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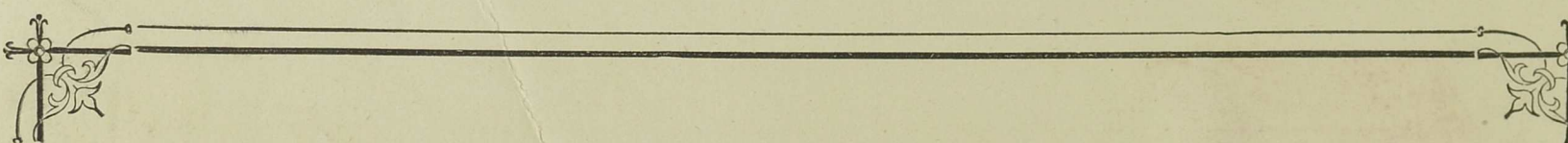

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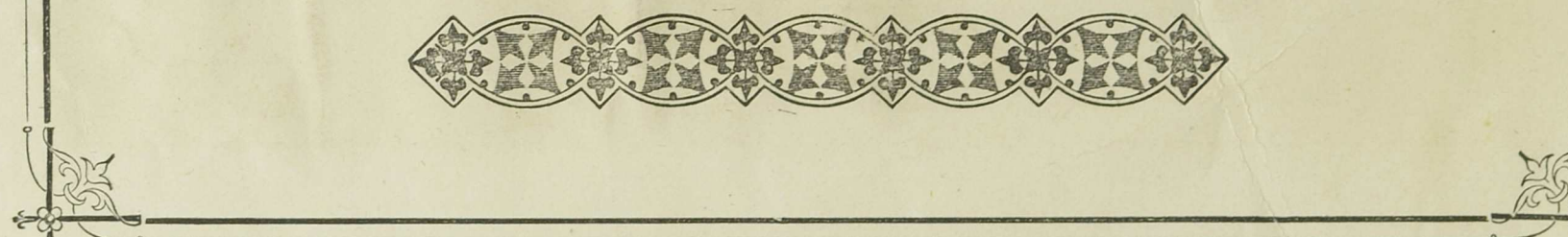


NURSERY LULLABIES.

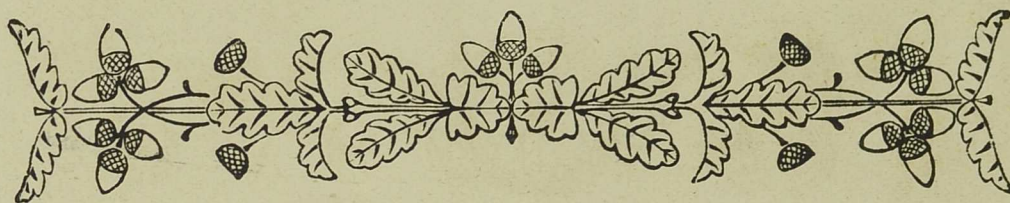
Oh, slumber my darling ! thy sire is a Knight ;

For strife comes with manhood, and waking with day.





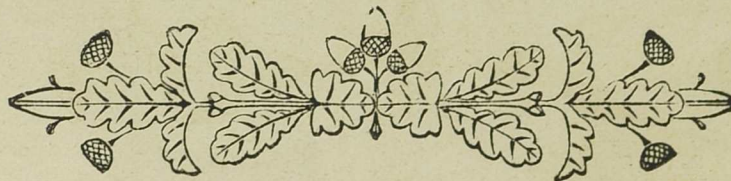


Hush-a-bye, Baby, on the tree-
top!

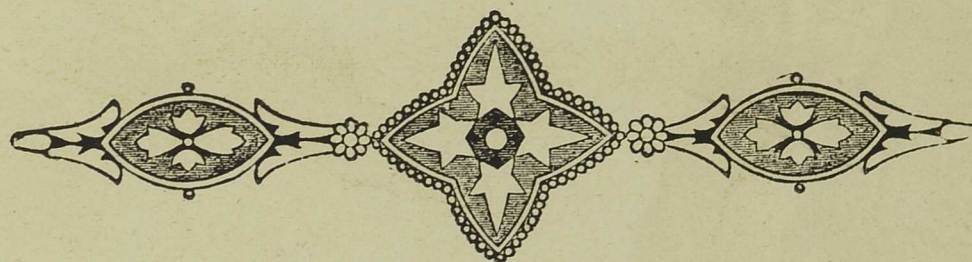
When the wind blows the cradle

will fall—

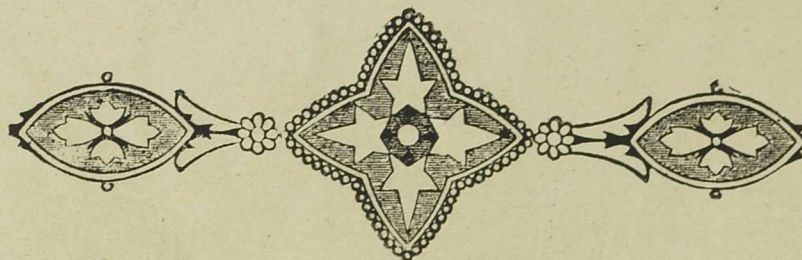
Down will come Baby, bough,
cradle and all!



