

To the Chairman and Members of the Committee on Fire and Light :

GENTLEMEN,—In compliance with the rules governing the Fire Department, I have the honor to herewith submit the Annual Report of the Department for the year ending December 31st, 1904.

During the year the Department responded to 771 alarms ; this is 96 less than that of last year. A number of boys were convicted and fined for sending in false alarms, and this I believe is having a salutary effect, for the practice is yearly lessening and I trust will finally be put a stop to.

The fire losses for the year are far in excess of anything this City has ever experienced. This is accounted for by the conflagration with which the City was visited on the night of April 19th, when property estimated at over ten million dollars was destroyed.

The fire started in the five-flat building, 58-60 Wellington Street west, occupied by Messrs. E. & S. Currie, in the manufacture of neckwear. When the Department ar-

rived at the scene of the fire, it was found to be utterly impossible to save the Currie building, and everything possible was done to confine the fire to this structure, but the strong north-west wind drove the flames with such force against the rows of unprotected windows of the Gillespie-Ansley Co. seven-storey building, immediately to the east and separated by only a narrow lane from the Currie building, that the best efforts of the Department were defeated, and in a few minutes the fire in this building was also beyond control. From this large building, stored with inflammable material, and driven by the excessive high wind, the flames spread with such amazing rapidity that in less than an hour from the time the alarm was given, ten or twelve different structures were ablaze, even street widths offering no bar to its progress.

Between Bay Street on the east and the east side of the Queen's Hotel and Lorne Street on the west, the fire swept south to the Esplanade, then jumping across Bay Street south of Front Street and also north of Front Street. The fire spread from those two points north, south and east, until every building on both sides of Bay Street between Wellington Street and the Esplanade was burning; on reaching Wellington Street on the north, it spread east along the south side of this street until stopped in this direction at Messrs. Kilgour Brothers' Factory. In the meantime the flames had complete control of both sides of Front Street and south to the Esplanade, and continued on their eastward devastating march until reaching the high dead wall on the Minerva Manufacturing Co.'s building on the north side of Front Street, and the vacant lot between Messrs. McMahon, Broadfield & Co.'s building, and the Custom House and the iron protected windows of the Examining Warehouse on the south side, where with a little favorable wind conditions, together with a most de-

terminated effort on the part of the fire fighters, the spread of the conflagration was stopped at about 5 o'clock in the morning, after raging for nine hours.

While we must all deplore this great destruction of property and the heavy loss sustained by the city and citizens, there are some things in connection therewith for which we have great reason to be thankful. One is the manner in which surrounding municipalities responded to our appeals for aid; in this connection I should mention Toronto Junction, East Toronto, Hamilton, Brantford, London, Niagara Falls, N.Y., and Buffalo, N.Y., and although only the three first mentioned were in time to assist in stopping the spread of the fire, the others were here ready and willing to lend all assistance within their power had their services been required; another is the manner in which the different railways cleared their lines and gave the right of way to those who were hastening to our assistance, and above all is the fact that not one life of either fireman or citizen was lost during the continuance of the conflagration.

ACCIDENTS.

The accidents to the members of the Department were, I believe, more numerous than those of any previous year and a number of a most serious nature, but fortunately only one proved fatal, that of fireman Arthur Potter, of the Bay Street section, who died on the 19th February from inhaling the fumes of nitric acid whilst working at a fire at No. 92 Bay Street, two days previous.

HOUSES OR STATIONS.

A considerable amount of improvements and repairs of a permanent character were carried out in a number of the stations during the year just closed, and I hope this system will obtain in the Department, year by year, until all are placed in first-class condition. The work on the new addition to upper Dundas Street station was finished and is now occupied, making this station most complete ;

College Street station and grounds have had considerable improvements, which add materially to both their comfort and appearance ; a new sitting room for the men of Portland Street station is now being erected ; in the central station, Lombard Street, new joists and floors in the main halls, complete concrete floors in the basement, and also considerable inside decoration, have improved not only the appearance but also the sanitary condition of this station ; the new Berkeley Street station is getting along towards completion, and when finished will be one of the finest houses of its size on the continent.

Money was provided during the year for the purchase of the ground and building a hose station east of the Woodbine, and a house to contain a hook and ladder truck and engine on Cowan Avenue, south of the present hose station ; in the former case the lot has been secured and both buildings will be started early in the spring.

APPARATUS.

