so fine.

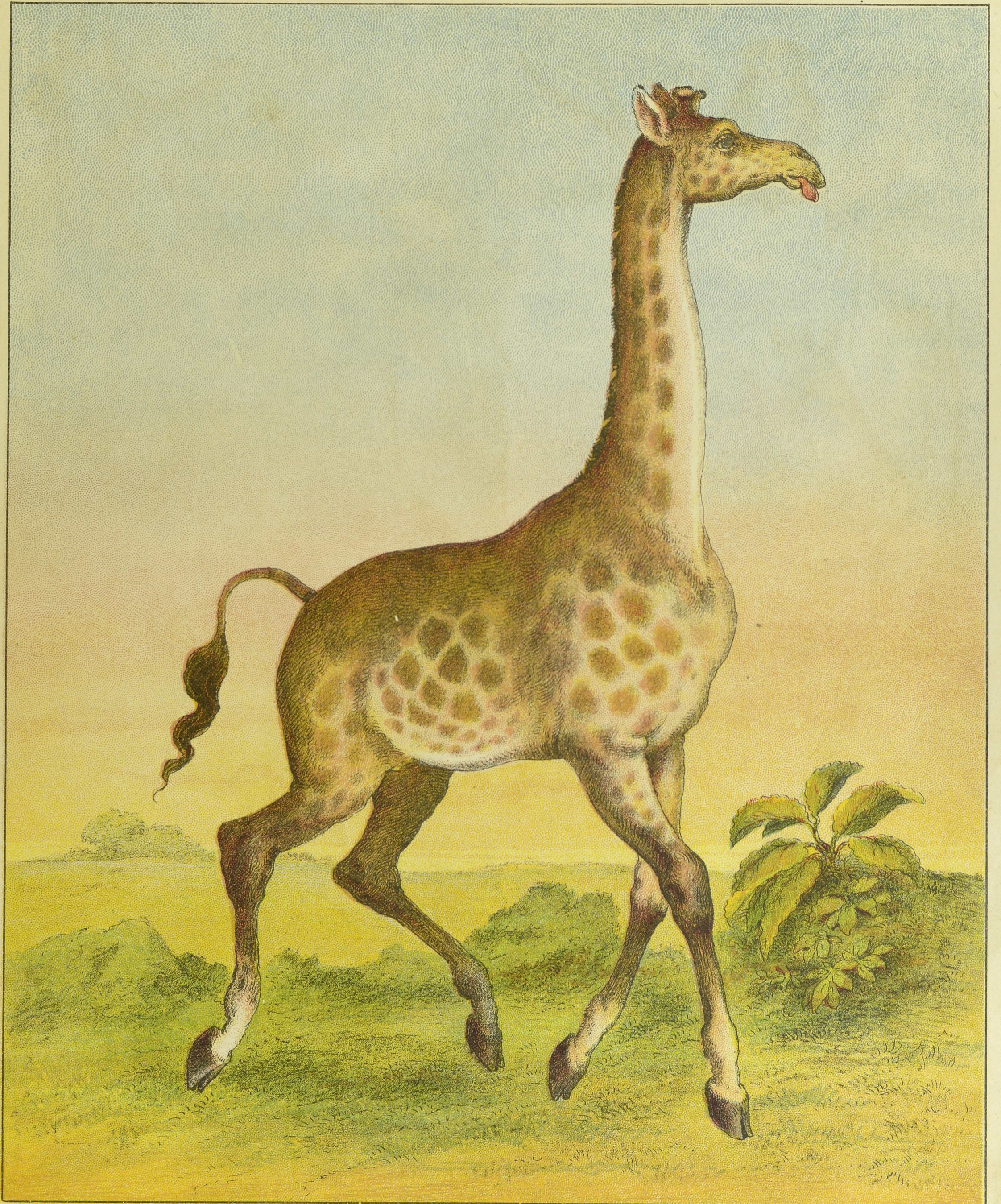
A Lion and