SIR,—I have the honor to hand in herewith the Annual Report of the Civic Receipts and Expenditures for the year 1882, with the usual Supplementary Statements relative to the City Debt, the Sinking Fund, and other Special Accounts.

The same has been duly examined, and is accompanied by the Report of the City Auditors.

It is pleasing that a surplus is again exhibited in closing the present Accounts, and it is hoped that the same result will attend the wind up of future Statements.

This remark has special reference to the City Debt now exhibited under distinctive headings of "General," and "Local Improvement" Issues, and which are severally and minutely analyzed as to the issues being in currency or sterling, the purpose of the same, the numbers of the Debentures, the rates of interest, and the dates of maturity, thus enabling every Debenture holder at once to locate his Debenture, and trace the same from its date of inception to that of its maturity.

NOTE.—GENERAL.—Engines, Boilers and Steam Pipes are included in Insurance upon Buildings independently of special insurance against explosion, &c., in the Canadian Steam Users' Association. Gasaliers and Fittings are included in furniture and furnishings. Regarding furniture, &c., at the City Hall, the marble stand and bust of H.R.H. the Prince of Wales is covered to the extent of \$500, the large portrait with frame of H. M. the Queen to the extent of \$800, the large Centennial picture and frame to the extent of \$500; on no other picture will a larger sum be claimed than \$40. The contents and apparatus at the Fire Halls includes three steam fire engines, the fire alarm apparatus, bells with and without strikers, gongs and door opening apparatus, extension ladder and fire escape, hook and ladder and salvage waggons and apparatus, hose and hose reels, and other matters incident to such Halls, as the above may be distributed through the same. Regarding the Exhibition Buildings, no larger sum than \$275 will be claimed on any one cattle shed, or \$150 on any one sheep or pig pen, or \$200 on any stable.

NOTE (a).—The following are the property of the City, as leased to the Industrial Exhibition Association, which latter has added other, and enlarged the existing, Buildings. The additional insurance in connection with such additions is borne by the said Industrial Exhibition Association.
