chicks.

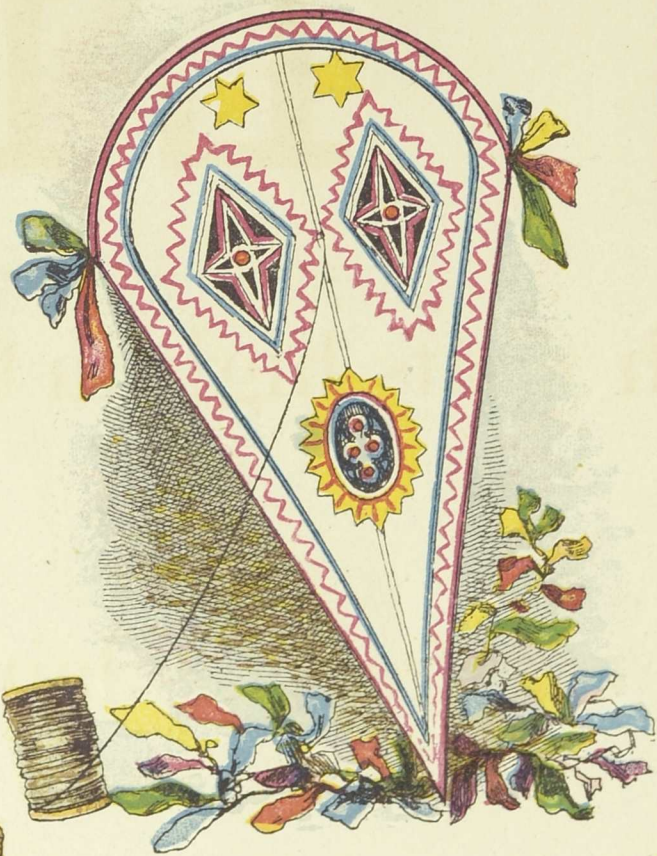

N is a NEST, where six pretty eggs lie.

