AMMUNITION.—1882 ammunition will be supplied for Matches Nos. 1, 2 and 3 at 10 cents per package, for Match No. 6 free. Service ammunition will be supplied free.

CHALLENGING.—Any competitor challenging a shot will be required to deposit 25 cents with the Range Officer, which will be refunded if the result prove in his favor.

SELECTION OF PRIZES.—Prize winners will be permitted to select their prizes according to their scores, provided such selection be made on Monday, October 9th, at the Lecture Room, in the Drill Shed, at 8 o'clock, p.m.

ENTRIES.—Entries for the various Matches must be made with the Secretary at the Drill Shed, on Wednesday, the 4th, or Friday, the 6th of October, at 8 o'clock, p.m.

Competitors will appear in plain clothes and make their own arrangements for luncheon.
