



The lovely, rose-coloured Flamingoes.




The Kangaroo, with

They dive and swim wonderfully,




and in their mouths

A handsome Lion and Lioness.




A She-Wolf and her four Cubs. She is very proud of her family.

This is a peculiar-looking Ox with a hump on its back. It comes from India, and is called the Zebu.






Mountain Sheep. They can climb steep rocks with the greatest ease, and are very sure-footed.

A visit to the Cockatoo, Parrot, and the gay Macaw.




A wonderful bird is the Ostrich. It has
beautiful feathers which are very valuable.


Ostriches are kept on great farms in
South Africa.




This is the Emu from Australia. Like the Ostrich,

north of Europe and Asia.




Two Leopards. They are savage animals, and never to be trusted.

The children never forget to pay it a visit.







The Bears are always on the look-out for buns and sweets.



The Condor is a bird of prey, and one of the largest of flying birds. It has a habit of standing with its wings expanded.




The Hippopotamus opens its big mouth to be fed. It must take a lot of food to keep such a huge animal alive.
