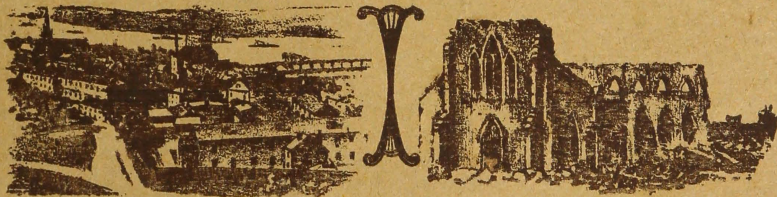

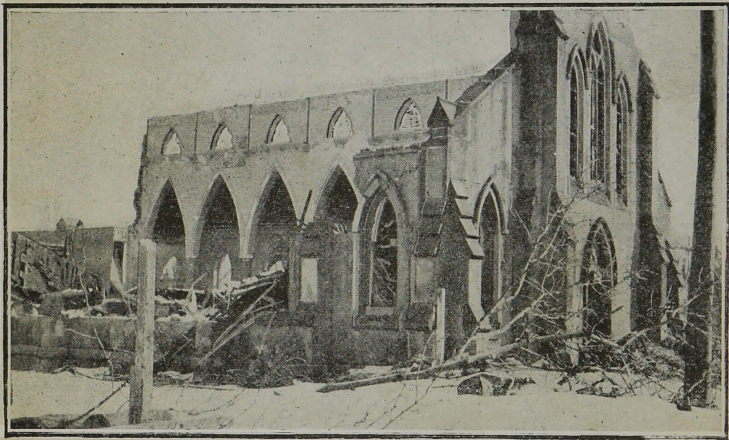

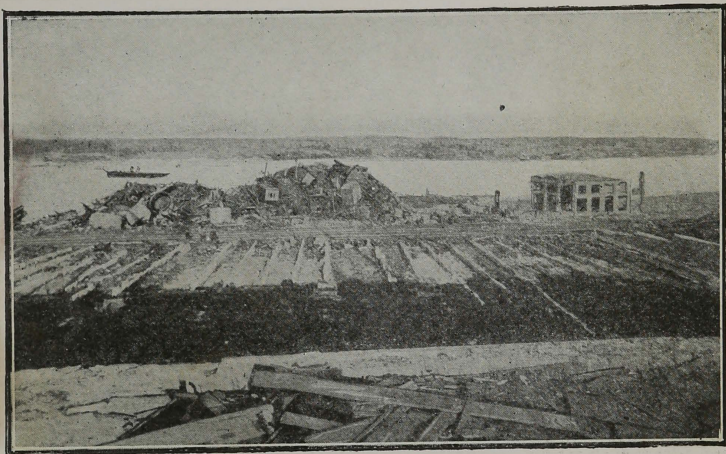
The Ruins of St. Joseph's Roman Catholic

