THE DOUBLE CHOICE

Ontario Jockey Club

THE FIRST RACE IN THE COMBINATION SHALL BE KNOWN AS RACE "A", THE SECOND AS RACE "B".

Explanation

The "double choice" may comprise any two races given on the same daily racing programme, due notice having been given by the use of signs, and in the programme, which races will be in the combination.

In the first instance tickets are bought on the choice of the winner in Race "A" only. If this choice should prove successful, the tickets must be exchanged for the selection in Race "B", after which the pool will be divided amongst the holders of winning tickets in Race "B".

The great advantages of this over any other system of double wagering are that, having been successful in Race "A", the choice of the winner in Race "B" may be made at any time up to the time set for closing the sales on Race "B", during which period the horses may be inspected in the paddock, and, if track conditions should change during the interval, a horse may be selected which would be suited to those conditions.

Rules

1. The wagered money will be treated as an entirely separate pool.
2. In all cases the play is on the winning (Straight) horses only.
3. Should there be no ticket sold on the winner of Race "A", holders of tickets on the nearest horse to the winner will exchange their tickets for their choice in Race "B".
4. Should there be no tickets sold on the winner of Race "B", the pool will be divided amongst holders of tickets on the nearest horse to the winner.
5. Should there be no tickets sold on the winning horses of both races, the pool will be divided amongst those holding tickets on the horses finishing closest to the winners.
6. In the "double choice" tickets are sold on individual horses only (the field or entry is not considered).

Caution

Be sure the post positions on your tickets correspond with those on the programme.

Do not destroy tickets until the official sign has been displayed after both races.
