GRANDMAMMA EASY'S MERRY



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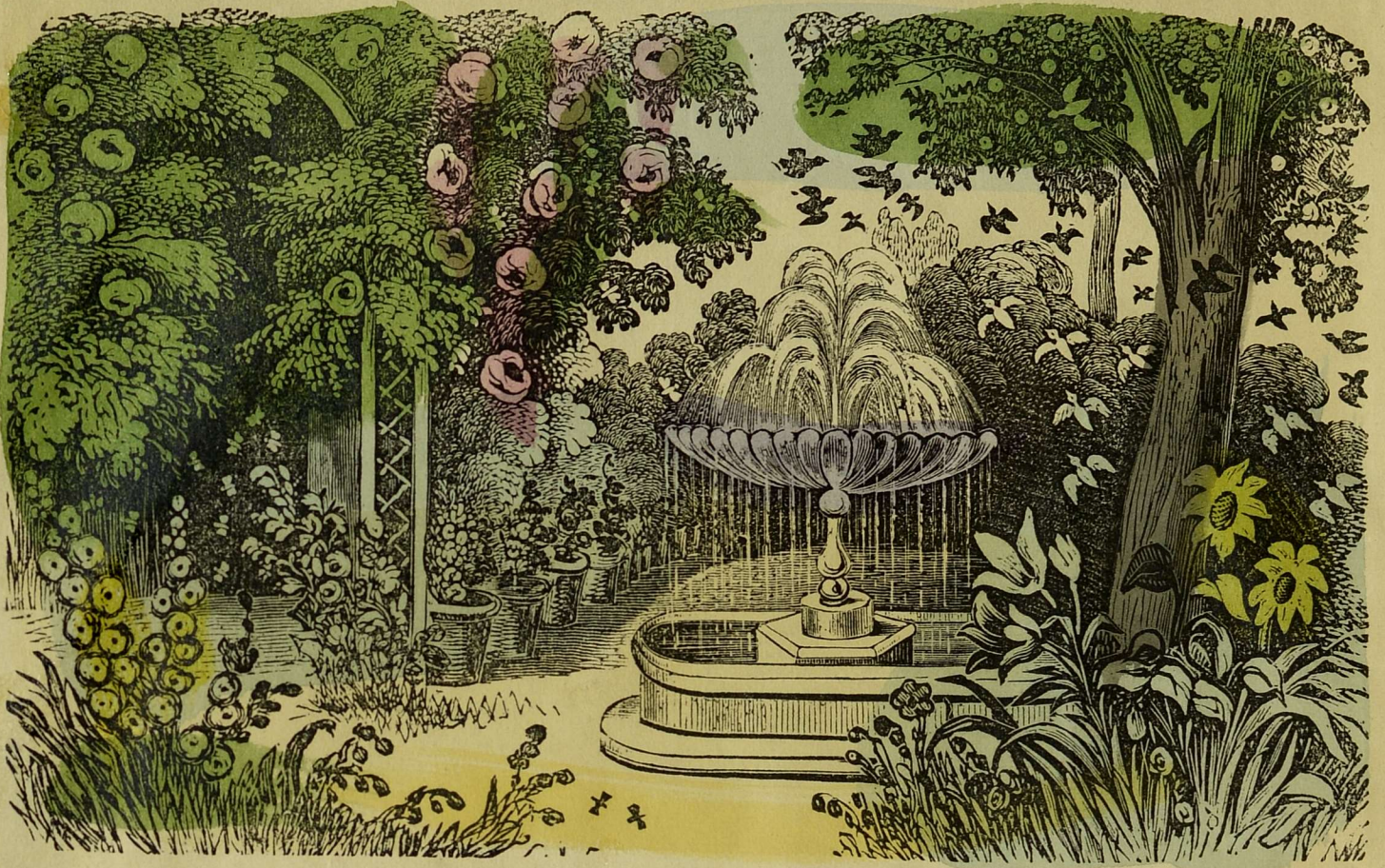
DEAN AND SON, Printers, Lithographers, and Book and Print Publishers,

Twice 4 are **Eight** Bats flying by, as blind as Bats can be.



