AN ACT

To fix by Bill the amount to be paid to salaried Officers of the Corporation.

WHEREAS it is expedient to settle by Bill the amount proper to be paid to certain of the Officers and Servants of the Corporation: -Be it therefore enacted by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commonalty of the City of Toronto, in Common Council assembled:

SECTION I.

That hereafter no salary, fee, perquisite, allowance, or remuneration whatever, shall be allowed, paid, or given, or to be taken or received by any person or persons in the service of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, for filling or for discharging the duties of any of the situations mentioned and respectively provided for in the next section of this Act, other than the amount in each case as in that section expressly declared, and which shall be in full and in lieu of all allowances, fees, perquisites and claims of every kind, in each respective office.

SECTION II.

That the amount herein above referred to and provided, shall be per annum, and be paid only in proportion to the actual time served, and shall be as follows, that is to say: For the Mayor, the sum of £250. For the Chamberlain, a per centage that will yield the sum of £300 per annum, and no more. For the Clerk of the Common Council, £250. For Assistant Clerk to the Chamberlain, £ . For Assistant Clerk to Clerk of the Common Council, £ For High Bailiff, £200. For each Assessor, per cent on the

For each Collector,

For City Superintendent of Education, £ Secretary to the Board of Trustees, £ . For Market Clerk, £ . For Assistant Market Clerk, £ . For Weigh House Clerk, £ . For City Inspector, £ . For Constables each, £ For

SECTION III.

That all fees, perquisites, and monies lawfully claimable or payable to any of the persons filling any of the offices in the next preceding section mentioned, by virtue of any such office, shall be paid into the hands of the Chamberlain, to and for the public uses of the City of Toronto; and that the amount fixed in and by this Act, shall not be altered, directly or indirectly, except by a repeal of this Act first duly made in that behalf.