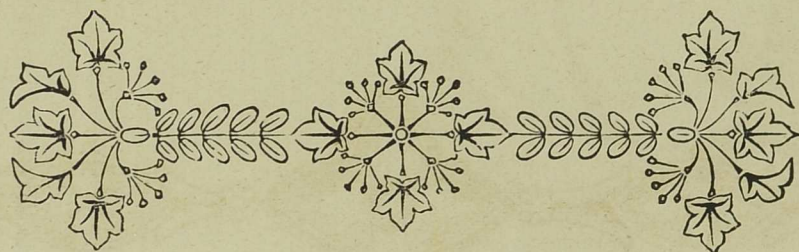




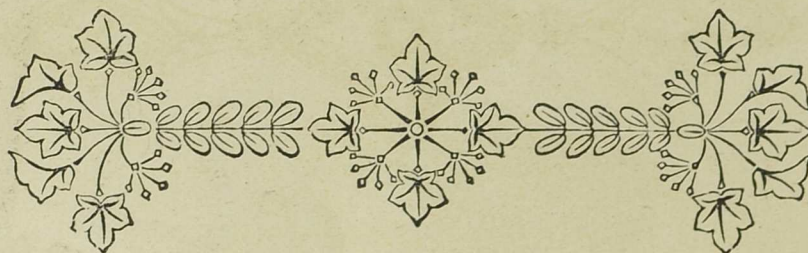
Hush-a-bye, a Baa Lamb,

To beat the naughty Bow-wow.



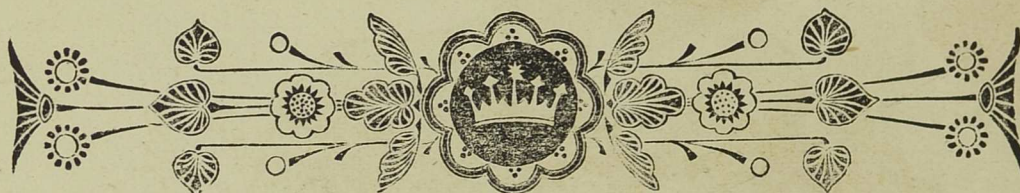




Rock-a-bye, Baby, thy cradle is

drums for the King.

