That is right: the Judge says so.

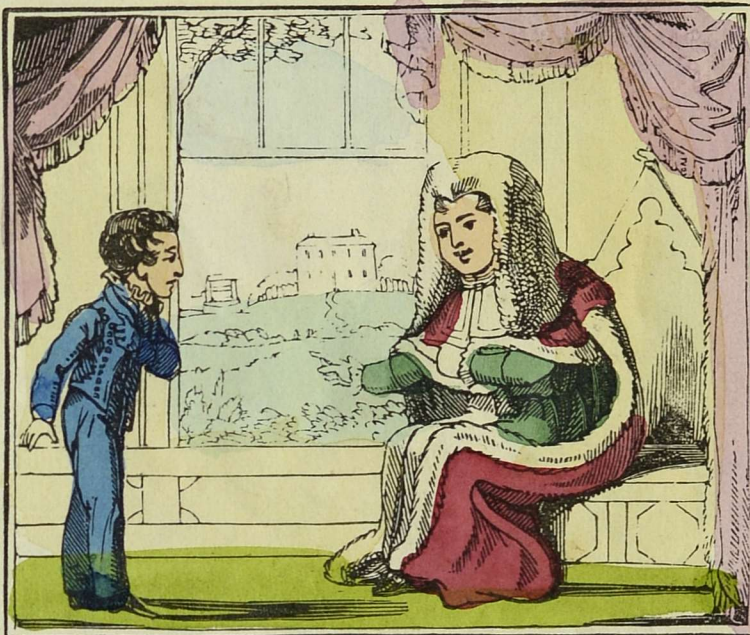
