her so.





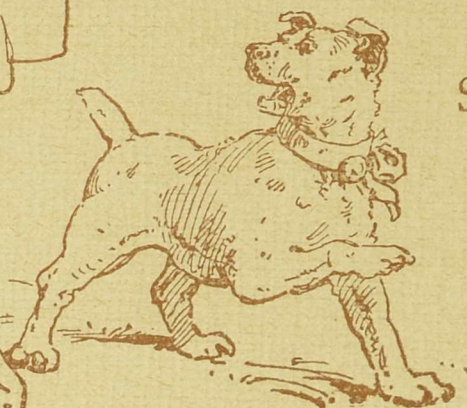
G IS for Gate which gives

scolded her so.



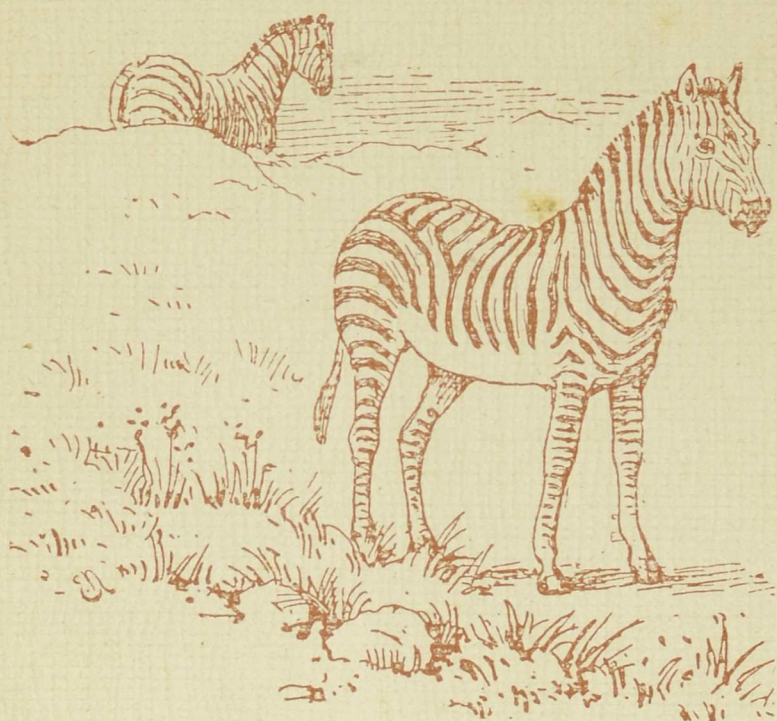


U FOR Umbrella,