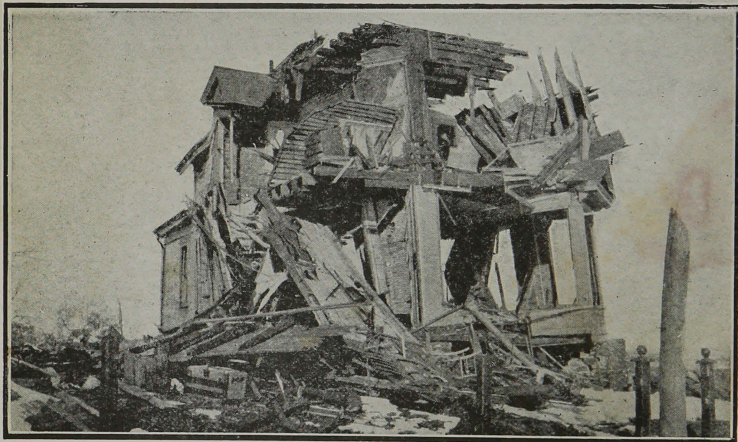

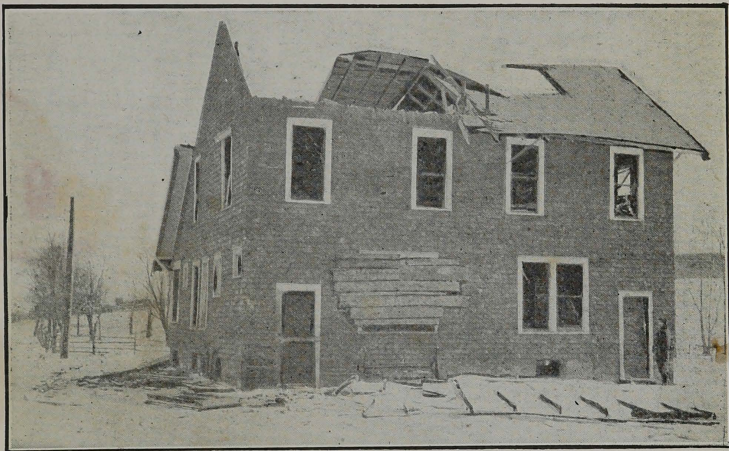

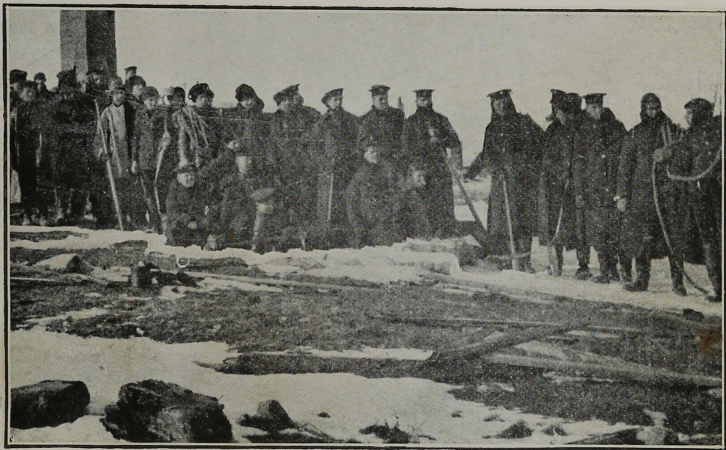

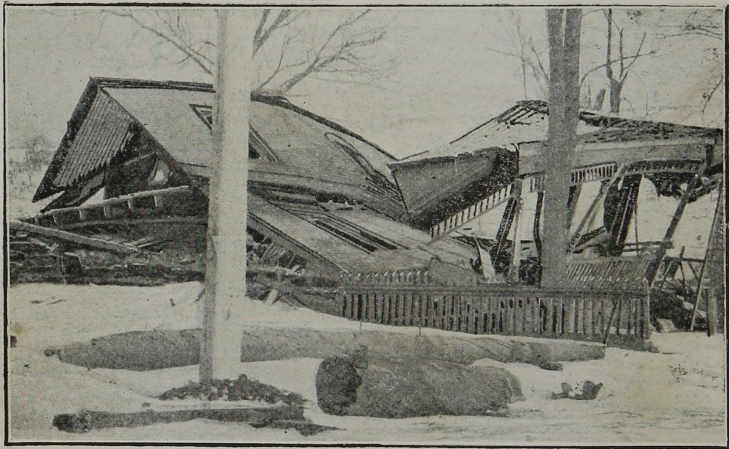

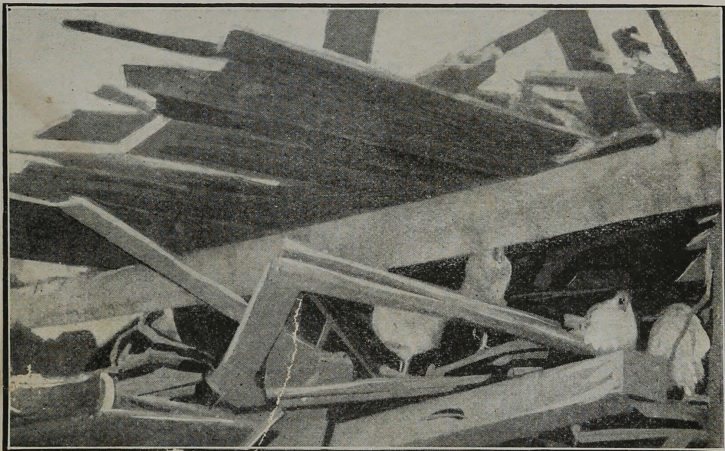