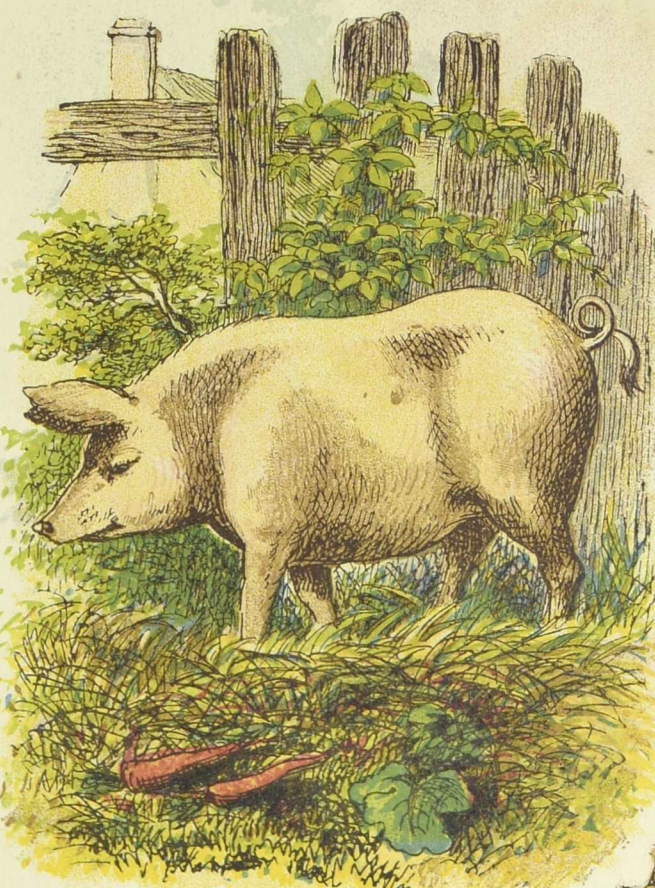
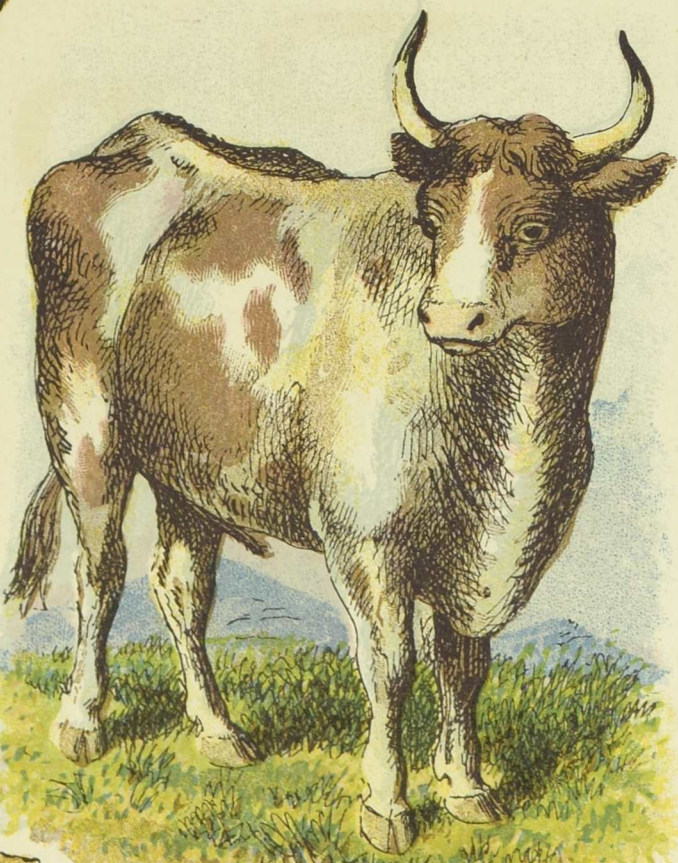
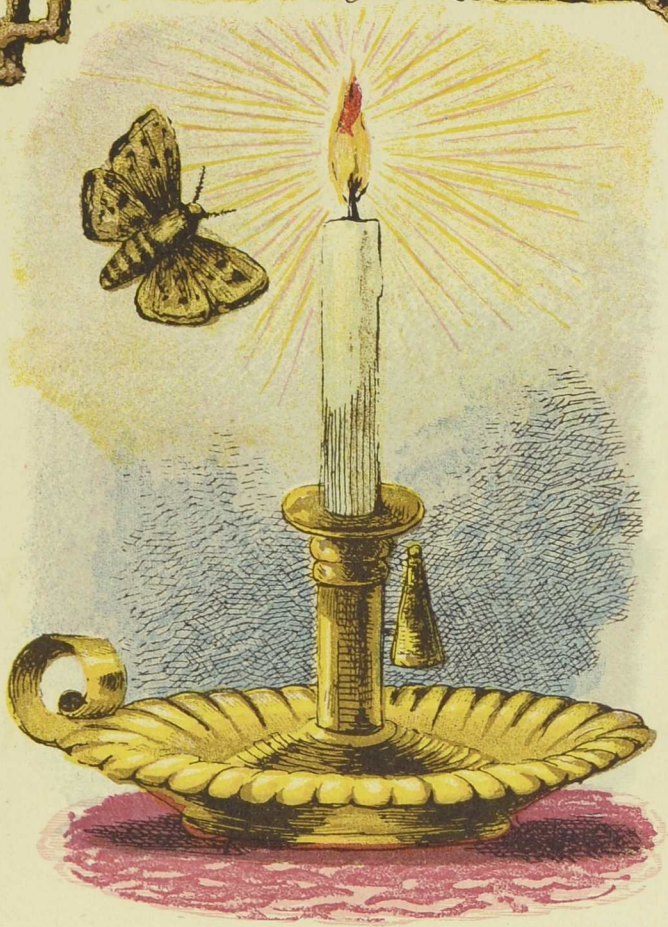