Lioness, eager to

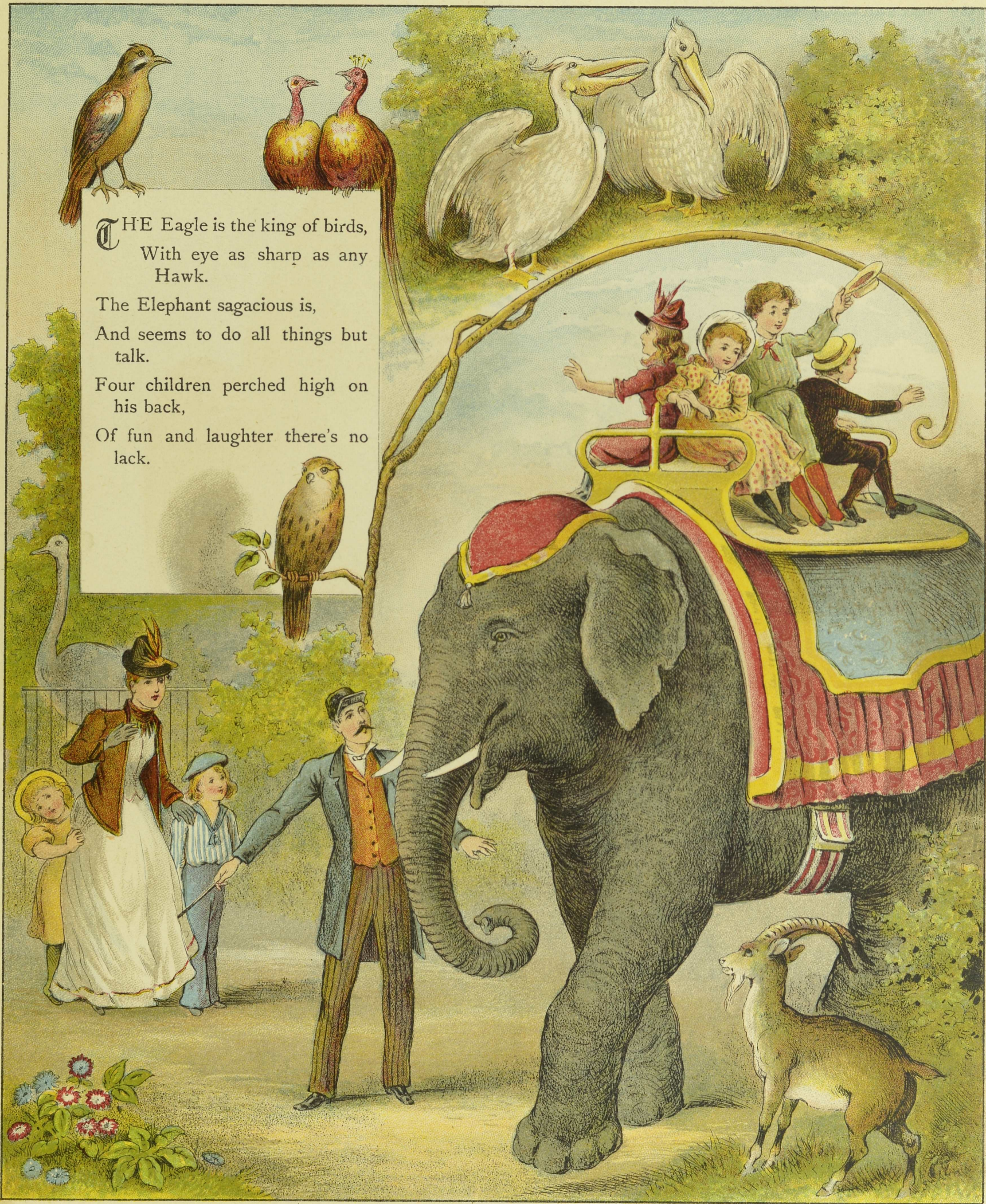

lack.

