IMPORTED STOCK.

With the view of encouraging largely the importation of improved stock, the exhibitor of any male animal imported into this Province from Europe since the last Exhibition, which shall take the first prize in any of the above classes, will be paid three times the amount of the premium offered in the list; the exhibitor of any female animal imported from Europe within the same time, taking the first prize, will be paid double the amount offered: the exhibitor of any male animal imported into the Province from any part of America within the same time, taking the first prize, will be paid double the amount of the prize offered; and of any female animal imported within the same time, and taking the first prize, one half the amount of prize offered, in addition to that in the list. Such animals to be the *bona fide* property of persons residing in Lower Canada.

GENERAL ARRANGEMENT AND MANAGEMENT.

Wednesday, 29 Septembre.—Arrangement and inspection of Stock, &c.

Thursday, 30 Septembre.—Exhibition of Stock and implements.

Friday, October.—Auction.

1.—The Competition is open to Exhibitors from all parts of the Province. No Certificate of entry can be received after 20 September.

2.—The Members of Agricultural Societies of the County wherein the Annual Exhibitor may be held, shall be Members of the Association for that year, provided the Agricultural Societies of the said County shall devote their whole funds for the year, including the government grant, in aid of the Association.

3.—The payment of 5s. and upwards, constitutes a person a Member of the Agricultural Association of Lower Canada for one year, and two pounds ten shillings a Member for Life, when given for that specific object and not as a contribution to the Local Fund.

4.—Members of the Association are admitted to the Show-Yard without payment, on exhibiting their *Tickets of Admission*. All others to pay 1s. 3d each time of entrance. Children to pay half price.

5.—No one but a member of the Association will be allowed to compete, except in Class 9. Foreign Cattle.

6.—Stock must be the property and in possession of the Exhibitor from the date of the Certificate. (as to which see below.)—No entry of thorough-breed Cattle or Horses will be received unless the pedigree be stated in the Certificate.

7.—Cows must have produced in 1858 or be in calf at the time of the show.

8.—Evidence may be required that Stallions and Bulls have had produce.

9.—Aged Ewe must rear lambs in 1858.

10.—The Premiums awarded will be paid on and after the 15th October. Premiums not applied for by the 31st December will be forfeited.

- 11.—Any deception on the part of a Competitor will disqualify him.
- 12.—All Grain and Seeds must be the growth of 1858 and from the farm of the Exhibitor.
- 13.—No persons can take two prizes in one Section in Classes 5, 6, 7, and 8.
- 14.—Stock which cannot be shown in any competing class may be exhibited as extra stock, and the Judges may, if they think them worthy, recommend them for prizes.
- 15.—In all cases where any difficulty may arise in regard to Competition, Awarding Premiums, or upon any other subject connected with the Exhibition, the Council and Officers of the Association shall decide, and their decision shall be final.
- 16.—The Judges will meet at the Secretary's Office, on the ground, on Wednesday morning at 9 o'clock precisely to make arrangements for entering upon their duties at once. Judges are excepted to report themselves on arrival, at the Secretary's Office, on the ground.
- 17.—Every animal and article will be at the risk of the owners.
- 18.—Judges must in all cases assign their reasons for recommending extra prizes.
- 19.—All entries for Carrots, Parsnips, Turnips, Mangold, Wurtsel, and Khol Rabi, in the Agricultural Department must be accompanied by a certificate from the Secretary of the Agricultural Society of the County in which they are grown that they are of field culture.
- 20.—The public will not be admitted to the ground till the morning of Thursday, the 30 Sept., when the gates will be opened at 9 o'clock.
- 21.—Nothing to be removed from the ground until 6 P.M., on the evening of Friday, the 1st October.
- 2.—The age of each animal calculated up to the day of Show, and the name of the breeder where known must be stated in the Certificate.
- 3.—In all cases the age of the animal is to be computed from the time of its birth except in the case of horses when the year only will be required, as their ages are always calculated from the 1st January.
- 4.—All entries must be completed and lodged with the Secretary not later than the 15 Sept..
- 5.—No Certificate of entry will be received without the entrance money.
- 6.—Admission orders to the Show-Yard will be given when the certificates of entry are lodged.
- 7.—To protect the Association from the expense of preparing sheds uselessly, — a fine of ten shillings will be imposed upon any party who may enter an animal which shall not be forthcoming at the Exhibition.

PLACING AND JUDGING IMPLEMENTS AND INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTS.

- 1.—The Show-Ground will be opened for the reception of Implements and Industrial Products on Tuesday 28th of September, and all articles must be placed at 10 o'clock on Wednesday, the 29th. No article will be admitted without an Admission Order, and the different articles must be placed in their respective Sections according to the classification in the prize list.
- 2.—The necessary means to test Machines must be provided by Exhibitors.
- 3.—The Judges will commence their inspection at 12 o'clock, on the 29th of September, (Wednesday.)
- 4.—A trial of Implements will take place during the afternoon of Wednesday the 29.
- 5.—All articles entered must remain on the ground until the evening of Friday the 31 of October.

