Ties to be decided by one or more rounds at the last range. Men may load when they please, but will not be allowed to cap until they come forward to fire. Pull of trigger, not less than six pounds. Rifles of winners to be tested before leaving the ground. The decision of the Committee to be final in case of dispute.

It is to be understood that the firing in the second stage is to be continuous with that made in the first stage. No one will be permitted to fire in the second stage who has not scored 30 Points in the first stage. Competitors must be on the ground by 10 A.M.

As the subscription lists have not all been received up to date, the value of the prizes will be probably increased.