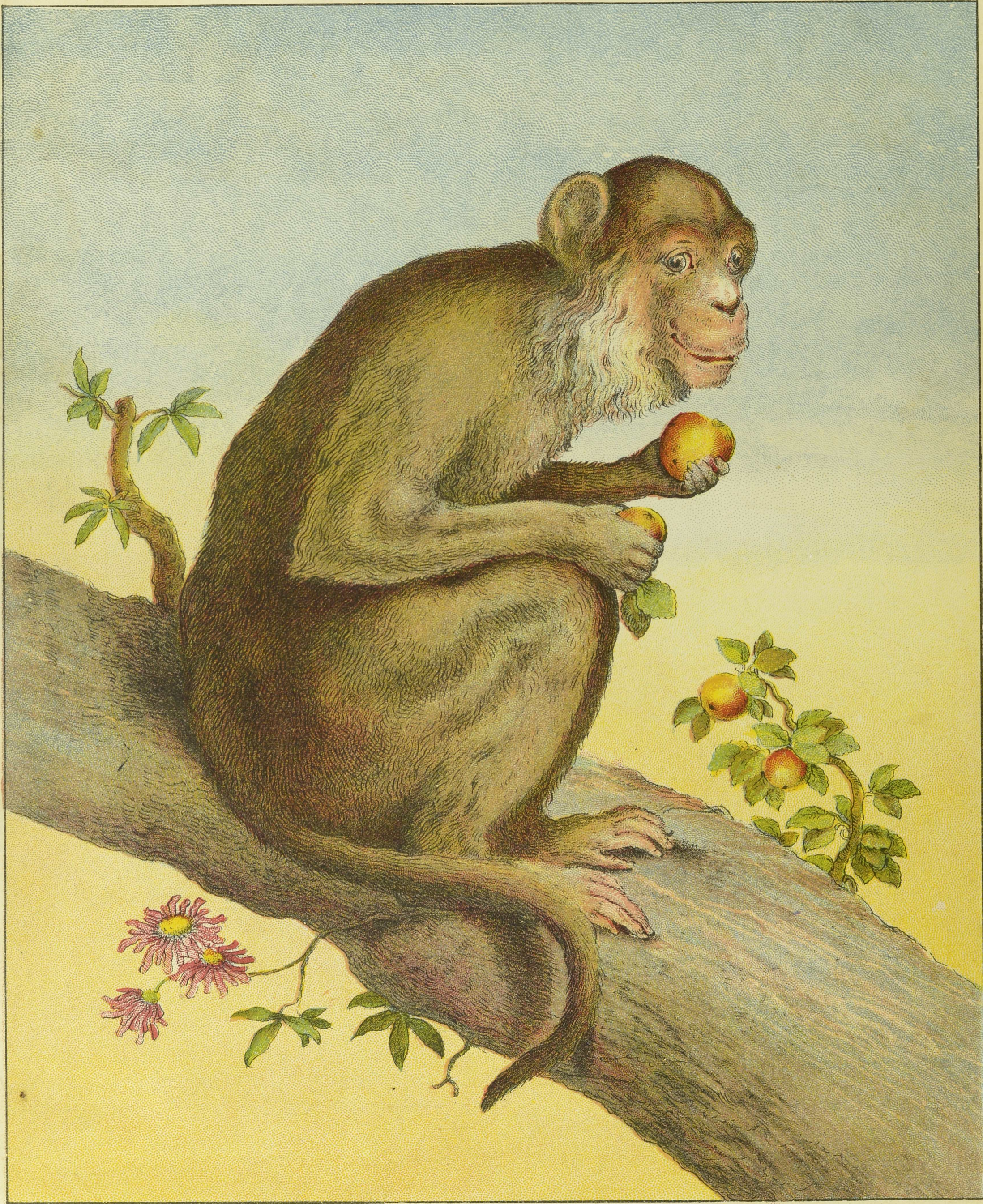