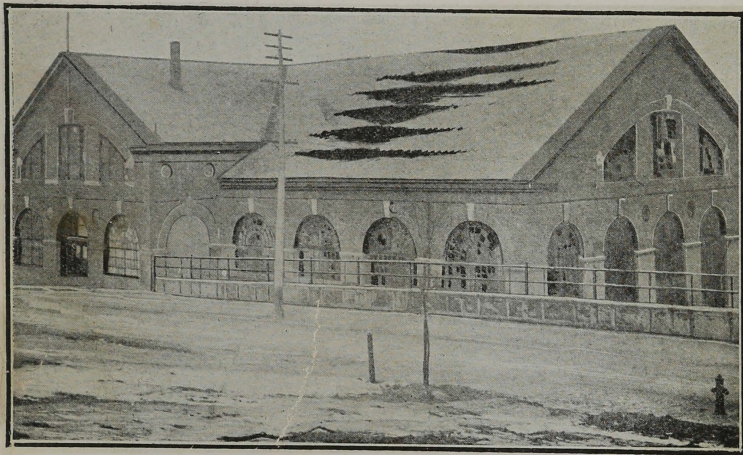

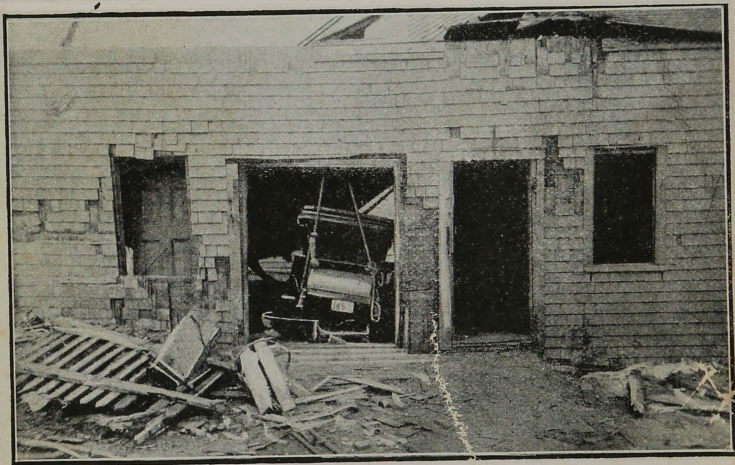

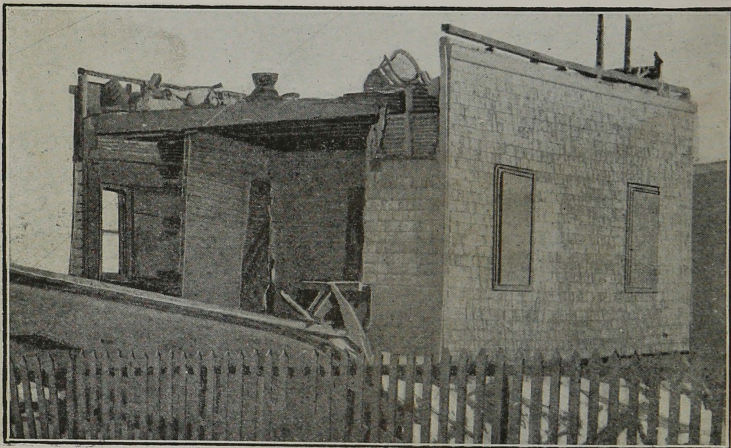

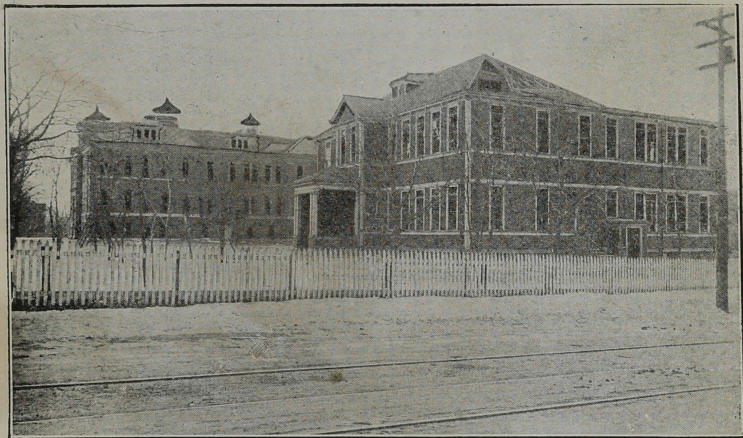

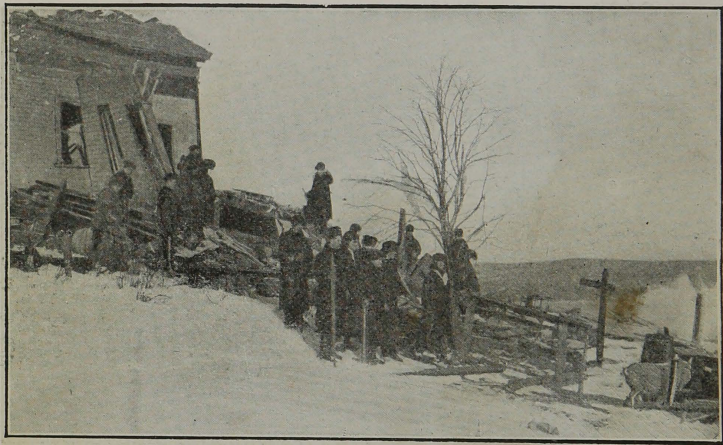
