Twice **10** are **20**

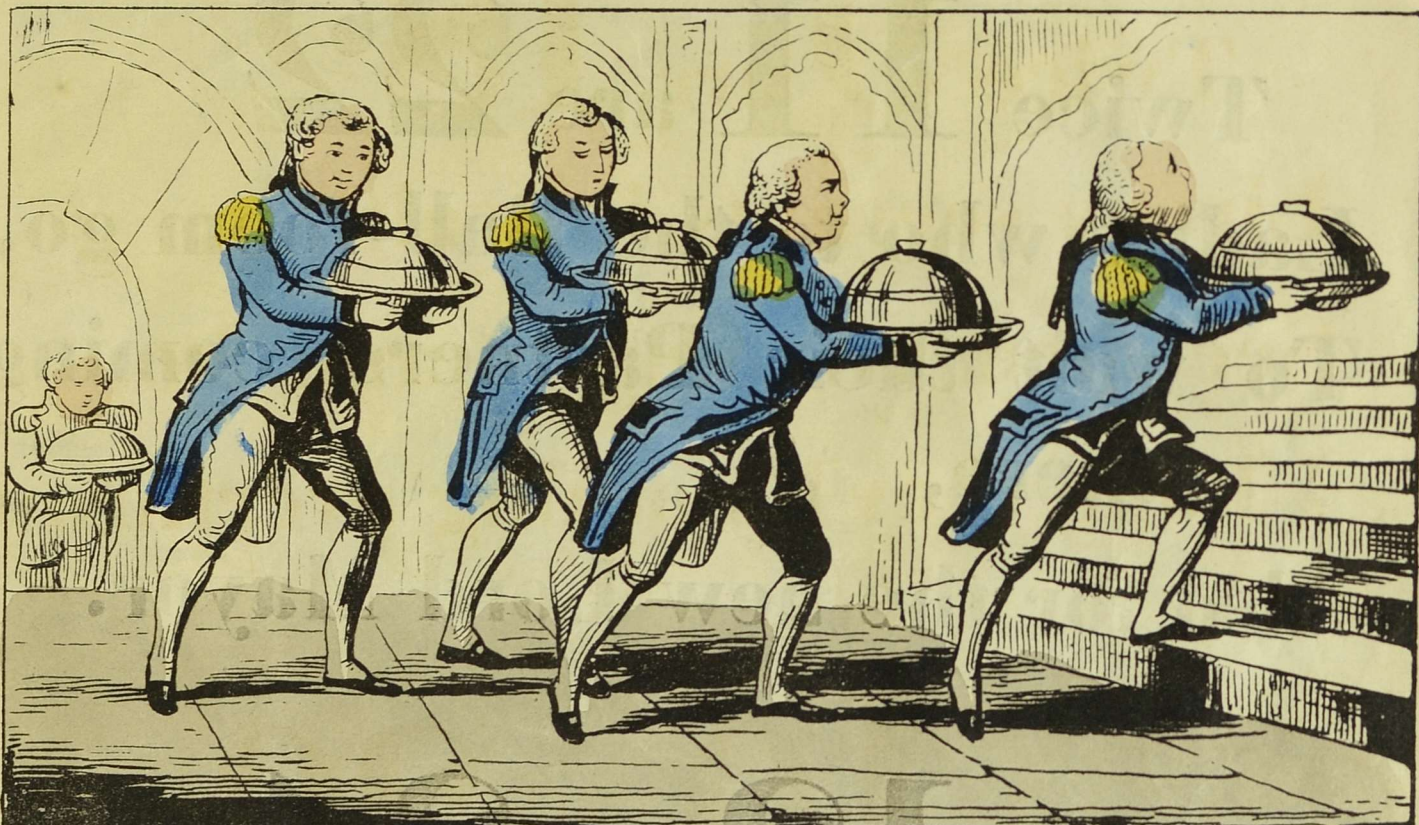
Soldiers keeping sentry.

12 and 8 are 20. 15 and 9 are 24.

