




A STANDS for Alice—Alfred, too, Who's trying hard


what he can do To make a great big shadow A, Which little Arthur tries to say.







She plays with Fannie "hide-and-seek."










Whilst Jimmy gives him a surprise.

a right good rub.






S STANDS for Sybil; with a rope

But each must mind she does not trip.


T IS for Tom,
