For some years past the collection of literature relating to the life and writings of **Charles Dickens** has engaged my careful attention.

In February, 1896, acting on the advice of friends interested in the subject, I had printed, for private circulation, an illustrated catalogue of the Dickens section of my library. No charge was made for this catalogue, and the entire edition was very quickly distributed.
