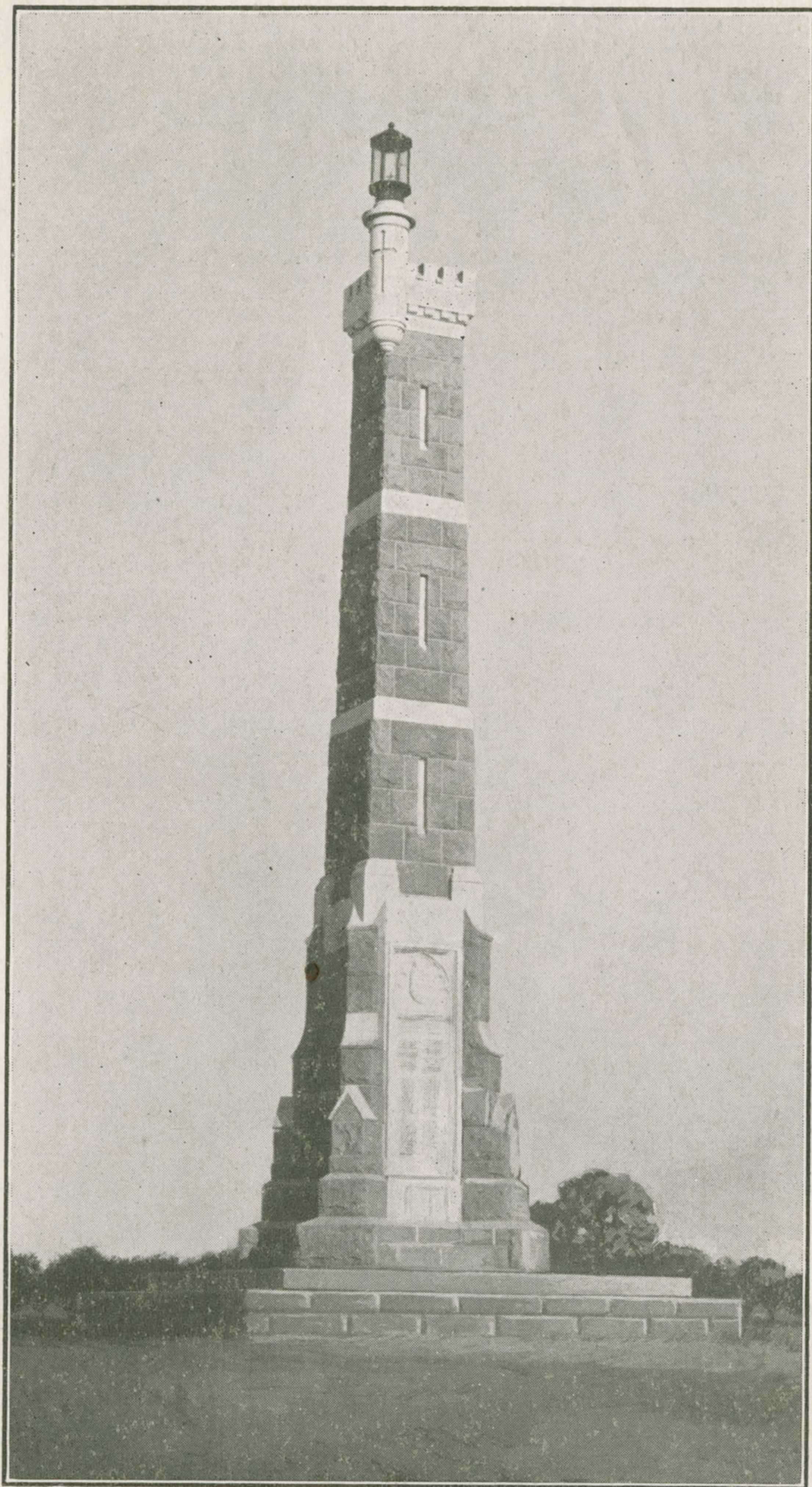

Description of Aurora War Memorial.

Set on an elevation in a plot of about 6 acres to be developed as a Garden of Remembrance and Public Park.

STYLE:

Gothic (Scottish-Baronial.)

Base 30 feet square—on massive concrete foundation.

Height to top of bronze lantern 73 feet 5 inches.

Width across face above base 12 feet.

Battlement (at top) a little over 6 feet square.

MATERIAL:

Stanstead grey granite, in heavy blocks, with solid concrete fill for 20 feet above foundation with central shaft $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet square from this point, reaching to the top, surmounted by a lantern of solid bronze, carrying 4 electric lamps of high wattage.

For if we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so them also which sleep in Jesus will God bring with him.

For this we say unto you by the word of the Lord, that we which are alive and remain unto the coming of the Lord shall not prevent them which are asleep.

For the Lord Himself shall descend from Heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel. and with the trumpet of God: and the dead in Christ shall rise first: then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord.
