

International

Krushchev was displaced

China exploded an atomic bomb

Ten book talks were given to various groups.

The Civil Rights struggle in the United States

Book lists were made on a variety of subjects, such as India, Business novels, Christmas gift suggestions.

A notice 'What do you do in your lunch hour?', describing the facilities offered by the library was mailed to 135 local firms.

Complete recordings of fifteen plays by Shakespeare were in great demand.