In the early part of the year the 85-foot aerial truck, which was sent to Walkerville the year previous to be remodelled and fitted with the latest and best quick-hoisting device, was placed in commission ; this truck is I believe now one of the best of that description anywhere in use.

A new city service truck, built by Seagrave & Co., and fully equipped with trussed ladders, was purchased and placed in the Lombard Street Station.

Two new two-horse hose wagons were purchased, one of which was placed in upper Dundas Street Station, taking the place of the one-horse wagon formerly in that station ; the other will be used as a spare or relief until such times as the Kew Beach Station is ready for occupation. The Ronald engine stationed at Richmond Street, was sent to

Brantford and equipped with a new boiler, new axle, etc., by the Waterous Engine Works Co., of that place, and is now an engine of the first class.

Two new 1,200-gallon engines are now under contract, being constructed by the same firm, and two large hose wagons with divided boxes to carry both $2\frac{1}{2}$ and 3-inch hose have been contracted for and are now being built by Mr. J. A. Darch, of this city. Those improvements added to the recommendations of your committee, based on the information obtained from the deputation which visited a number of the large American cities *re* fire protection, that a separate high pressure main system be installed in the congested district, together with the new houses, engines, etc., adopted by the Board of Control and City Council and endorsed by the property owners, when put into operation, will make this one of the best fire protected cities on the continent. The only other improvement I can suggest is the removal of the overhead wires in the centre of the city, and I understand legislation is being asked for by the corporation along those lines.

HORSES.

It is found necessary to purchase a number of new horses each year for the purpose of keeping the supply up to the requisite standard, and during the past year thirteen were purchased; ten considered unfit for service were disposed of and one was killed by a collision with a trolley car. This leaves a total of 70 now in the Department.

It is very gratifying to me to testify year after year to the able assistance I receive from every officer of the Department and to the satisfactory manner in which both officers and men perform their duties, and also to the general good conduct which now obtains in the Department.

To the officers and men of the Police Department I have to again extend my sincere thanks for the able assistance given to our Department on all possible occasions; also the press for many kind remarks in relation to the working of the Department, and to the many citizens in recognizing the services of the Department by forwarding handsome donations towards the benefit fund of the Department.

In conclusion, I return my most sincere thanks to the Chairman and members of the Committee on Fire and Light, for the very kind and courteous treatment I have received at their hands and the great interest they have taken in the welfare of the Department during the year.

Attached hereto will be found all necessary information as to the running of the Department.

FOR THE YEAR 1904.

OFFICE OF SUPERINTENDENT FIRE ALARM TELEGRAPH,
Toronto, December 31st, 1904.

Mr. John Thompson, Chief of Fire Department:

DEAR SIR,—I beg to submit herewith a statement of the working of the Fire Alarm System for the year 1904, during which time over four hundred and fifty alarms passed through the automatic repeater, all of which with one exception were properly transmitted to the various Fire Stations.

During the year ten alarm boxes and three gongs were added to the system. The five new alarm boxes which we returned to New York for alterations have not yet been returned to us, but as we have the wire all practically up, the boxes can be placed in position in a short time after reaching us.

Early in the year all the keyless doors of the alarm boxes were thoroughly cleaned and repaired, and kept in good order until August 9th; after that they were replaced by doors with keys fitted in the locks, making all the alarm boxes uniform and greatly lessening the delay in sending in alarms of fire.

At the fire on April 19th, all wires were destroyed between the corners of Yonge and Front Streets and Bay Street and the Esplanade, leaving our No. 2 circuit open for a time, but early on the morning of the 20th we had

everything working again. At the same time our No. 6 alarm box was damaged, but is now thoroughly repaired, and can be placed in position at any time.

On May 2nd, the three hose houses at the Island were connected with electric bells in the pumping house; on May 25th, the wire was extended to the two new hose houses situated one opposite Ward's at the east, the other at Hanlan's. This system was kept working until the first of October.

There were also two new alarm boxes placed in the Main Building at Exhibition Park, on the circuit connecting the buildings with the Fire Hall on the grounds. The system was working from August 27th until September 13th.

The following is a correct inventory of the property in my charge :

- 1 10-circuit switchboard.
- 11 galvanometers.
- 5 large bell strikers.
- 425 cells of battery.
- 100 miles of wire, poles, etc.
- 206 fire alarm boxes.
- 30 gongs.


