MORNING AND EVENING STARS

Mercury—Will be at its greatest elongation east on March 21, July 18, November 12, when it may be seen soon after sunset in the western sky about those dates. At its greatest western elongation January 7, May 6, September 1 and December 21, when it may be seen early in the morning before sunsis in the eastern sky.

Venus—Will be at its greatest elongation east 45° 28' July 5, and at its greatest elongation west 46° 44' on November 23. It will be an evening star to September 12 and a morning star to end of year. It will be at its greatest brilliancy Angust 7, and again on October 20.

Mars—An evening star to May 9, and then a morning star rest of the year.

Jupiter-An evening star from January 2 to July 20, then a morning star rest of the year. The satellites of Jupiter are not visible from June 27 to August 11, owing to proximity to the Sun.

Saturn-A morning star to February 14, evening star to August 12, then a morning star rest of the year. Venus and Saturn will be seen about July 2, in close approach during the evening in the western sky, Venus being south of Saturn.

ECLIPSES 1919

In the year 1919 there will be three eclipses, two of the Sun and one of the Moon.

I.-A total eclipse of the Sun, May 28th, 1919, invisible in Canada.

II.—A partial eclipse of the Moon, November 7th, 1919. Beginning visible in eastern part of N. America, ending visible in N. America except extreme west. At Toronto the Moon enters the umbra 5h. 58m. p.m. Middle eclipse 6h. 44m. p.m. Leaves the umbra 7h. 30m. p.m. Magnitude 0.184.

111.—An annular eclipse of the Sun November 22nd, 1919, visible in eastern and central Canada as a partial eclipse. At Toronto the eclipse begins 7h. 42m. a.m. and ends at 10h. 15m. a.m. Magnitude 0.46.

The Calendar in this Almanac is based on Central Standard Time. Eastern Time one hour earlier. Western Time one hour later.

When the owl rests look out for a storm.

If a cat washes herself calmly and smoothly, the weather will be fair. If she washes "against the grain" take your rain-coat with you. If she lies with her back to the fire, there will be a squall.

When you see the northern lights, you may expect cold weather.