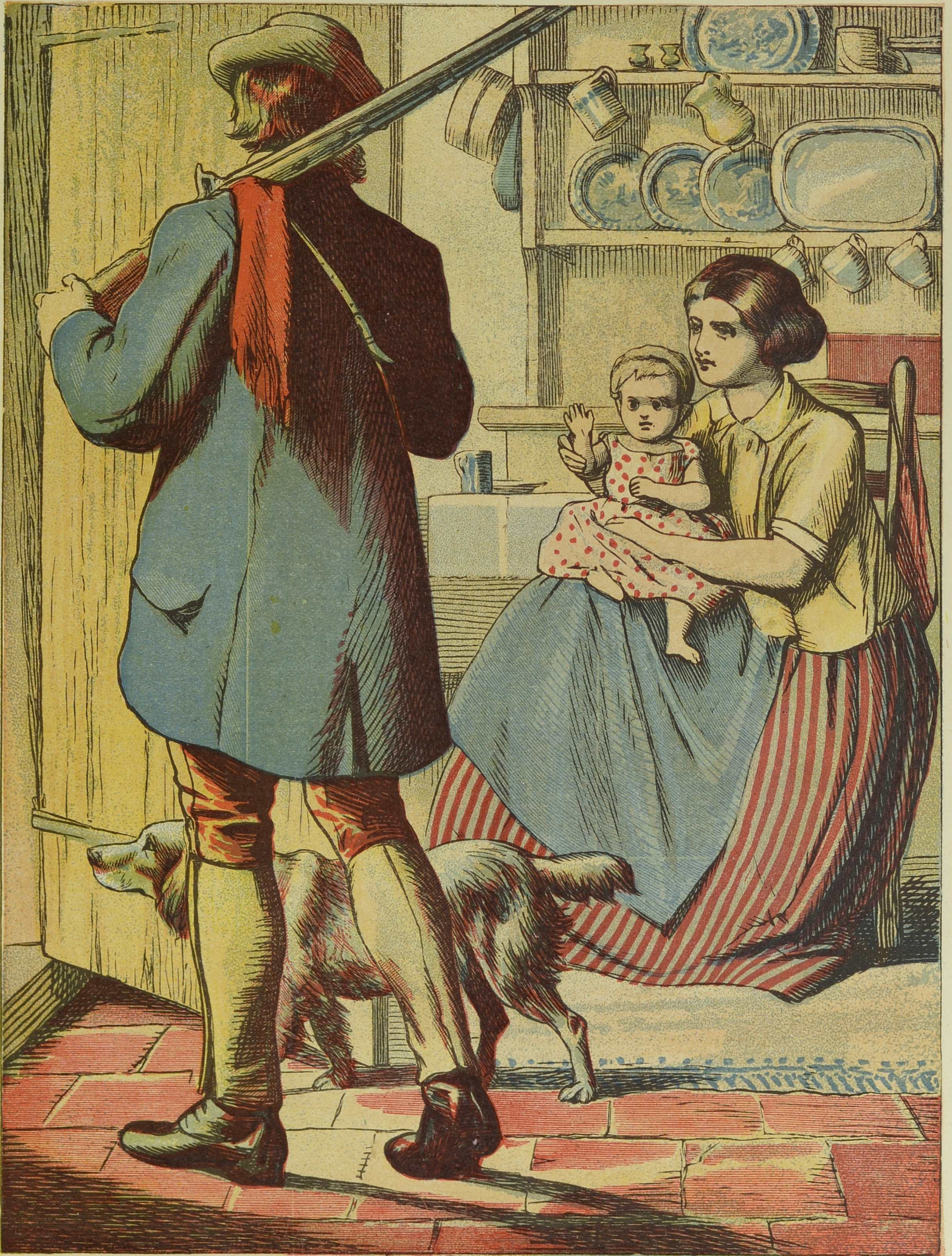


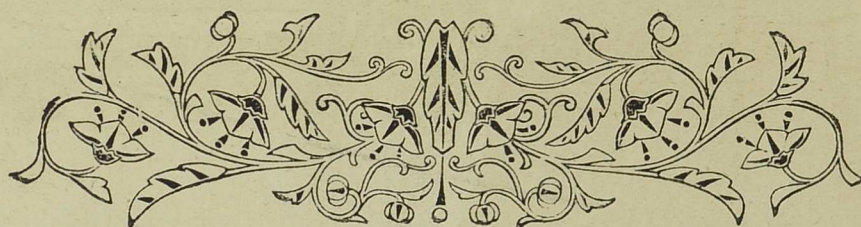




Dance to your Daddy, my little

boat comes in.



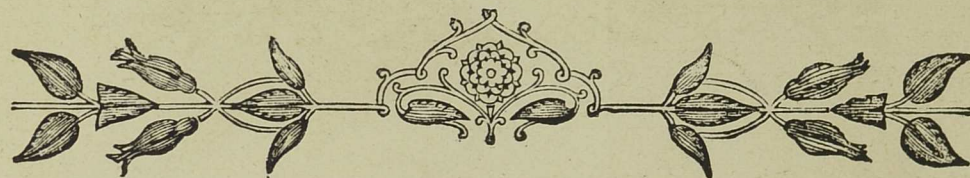




Bye, Baby Bunting,

her Grandmother.



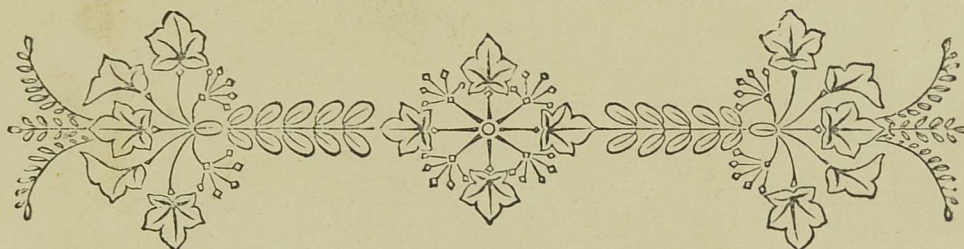




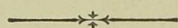
Hey, my Chicken, my Chicken !

roundy.



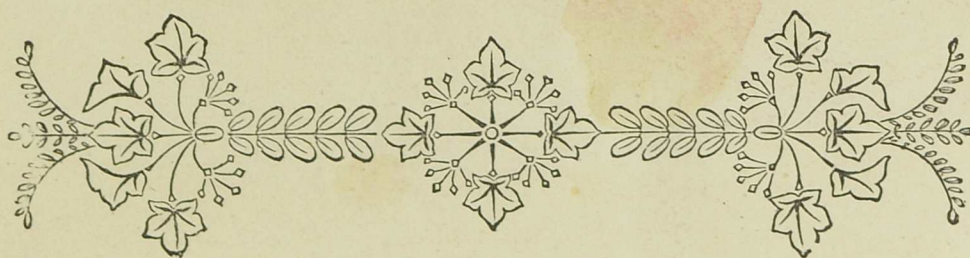


Dance, little Baby, dance up high!
