PRODUCE.

Inactivity has prevailed all week, but prices of grain fairly steady.

STOCKS IN STORE, AUGUST 21.

Flour 475 barrels; fall wheat 50,712 bushels; spring wheat, 33,763, oats, 1,100; barley, 5,432; peas 4,723; rye, 6,284.

GRAIN IN SIGHT, AUG. 12.

Wheat, 18,831,000 bushels, and barley, 35,000, against 17,405,000 of wheat, and 104,000 of barley in 1881.

ENGLISH ADVICES.

Cable advice show supplies for the week ending Aug. 10th, to have been about 90,000 qrs above the average consumption, and the quantity of wheat and flour afloat for the United Kingdom on the 17th inst. 2,375,000 quarters against 2,391,000 on the 10th inst., and 1,728,000 last year. The total supply from Aug. 27 to July 29 was equal to 22,061,000 qrs, against 21,316,000 in the corresponding period of the previous year.

Flour.—Very quiet and again rather easier. Old-grade superior extra sold last week at equal to \$3.35 here. The market has since been inactive and dull, and closed nominal at quotations.

BALAN.—Scarc and flatter at \$13.25 to \$13.50. OATMEAL.—Cans wanted and \$5.50 bid but none offered. Small lots advanced to \$6.00 to \$6.25.

WHEAT.—Offerings small and prices fairly steady, but sales few. No. 2 fall sold last week and on Tuesday at \$1.15, and new do. on Tuesday at \$1.08 f.o.c. Spring very scarce with \$1.22 paid for No. 1 and \$1.18 for No. 2 last week and on Tuesday \$1.20 for No. 1 and \$1.18 for No. 2. The market yesterday seemed easy; No. 2 fall not likely to bring over \$1.14; spring sold on p.t., but admittedly at close on Tuesday's prices. Street receipts nil.

OATS.—Scarce and firm with cars on track selling readily at 60c.; and 58c. paid on Monday for eastern to arrive; cars on track wanted at \$60. yesterday but none offered. Street prices 63 to 65c.

BARLEY.—The first load of new has sold at 70c., which was considered a high price as it was light and discolored. It is feared that the late rains have worked a good deal of mischief with color. The above street purchase must not be indicative of opening prices.

PEAS.—Nothing doing and prices nominal; the few on hand are held above buyers' views. Street receipts nil.

WOOL.—Fleece still quiet but one lot was bought by a dealer at 20c.; super has sold freely at 20 to 27c.; lambs-wool at 27c., and extra to a small extent at 31 to 34c.

PROVISIONS.

BUTTER.—The demand for shipping lots seems slack, and 16 to 16½c. the best bids for selections which are held higher. Choice for local use has sold freely and firmly at 18 to 19c.; and inferior has gone off at 15 and 16c.

CHEESE.—A lot of 100 boxes sold at 11c.; small lots of choice 11½ to 12c. and skim 10c. At Ingersoll nothing done on Tuesday.

EGGS.—Closed firmer at 14½ to 17c. for round lots.

PORK.—Small lots sold fairly well at 83c. 00.

BACON.—Rather more active. Long-clear sold in half-cars at 13c., and in cases at 12½c.; Cumberland scarce and usually going at 12½c. Ribs and bellies nearly finished; any left held at 15 to 16c. Hams steady at 13½ to 16c. for canned.

LARD.—Quiet and unchanged at 15½ to 16c. for tins and pails in small lots.

HOGS.—None in the market; for a lot held in a point east at 40c.; there has been 97½c. bid for the States.

FREIGHTS.

LAKE FREIGHTS.—Rates on grain to Lake Ontario ports 1½c.

GRAND TRUNK RATES.—Rates on flour from Toronto are this week 2½c. to Montreal; 35c. to St. John, N.B.; and 60c. to Halifax.
