And the members of the Medical profession residing in the Town: who shall immediately proceed to the adoption of such necessary regulations as they may deem proper and with power to add to their numbers if circumstances shall render it necessary.

At a meeting of the Board of Health, held at the Office of the Clerk of the Peace, on the 21st June, 1832.

PRESENT.

Dr. Baldwin, President.—Messrs. Boulton, Small, Stanton, Cockshutt, Cathcart and Washburn.

The following regulations were adopted :

1.—Three members shall form a quorum, who shall meet every morning at the Grand Jury Room in the Court House, at 10 o'clock, A. M.

2.—Medical Practitioners are requested to send in each morning to the Board of Health, at the hour of 10—the daily reports of the state of the health of the Town, as far as it is within their knowledge.

3.—The Board of Health shall, in their discretion, publish the medical reports for the information of the public.

4.—The Superintendants in the several Wards of the Town as now appointed, are desired to acquit the Magistrates in their several wards that they are in addition to their present duty required to consider themselves as attached to the Board of Health, to act under their orders as Health Wardens.

5.—The Health Wardens in their respective wards shall have the power of adding to their numbers, immediately reporting to the Board of Health, the names of the persons so added.

6.—The Health Wardens shall make out lists of the houses in their respective wards, designating as clearly as may be, the situation of the houses by street, number, and as adjacent to public or well known buildings; the name of the occupant—number and occupation of the inmates of each—the lists so to be deposited in the hall of each house for the information of the Medical Gentlemen.

7.—In the event of sickness being found in any house within their wards—the Health Wardens shall immediately report the same to the nearest Medical Gentlemen named in the annexed list.

8.—The Health Wardens are authorized when it shall be required by a Medical attendant to leave the expense of providing immediate means for the conveyance of patients from their houses to the Hospital.

9.—The Health Wardens are strictly enjoined to induce upon the several householders within their several wards, the necessity of immediately calling for the assistance of a Medical Practitioner, in the event of sickness appearing in their houses.

10.—The Superintendents of the several wards are required to pay occasional visits to all the houses in their wards, with a view to the enforcement of these and all the regulations which may be adopted by the Board of Health.

11.—A due observance of the regulations adopted in an adjourned Quarter Sessions, held on the 10th instant, relating to the cleanliness of the town, under the observance of the Superintendents and Inspectors, whose duties are now connected with the Board of Health, is particularly urged on all the Inhabitants: whose attention to the means pointed out, and especially the frequent and simple use of Lime in whitewashing is earnestly instigated.

12.—Lice-keepers and persons keeping lodgers, are desired on Monday and Thursday of each week to report to the Board of Health, the number of Boarders, &c. in their respective houses, and whether there are any sick persons amongst them.

13.—The following list of the Medical Practitioners in the Town is published for the information of the public—but should the name of any Medical Gentleman be omitted, he is respectfully requested to send it in to the Board.
