ET us pay a visit to the Zoo, And see the Beasts, and Birds, pray do!


And view the Hippopotamus;

An Owl, and some Peacocks, with plumage so fine.


A Lion and Lioness, eager to dine;

There's a graceful Giraffe with spots on his skin.





Owl. Parrots. Giraffe. Peacock. Monkeys. Lion and Lioness.

And two Flamingoes, bright and red.








An Ibis and his brothers two. This Lady means to take a ride, The Camel's master walks beside. Seals live in water, and on land, The Ostrich runs up on the sand.

Has climbed on the branch of a tree;


And gathered two beautiful apples,


And very delighted is he.

And two pretty Zebra's beside; With a horn on his nose, you may see,


The Rhinoceros, with his thick hide.


