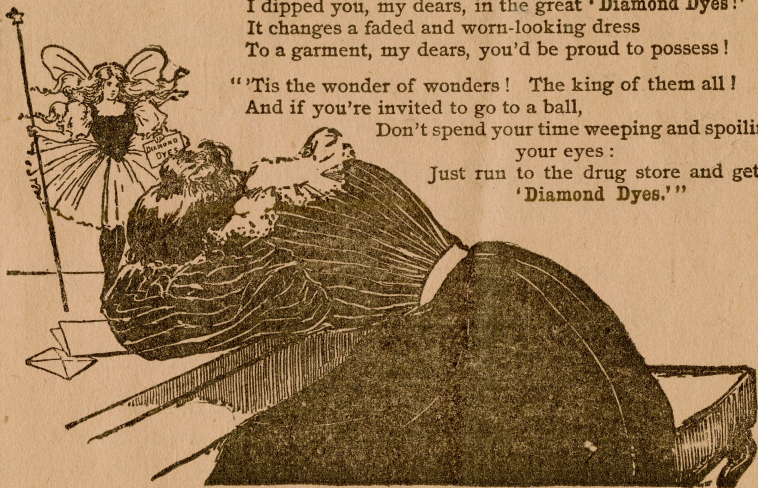
Then Black Caterpillar she wanted new furs,