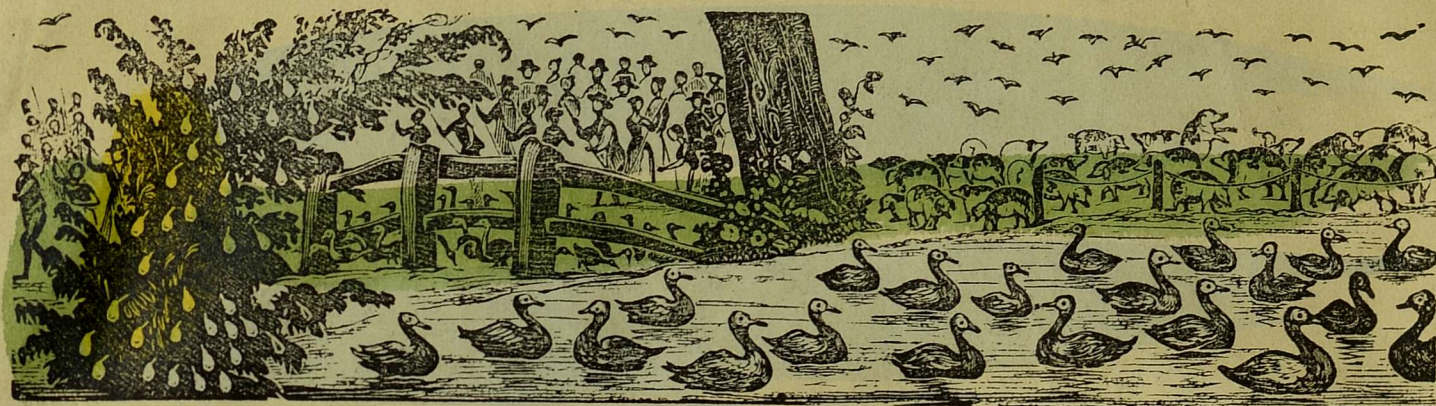
Twice 5 are **Ten** fine Ships, you see, that sail across the main,

Twice 8 are **Sixteen** Friends, to greet the Sailors as they land.



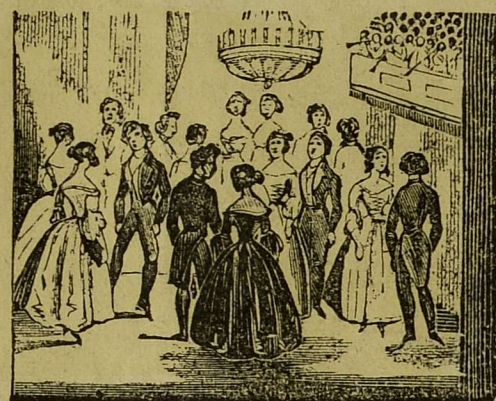
Twice 9 are **Eighteen** Roses, that bloom in yonder bowers,

Three times 12 are **Thirty-six** Pears,—touch them, if you dare.



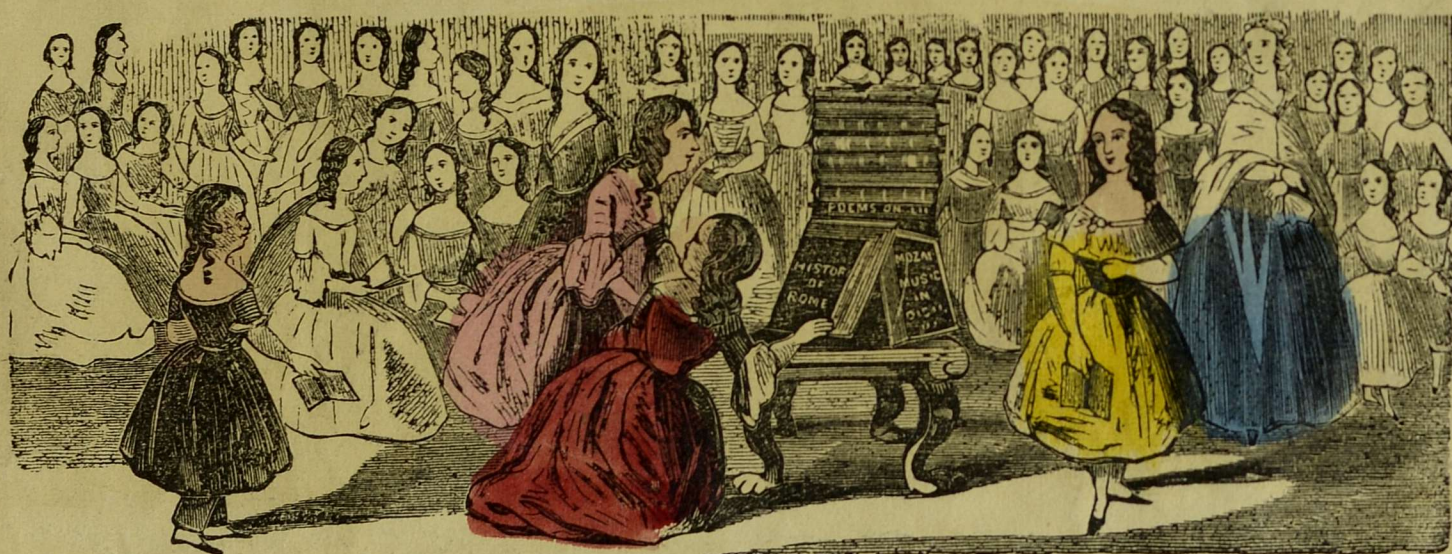
Four times 4 are **Sixteen** People, dancing a new Quadrille ;