PLACING AND JUDGING STOCK.

- 1.—Stock must be brought to the Show-Ground between 6 and 10 o'clock, on Wednesday (29th) morning. No

CERTIFICATE OF ENTRY.

- 1.—Each lot must be intimated by a Certificate of entry, printed forms of which may be had on application to the Secretary, at the Office of the Association, in Montreal.

lot will be admitted without an Admission Order. At 10 o'clock the gates will be closed and the ground cleared of all persons except the Judges.

- 2.—One servant will be admitted with each lot and must remain strictly in charge of it during the Show.
- 3.—Servants in charge of stock will be subject to the orders of the directing members of the Board of Agriculture in each class.
- 4.—No Neat Cattle will be allowed to enter the Show Ground unless secured in a proper manner by either chain, strap, or cord.
- 5.—Bulls must be secured by a ring or screw in the nose with chain or rope attached.
- 6.—The competing Stock will be distinguished by numbers, and the owner's name must not be mentioned till the premiums are awarded.
- 7.—The Judges will commence their inspection at 12 o'clock. They will decide without inquiry as to names of parties or places, and with reference merely to the numbers which distinguish the animals. They will have regard to the symmetry, early maturity, purity of blood, size, and general qualities, characteristic of the different breeds.
- 8.—In no case shall a premium be awarded unless the Judges deem the animal to possess sufficient merit, more especially if there be only one lot in the section.
- 9.—A Superintendent will attend each section of the Judges. It will be his duty to see that no obstruction is offered to them, to communicate between them and the Secretary, so complete their Reports and to ticket the Prize Animals. None of the Tickets so placed shall be removed. The Ground will be open to the public at 9 o'clock on Thursday morning, 17th.

AUCTION.

An Auction Sale of Stock and Implements will take place on the 1st of October at one o'clock. Exhibitors should state with their entries whether Stock is to be exposed to sale, and furnish particulars of

pedigree to enable the Secretary to give the Auctioneer the information requisite for his Catalogue of Sale also the upset price.

N. B.—Attention is particularly called to the Regulation in regard to the time of making entries.

Under no circumstance will an entry be received after the 15 September.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ARTS AND MANUFACTURES.

1.—All exhibitors, who desire to compete for prizes, must furnish the Secretary on or before September 15th, with a list and description of the articles they intend to exhibit.

2.—Every article exhibited for competition, must be the Produce or Manufacture

re of the British Provinces of North America.

3.—No Exhibitor shall receive a Premium unless he is the Producer or Manufacturer of the article exhibited, or the duly authorised Agent, to whom it has been sent by the maker for the purpose of Exhibition.

4.—Articles intended for sale, or of Foreign Manufacture, may be exhibited by being regularly entered and labelled as such.

5. The Industrial Department will be opened to receive goods on Monday morning, the 27th September, at nine o'clock. All machinery, or articles requiring motive power, must be on the ground that day, to be connected with the main shaft driven by an engine. All other articles must be delivered at the building before 3 o'clock P. M., on Tuesday the 28th, to enable the Committee to arrange them for the Judges, who will be in attendance on Wednesday morning at nine o'clock.

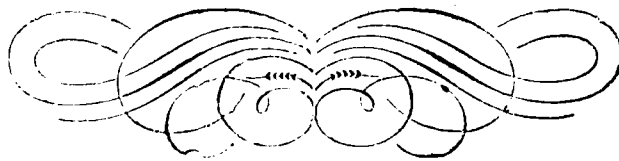
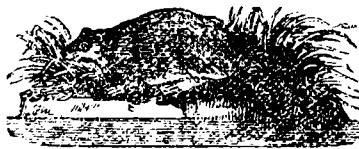
6. Care will be taken to appoint competent Judges for each class of Goods. They may withhold prizes, if the articles are not considered worthy, and they may recommend for Honorable Mention or for a prize such articles as are not on the list and may be deserving of the same, — the granting of which shall be subject to the approval of the Committee.

7.—Each Exhibitor may leave one person in charge of his goods, and there will not be any payment made for injury to, or loss of, any thing sent ; at the same time every possible precaution will be taken by the Committee to protect property sent to the Exhibition.

8. The decision of the Judges for the Industrial Department will be declared on the ground, before the Exhibition closes, and the Premiums will be paid by the Committee of that Department immediately after.

9. Exhibitors must put the prizes on all goods exhibited.

10. No appeal from the decision of the judges, will be entertained.



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