Bloomfield Public School and Bloomfield High
School were both damaged.



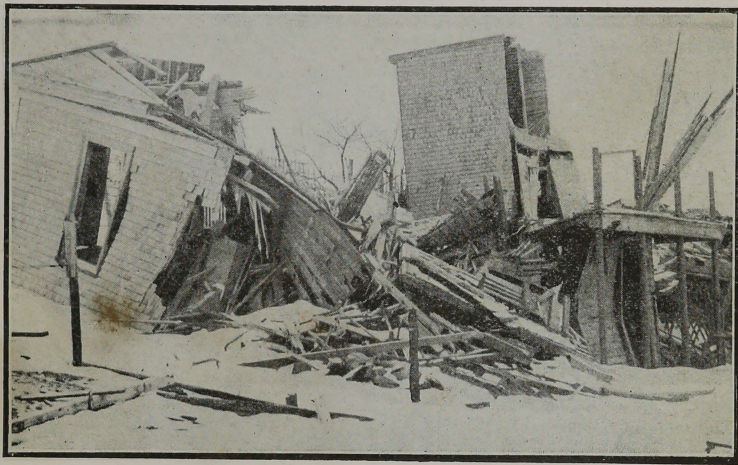

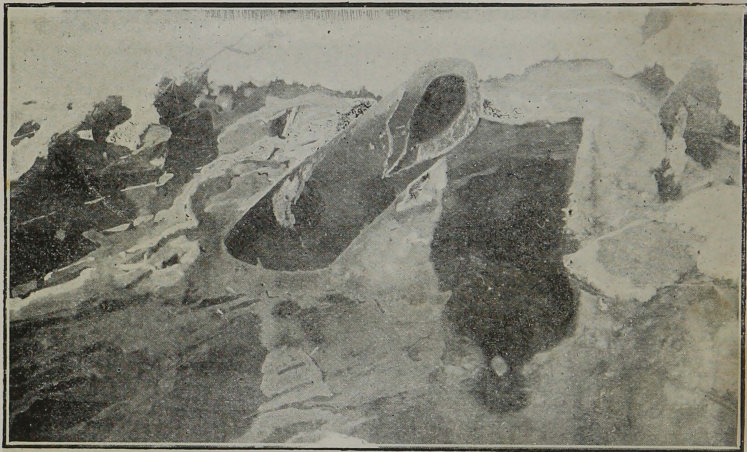

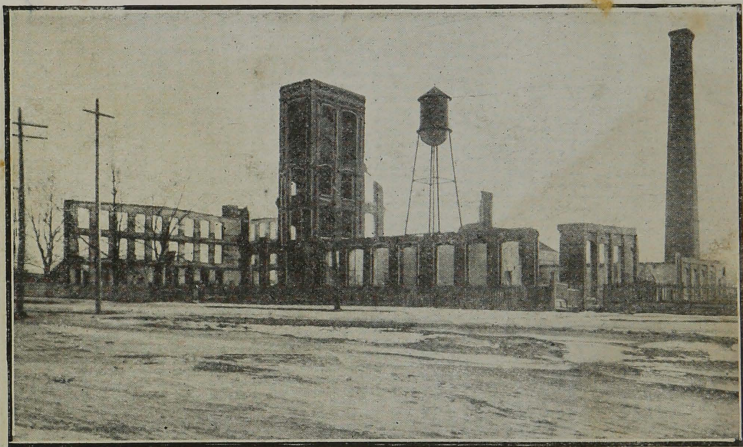