Six times 9 are **Fifty-four** nice Brandy-balls they've bought.

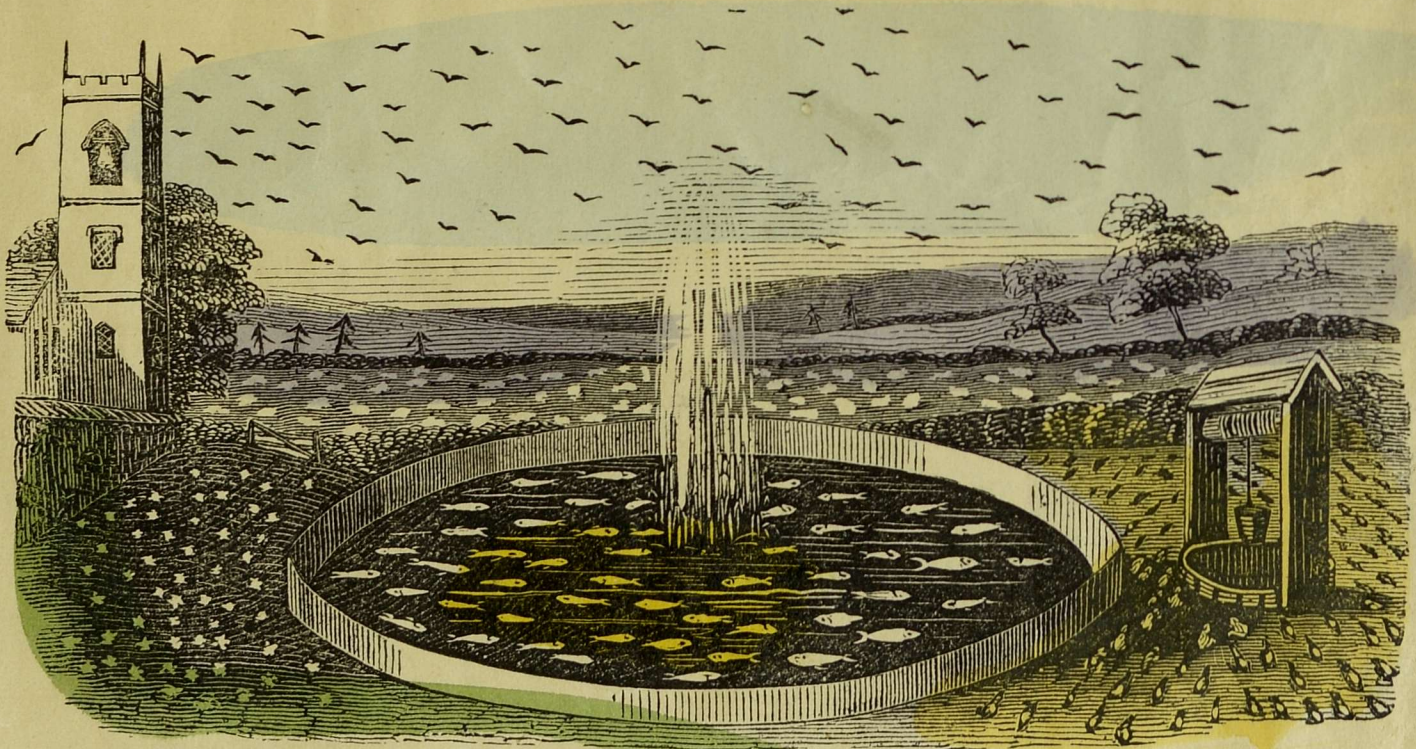


Six times **10** are **Sixty** Chinese Mandarins, you see :