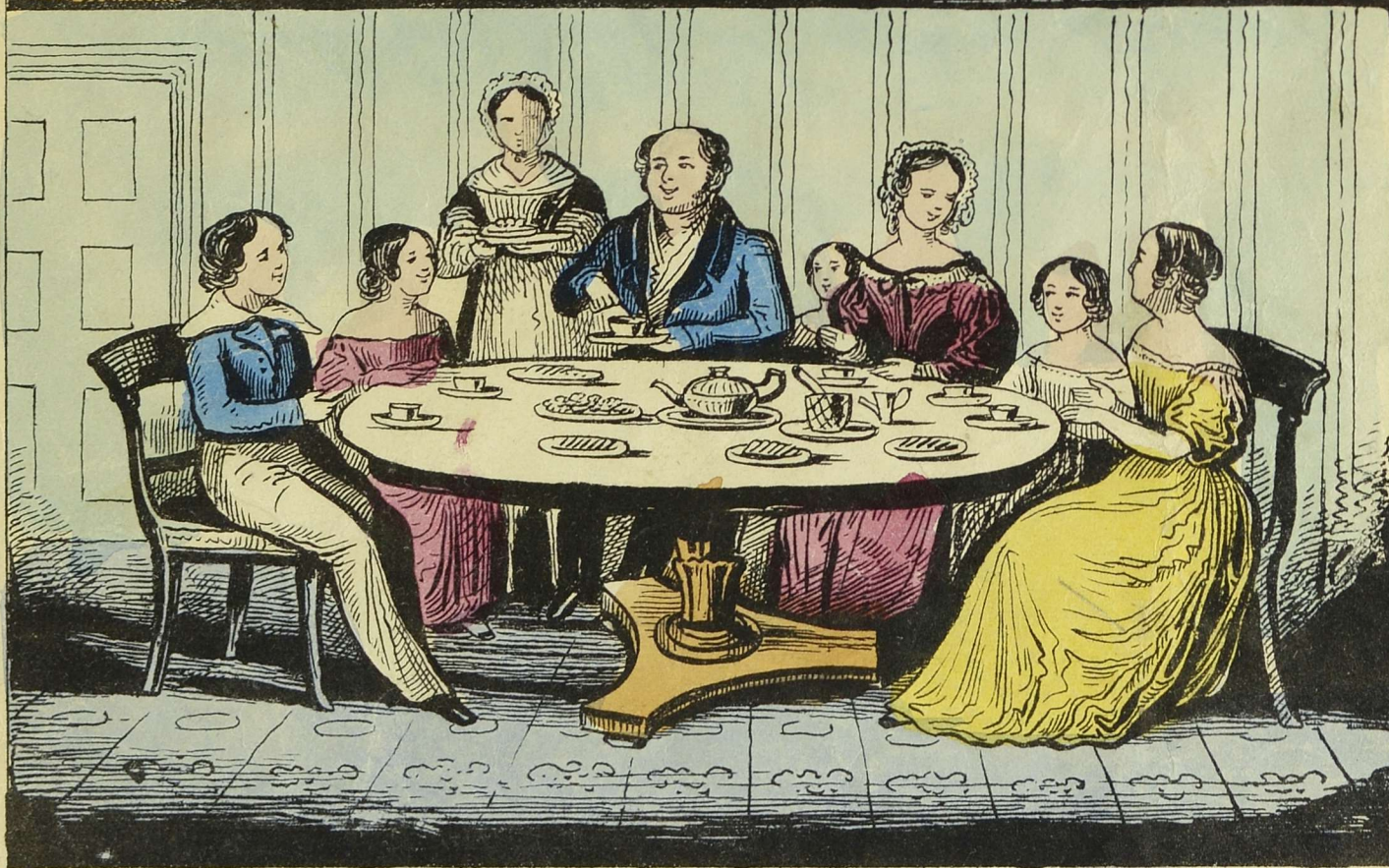


**This ends the Lord Mayor's
