

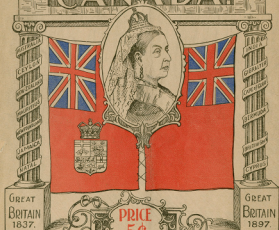

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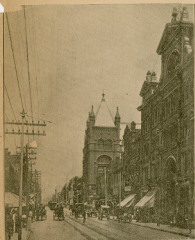

#### GENERAL ATHLETIC SPORTS

SPORTS COMMITTEE—AM. Sheppard, Chairman; G. H. Orr, G. M. Higginbotham, Wm. Stark, E. B. Ryckman, A. C. Macdonell, J. L. Hughes, G. A. Kingston; H. J. P. Good, Secretary, Room 6, 17½ Adelaide Street East.

At 2 p.m. athletic sports will be held in front of the grand stand at Exhibition Park. The following events will be contested:

Floral bicycle tournament, open to all ladies, gentlemen, boys and girls. Prizes to be six medals, presented by Geo. Goodenham, Esq.

Running 100 yards, 220 yards, 440 yards, and 880 yards; open to all amateurs; also 220 yards, open to the police and firemen only.

Field events—Throwing 16-pound hammer, putting 16-pound shot, throwing 56-pound weight, high jump and broad running jump.

Bicycle races—One half and one mile, open to all amateurs; one mile novice and two mile tandem, open to all amateurs; one mile, open to volunteers in uniform, drill order without bayonets.

In each of the above named events (except the tandem bicycle race) there will be three prizes, viz.: 1st prize, gold medal; 2nd prize, silver medal; 3rd prize, bronze medal.

The prizes for the winners of the tandem bicycle race will be two gold medals, one for each rider.

Note—There will be no entrance fee to any of the above events. Entries will close with Mr. H. J. P. Good, at Pearson's Chambers, Adelaide Street, on Tuesday, June 15, 1897.

Competitors are required to furnish credentials as to their amateur standing that are satisfactory to the committee, the competitions only being open to those who have resided in the city for at least three months prior to the date of entry.

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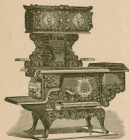

The rules of the Amateur Athletic Association of Canada and of the Canadian Wheelmen's Association shall govern the events.

### BOYS' BRIGADE GAMES

Special games are being provided for the members of the Boys' Brigade who march in the procession, as follows: 100 yard race, 220 yard race, half-mile bicycle race.

### CHILDREN'S JUBILEE GAMES

These games will be confined to the children of the Public and Separate Schools, and will commence at 2.30 o'clock p.m.

Events 1 to 14 will take place on the Cricket Ground, south of the south-east corner of the Main Building; the balance of the events will be held at another place, probably between the Cricket Ground and the Grand Stand.

Six pupils from the Separate Schools and six from the Public Schools will be allowed to compete in each event.

No pupil will be allowed to take more than three first prizes, but the other prizes are not limited.

under 15; 27, 440-yards' race, open to boys under 17; 28, half-mile championship race, open to boys under 17; 29, hurdle race, open to boys under 15, 150 yards with six hurdles; 30, hurdle race, open to boys under 17, 150 yards with six hurdles.

Special judges and starters will have control of these games, and for their guidance rules to regulate the different events will be put into force by the Children's Jubilee Games Committee.

### GYMNASTIC COMPETITIONS

Competitions in gymnastic exercises, consisting of (1) horizontal bar, (2) barbell exercises, (3) club swinging, (4) parallel bars, (5) horse leaping, open to all, will be commenced in Exhibition Park at 5 o'clock. The prizes will consist of four medals, presented by the City of Toronto. No entrance fee will be charged.

### BAND CONCERTS

Band concerts will be given during the afternoon in Exhibition Park, as follows: In front of the Main Building the Maple Leaf Band (Toronto) will play from 2.30 to 5.30 o'clock; Near the Machinery Hall the 12th Battalion Band (Aurora) will play from 2.30 to 5.30 o'clock; On the band stand, north of the main building, the 77th Battalion Band (Dundas) will play from 2.30 to 5.30 p.m.

### YACHT RACE

A yacht race under the auspices of the Royal Canadian Yacht Club, will be sailed, the start and finish of the race to be opposite the south shore of the Island. The start will be made at 10 o'clock a.m.

### EVENING CELEBRATION

Immense bonfires will be lighted at 9 o'clock sharp in Riverdale Park, Dovercourt Park, and on the Island.

A display of fireworks will be given in Reserve Park, Dovercourt Park, Island Park, and in the harbor.

Band concerts will be given in Dovercourt Park by the Metropolitan Band; in Riverdale Park by the Band of the Queen's Own Rifles; in Reserve Park by the Band of the 48th Highlanders; at Island Park by the Sunnyside Band, between the hours of 7.30 and 9.30 p.m.

### CONCERT IN METROPOLITAN CHURCH

The Jubilee Chorus, directed by Mr. F. H. Torrington, will render a programme of music specially composed for the Jubilee celebration in Metropolitan Church at 8 p.m. The concert, which is under the patronage of the City Council and others, will include the following numbers: "God Save the Queen," Costa's Arrangement, "Victoria, Our Queen," J. Patriotic addresses will be delivered by the Rev. James Allen and the Rev. Dr. Potts.

God Save the Queen.

The celebration of the 60th anniversary of the reign of Her Most Gracious Majesty the Queen will commence with a grand concert, etc., Monday evening, June 21st., in Massey Music Hall, given by the Toronto Philharmonic Society, under the patronage of the Mayor and City Council. Several patriotic songs, English, Scotch, and Irish, will be rendered by eminent soloists and an orchestra chorus of 200 voices.

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
