


TOTO MIXES THE SALAD


A SURPRISE AFTER DINNER

Baby is as happy as a fish, in his little bath; it is very funny to watch him trying to catch the water which Nurse is squeezing from the sponge.








PAUL'S FIRST SPEECH






The heat was very great, and Mary was quite knocked up by her walk. — The heat rather damped her enjoyment, I am afraid!

No, perhaps it is a tame pigeon!"
















THREE CHILDREN
