*To the Chief Ranger, Officers and Members of Court Success, No. 6827, A.O.F. :*

## Extracts from Court By-Laws and General Laws.

Each financial member shall become entitled to half Sick and Funeral Benefits at the expiration of six months, and full benefits at the expiration of twelve calendar months from the date of his initiation into this Court, providing he has paid all the Court demands.

FULL SICK PAY, \$4 per week, which the member receives for one year, providing he is on the Court funds, and if longer than a year, \$2 per week for a further period of 52 weeks, providing the member remains sick, and is absolutely unable to follow any occupation or do any manual labor.

No member shall be entitled to Sick Benefits unless he shall have been sick for more than one full week—a week consists of six working days.

FUNERAL BENEFITS at the death of a member shall be \$100, and Funeral Benefits at death of a member's wife shall be \$50, to be paid from the High Court Fund, providing the Constitution has been complied with. Read carefully the following:

*Married members who have joined the Order since 1889, or members who have married since October, 1889, shall furnish a medical certificate of good health and sound constitution of their wife, otherwise they will not be entitled to receive any Funeral Benefits should their wife die.*

INITIATION FEES are on a graduated scale, and members are admitted from the age of 18 to 45. Initiation fees are from \$2.50 to \$7.50.

DUES are also regulated by a graduated scale at age initiated. Thus, the younger you join the less you have to pay.

MEDICAL OFFICER. This court also furnished a physician to attend the sick members residing within three miles of the Court, and provides them with proper and sufficient medicines during their affliction.
